Call Governor Rauner: 217-782-0244.

Ask Rauner to sign Senate Bill 1657, which focus on common sense gun safety. It requires state licensing of firearms dealers. Buyers of assault-style weapons would have to wait a 72-hour "cooling off" period before taking delivery.

Contact Illinois House legislators

Ask House Representatives to pass House Bill 1469, known as the "Commander Paul Bauer Act," would prohibit the sale and possession of high-capacity magazines greater than 10 rounds, with exemptions for members of law enforcement and the military.

Contact Congressional Representatives in the House to pass this legislation

- H.R.4477 Fix NICS Act of 2017. This bill amends the Brady Handgun Violence Prevention Act to require each federal agency and department, including a federal court, to:
 - certify whether it has provided to the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) disqualifying records of persons prohibited from receiving or possessing a firearm, and
 - establish and substantially comply with an implementation plan to maximize record submissions and verify their accuracy.
- H.R.5087. Assault Weapons Ban of 2018. Bill amends the federal criminal code to make it a crime
 to knowingly import, sell, manufacture, transfer, or possess a semiautomatic assault weapon or
 large capacity ammunition feeding device. The prohibition does not apply to a firearm that is: (1)
 manually operated by bolt, pump, lever, or slide action; (2) permanently inoperable; (3) an
 antique; or (4) a rifle or shotgun specifically identified by make and model.

- S.2135 Fix NICS Act of 2017. This bill would improve background checks that are conducted through the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) when an individual purchases a firearm.
- S.1212. This bill amends the federal criminal code to prohibit firearm sale or transfer to or receipt
 or possession by a person who is subject to a gun violence prevention order. A gun violence
 prevention order is a court order that prohibits an individual from owning, purchasing,
 possessing, or receiving a firearm
