Hey all

Attached is updated information regarding the student led demonstration on Wed. Please review and you notice that we have changed the time of the demonstration to reflect a 10:00 am start time, which coincides with the start time of the nation-wide demonstration. In hind-sight, had we started this at 10:12, we may have caused more confusion for students, because for example, you could have a group of students that are planning their own demonstration on Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. So after being approached by several students, we decided to stick to our original timeline – which is outlined on the attachment.

Please let me know if you have further questions. Main thing to remember is 3rd hour will be extended slightly due to the student demonstration starting at **10:00 a.m.**

I would also like to remind you of our staff's role on Wednesday:

- Help supervise students to maintain a safe, school environment. If you have a planning period, please plan to help supervise students in your hallway. If you have a class, during 3rd hour, please work with your buddy teacher to supervise students in your class who choose not to participate. For example, if you have 5 kids not participating and your buddy teacher has 5 – one of you supervise the students in one class and the other can help in the hallway.
- Not Participate in the demonstration or impart political beliefs on students.
- Reduce any negative academic effects on students who participate.
- Provide opportunities for students who don't participate to have their voices heard. We plan to provide you with a sheet that has contact information for legislators, should students want to contact them to advocate for safe schools. You can just make these sheets available in your classroom and students can pick up on their way out if they choose to.

We anticipate that all will go well on Wednesday. Remember that this is a teachable moment for our students and also a chance to empower them to lead their learning and have a voice on issues that impact them.
