**TOWN OF NORMAL’S COMBINED MOTION TO DISMISS COMPLAINTS FOR
MANDAMUS AND RESPONSE OPPOSING MOTIONS FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT**

Defendants, Town of Normal and Angie Huonker (jointly “Defendants”), by and through their attorneys, Klein, Thorpe and Jenkins, Ltd., and Michael J. Kasper, move to dismiss, with prejudice, pursuant to 735 ILCS 5/2-619(a)(9), Plaintiffs’ verified complaints for *mandamus* (“Complaints”) and respond in opposition to Plaintiffs’ motions for summary judgment, stating as follows:

Introduction

The *mandamus* brought by Plaintiffs Amy Conklin, Robert Shoraga and Charles Sila (collectively “Plaintiffs”) should be dismissed because no unequivocal right exists to be placed on the ballot for an unelected office and the Town of Normal (“Normal”) clerk did not have an unequivocal duty to certify an unelected office for the ballot. Plaintiffs look to the wrong statutes to claim the offices they seek should be elected.

Plaintiffs ask this Court to issue writs of *mandamus* ordering Defendants to certify their nominating papers for the elected offices of town clerk, town supervisor and town collector, respectively, to the McLean County election authorities before January 26, 2023. *Verified Complaint for Mandamus*, attached and referred to as Exhibit A at ¶¶ 7, 21; Exhibit B at ¶¶7, 17; Exhibit C at ¶¶ 7, 19. Normal, on December 2, 2022, sent each Plaintiff a letter indicating his or her nominating papers lacked

conformity with the legal requirements and, on this basis, refused to certify the petitions. *Id.* at ¶ 23; at ¶ 21; at ¶ 21. The letter to Conklin explained that the office of town clerk is an appointed, rather than an elected, position; therefore, her nominating papers were deficient. Exhibit A at ¶ 24. The letters to Shoraga and Sila both explained that the positions of collector and supervisor did not exist in Normal; consequently, their petitions also were deficient. Exhibit B at ¶ 22; Exhibit C at ¶ 22.

Plaintiffs' complaints should be dismissed, with prejudice, pursuant to 735 ILCS 5/2-619(a)(9) because affirmative matter, including historical records indicating Normal's incorporation and corporate actions regarding its form of government, as well as Illinois Municipal Code provisions, defeat Plaintiffs' *mandamus* claims. Plaintiffs base their claims on the premise that the elective offices for which they filed nominating papers – town clerk, town supervisor and town collector – exist and are part of the governing system in Normal. This presumption is false and, therefore, Plaintiffs' *mandamus* actions should be dismissed.

I. Legal Standard For A § 2-619(a)(9) Motion to Dismiss And For Summary Judgment

A § 2-619(a)(9) motion to dismiss allows for an involuntary dismissal when the “claim asserted against defendant is barred by other affirmative matter avoiding the legal effect of or defeating the claim.” 735 ILCS 5/2-619(a)(9). Affirmative matter “is something in the nature of a defense which negates the cause of action completely or refutes crucial conclusions of law or conclusions of material fact contained in or inferred from the complaint.” *Illinois Graphics Company v. Nickum*, 159 Ill.2d 469, 486 (1994). The affirmative matter asserted by the defendant must be apparent on the face of the complaint or supported by affidavits or certain other evidentiary materials. *Epstein v. Chicago Board of Education*, 178 Ill.2d 370, 383 (1997).

Summary judgment only should be granted where all facts, including “pleadings, depositions, admissions and affidavits,” if taken in the light most favorable to the non-movant, show that the movant is entitled to relief as a matter of law, and that “no genuine issue of material fact exists.” *Siegel v. Village of Wilmette* 324 Ill. App. 3d 903, 907 (1st Dist. 2001) (citing *First of America Trust Co. v. First Illini Bancorp, Inc.*, 289 Ill. App. 3d 276, 283 (3rd Dist. 1997)). Summary judgment should be granted

where no reasonable person could conclude differently from the facts presented. *Smith v. Armor Plus Co.*, 248 Ill. App. 3d 831, 839 (2nd Dist. 1993).

II. Plaintiffs' Complaints Fail To Allege Sufficient *Mandamus* Claims

A. The Requirements Of A *Mandamus* Claim

Mandamus "is an extraordinary remedy appropriate to enforce as a matter of public right the performance of official duties by a public officer where no exercise of discretion on his part is involved." *People ex rel. Birkett v. Jorgensen*, 216 Ill. 2d 358, 362 (2005). *Mandamus* "is employed to compel a public official to perform a ministerial duty." 208 Ill.2d 457, 464 (2004). *Mandamus* cannot be used to direct a public official or public body to reach a particular decision or to exercise its discretion in a particular matter, even if the judgment or discretion has been erroneously exercised. *Pate v. Wiseman*, 2019 IL App (1st) 190449, ¶25 (citing *Crump v. Illinois Prisoner Review Board*, 181 Ill. App.3d 58, 60 (1st Dist. 1989)).

For a *mandamus* to issue, a plaintiff must demonstrate: (1) an unequivocal right to the requested relief, (2) an unequivocal duty of the defendant to act, and (3) defendant's unequivocal authority to comply with an order granting *mandamus* relief. *Rodriguez v. Illinois Prisoner Review Board*, 376 Ill. App. 3d 429, 433-34 (2007). *Mandamus* is inappropriate in this case because Plaintiffs cannot satisfy either of the first two of these elements.

B. The Alleged Grounds For Plaintiffs' *Mandamus* Claims

Plaintiffs' claims to having a clear right to the certification of their nominating papers assert the following legal and factual allegations. Section 10-8 requires Huonker, as town clerk, to certify all nominating papers that are in apparent conformity with the Election Code. Exhibit A, at ¶¶ 5, 8; Exhibit B at ¶¶ 5, 8; Exhibit C at ¶¶ 5, 8. Because Plaintiffs' nominating papers facially conform with Election Code requirements, they have a right to have their names placed on the ballot for the positions they seek. *Id.* at ¶¶ 33-38; ¶¶ 31-36; ¶¶ 31-36. The Municipal Code, at 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-95, requires, *inter alia*, that the offices of clerk, collector and supervisor be elected for a four-year term and that the municipal clerk shall certify the names of candidates for these offices to the proper election

authority. *Id.* at ¶¶ 9, 10, 39; ¶¶ 9, 10, 37; ¶¶ 9, 10, 37. Defendants allegedly have no legal basis to disregard state law and deprive Plaintiffs of their clear right to appear on the ballot as candidates for election to the positions they seek. *Id.* at ¶ 44; ¶ 42; ¶ 42.

Plaintiffs, by focusing exclusively on § 10-8 of the Election Code and §§ 3.1-25-90 and 3.1-25-95 of the Municipal Code, neglect the important fact that Normal has adopted a managerial form of government and, therefore, Article 5 of the Municipal Code, rather than the statutory provisions Plaintiffs set forth in their pleadings, provides the legal basis for Huonker's actions regarding Plaintiffs' nominating papers. Under Article 5, Huonker properly refused to certify Plaintiffs' nominating papers to the election authorities.

C. Plaintiffs Do Not Have An Unequivocal Right To Have The Normal Town Clerk Certify Their Petitions For Offices That Are Not Part Of Normal's Managerial Form Of Government

Affirmative matter shows that Plaintiffs lack unequivocal rights to have Huonker certify their nominating petitions for positions of town clerk, town supervisor and town collector because these offices are not elected or do not even exist within Normal's managerial form of government. Therefore, Plaintiffs fail the first requirement for *mandamus*.

1. Normal's history as an incorporated "Special Charter" municipality

The applicable affirmative matter includes the history of Normal's incorporation, the creation of the appointed position of town clerk, and the establishment of its current managerial form of government, adopted by referendum in 1970. An "incorporated town" is a unit of local government organized under special charters granted by the Illinois legislature prior to the adoption of the State Constitution of 1870. *Committee of Local Improvements of Town of Algonquin v. Objectors to Assessment*, 39 Ill.2d 255, 259 (1968). Normal was incorporated on February 25, 1867 by a special charter from the State. See *An Act to Incorporate the Town of Normal, Private Laws of the State of Illinois Passed by the Twenty-Fifth General Assembly, 1867, Volume III, pp. 321-36* ("Town Charter"), attached and referred to as Exhibit D. The Special Charter enumerated the legislative powers of the town council, including the authority to appoint a clerk. Exhibit D at Article V, § 2.

In 1949, the General Assembly added § 3-8-2 to the Municipal Code which provides that:

The corporate authorities of villages incorporated and existing under special acts which now provide for or require the election of one or more of the following municipal officers, a treasurer, a clerk, a marshal, or a collector, may adopt this section by resolution and may, in lieu of such provisions or requirements, provide by ordinance for the appointment of such officers by corporate authorities, prescribe their terms, duties, compensation and the amount of any bond.

I.R.S.A. (1967) Ch. 24, § 3-8-2. On January 21, 1952, the Normal Town Council, authorized by § 3-8-2, adopted a resolution (the “1952 Resolution”) declaring town clerk as an appointive office. The Town Council subsequently adopted Ordinance No. 248, *An Ordinance Providing for the Appointment of a Town Clerk for the Incorporated Town of Normal and Further Prescribing the Duties and Compensation and Bond Required for Said Position* (“Ordinance No. 248”). The 1952 Resolution and Ordinance No. 248 are attached and referred to as Group Exhibit E. As a result of the authorizing statutory provision, § 3-8-2 of the Municipal Code, the 1952 Resolution and Ordinance No. 248, the office of town clerk became appointive, rather than elective, and so it has remained consistently for 70 years since 1952.

In 1969, petitions were filed with the McLean County Circuit Court to allow Normal to adopt a managerial form of government pursuant to the Municipal Code,¹ and in March, 1970, the voters, by referendum, supported the adoption which was implemented by the passage of Ordinance No. 820. See *An Ordinance Creating the Office of Municipal Manager for the Town of Normal and Providing for His Powers and Duties*, attached and referred to as Exhibit G.² Municipalities that adopt the managerial form of

¹See *In re: Petitions to Submit the Proposition of Adoption of Managerial Form of Municipal Government, Case No. 69 MC 865 (Circuit Court of McLean County)*, *Opinion and Order dated January 30, 1970*, attached and referred to as Exhibit E. The January 30, 1970 Opinion and Order concluded incorporated towns such as the Town of Normal were included within the class of municipalities authorized to adopt the managerial form of government. *Id.* The Court directed that a referendum concerning the adoption of the managerial form of government by the Town of Normal be placed on the ballot for the March 2, 1970 general election. *Id.*

² Plaintiffs allege an analogy between the Town of Cicero and the Town of Normal to show that Normal must elect the office of clerk. This attempted analogy fails because the Town of Cicero has not adopted a managerial form of government under Article 5 of the Municipal Code while Normal has done so. See *Illinois Counties and Incorporated Municipalities July 2012*, attached and referred to as Exhibit H at p. 27, which lists Illinois municipalities with the managerial form of government. Normal appears on the list and, thus, is recognized as having a managerial form of government by the Illinois Secretary of State. The Town of Cicero is not on the list. As Article 5 controls the election, appointment, functions and duties of officers in a managerial government, Normal is obligated to follow its provisions while the Town of Cicero is not. The distinction between the two municipalities goes further. Cicero is an incorporated town that has succeeded a civil township. Its municipal government performs the duties and functions of its coextensive township. Its offices and the duties of the offices, including town supervisor and town collector are provided under Article 70 of the Township

government are then subject to Article 5 of the Municipal Code which provides for the election, appointment, functions and duties of municipal officers. 65 ILCS 5/5-1-1, *et seq.*

The Normal Town Council, by Ordinance No. 1001, *An Ordinance Amending Section 2.3-38 and Section 2.3-39 of Chapter 2, "Officers," of the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal, approved on April 3, 1972* ("Ordinance No. 1001"), attached and referred to as Exhibit I, addressed the continued appointment of the clerk position. Ordinance No. 1001 indicated that, "[t]he office of Town Clerk, heretofore established by Ordinance as an appointive office, is hereby retained." Ordinance No. 1001 reiterated and affirmed the clerk was an appointed office as statutorily authorized by § 3-8-2 of the Municipal Code.

2. Plaintiffs Shoraga and Sila do not have unequivocal rights to have Huonker certify their nominating papers for supervisor and collector

Both Shoraga and Sila allege an unequivocal right to have their nominating papers for the elected positions of town supervisor and town collector certified by Huonker, basing their argument on the fact that the Municipal Code, § 3.1-25-95, provides for the election of both a town collector and a town supervisor. As noted previously, within the Municipal Code, municipalities that have adopted the Article 5 managerial form of municipal government via referendum are thereafter subject to the provisions of Article 5 which provides, among other things, for the election, appointment, functions and duties of officers of the municipality. 65 ILCS 5/5-1-1, *et seq.* Significantly, § 3.1-5-5 of the Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/3.1-5-5), indicates that, "[i]f there is a conflict between any provision in this Article 3.1 and any provision in Article 4 or Article 5, the provision in Article 4 or 5, as the case may be, shall control."

Here, a conflict between Article 3.1 and Article 5 does exist. A thorough search of Article 5 reveals no provisions concerning the offices of supervisor or collector. In statutory interpretation, the primary goal is to ascertain the intent of the legislature. *Land v. Board of Education of the City of Chicago*, 202 Ill.2d

Code. In Cicero, the municipal officers are elected to perform their statutory functions. Normal is different. It did not succeed a civil township and it has no coextensive township. There are two townships in Normal, neither of which is located entirely within the town's boundaries. Normal has no legal authority or ability to perform the operation of these townships. Those townships elect their own officers. Normal operates its form of government under Article 5 of the Municipal Code and that article provides for the election of its officers.

414, 421 (2002); *Paris v. Feder*, 179 Ill.2d 173, 177 (1997). The best evidence of legislative intent is the language used in the statute itself which must be given its plain and ordinary meaning. *Id.* When the plain language of the statute is clear and unambiguous, the legislative intent discerned from the language must prevail. *Murray v. Chicago Youth Center*, 224 Ill.2d 213, 235 (2007). Article 5's plain language demonstrates the legislature did not intend that Article 5 managerial governments like Normal would include the offices of supervisor and collector. If the legislature intended for these offices to be part of a managerial government, legislators certainly had the capacity to at least mention these positions in Article 5. *People v. Clark*, 2019 IL 122891 at ¶ 23; *People v. Goldman*, 318 Ill. 77, 100 (1925) (“[I]f the Legislature intended to include receivers, it would have said so[.]”). Courts must not depart from a statute's plain language and read into it exceptions, limitations or conditions the legislature did not express. *Clark*, 2019 IL 122891 at ¶ 23. It would be absurd for the Legislature to include redundant offices in the same Article.

Article 5's omission of supervisor and collector as officers in a managerial form of government conflicts with § 3.1-25-95. Pursuant to § 3.1-5-5, Article 5 prevails. Shoraga and Sila did not have a clear right that required Huonker to certify their nominating papers for town supervisor and town collector because Normal, as a municipality that has adopted a managerial form of government by referendum, is thereafter subject to the provisions of Article 5. The offices of supervisor and collector have not existed in recent memory in Normal, do not exist currently, and are not offices contemplated by a managerial form of government. Huonker did not have a statutory duty to certify nominating papers for offices that do not exist in Normal. Any other result leads to absurdity.

3. Conklin does not have an unequivocal right to have Huonker certify her nominating papers for an elected town clerk position

a. Article 5 demonstrates that the Normal clerk position can be appointed

Section 5-1-2 (65 ILCS 5/5-1-2) provides that when a municipality adopts the managerial form of municipal government under Article 5, “that city or village and its officers shall be vested with all the rights, privileges, powers and immunities conferred by Article 3 or 4, as the case may be, in force at the time such city or village adopted this Article 5, including the procedures for elections therein

described, the officers therein named and the duties and liabilities set forth, excepted as modified by this Article 5.” Division 2 of Article 5 concerns the election of officers. The single provision in Division 2 that mentions the office of clerk, § 5-2-19, authorizes the appointment of a clerk in a city not exceeding 100,000 residents that elects its trustees at large and has adopted an ordinance providing for the appointment of a clerk. The Normal town council passed Ordinance No. 248 in April 1952 making town clerk an appointed office. Exhibit H. On April 3, 1972, the Normal Town Council adopted Ordinance No. 1001 that stated, *inter alia*, “[t]he office of Town Clerk, heretofore established by Ordinance as an appointive office, is hereby retained.” Exhibit I. Pursuant to § 5-2-19, the town clerk in Normal is an appointed office and Huonker properly declined to certify the nominating papers for an elective position of town clerk.

Conklin may contend the plain language of § 5-2-19 refers only to cities not exceeding 100,000 residents and, therefore, the Legislature intended to limit an appointed clerk position to cities under a managerial form of government, and since Normal is an incorporated town, rather than a city, the option of having an appointed clerk does not exist. This interpretation of § 5-2-19 fails on constitutional grounds as impermissible special legislation. *Big Sky Excavating, Inc. v. Illinois Bell Telephone*, 217 Ill.2d 221, 240 (2005) (“A statute will be held unconstitutional as special legislation only if it was enacted for reasons totally unrelated to the pursuit of a legitimate state goal.”) The Illinois Supreme Court, in *People ex rel Hoeninghaus v. Campbell* considered the constitutionality of a provision under which a city or village having a special charter could adopt the commission form of government after organizing under the general Cities and Villages Act, while a city or village having a population under 200,000 may adopt the commission form of government, but no other city or village could do so. 285 Ill. 557, 560 (1918). The Supreme Court determined the statute’s different treatment based on population or organization as a village or city was unconstitutional, stating that, “[a]ll cities and villages have the right to adopt the commission form of government, and the Constitution requires that the conditions for its adoption should be the same for all.” *Id.* at 562. The Supreme Court further explained a municipality’s status as a city cannot alone justify conferring upon it benefits or privileges different from those enjoyed by villages of like population. *Id.* at 563 (“[T]he difference between city

and village organization has no relation to the commission form of government.”); *People ex rel City of Danville v. Fox*, 247 Ill.402, 406 (1910) (“The fact that a municipality has adopted the form of government provided for cities affords no reasonable basis for conferring upon it benefits and privileges withheld from villages of equal population, and differing from cities only in that they have not thought proper or desirable to incorporate as cities.”)

Statutory construction requires that when a reasonable interpretation of a law exists that avoids constitutional infirmity, a court must adopt such a construal. *Millineum Maintenance Management, Inc. v. County of Lake*, 384 Ill.App.3d 638, 648 (2nd Dist. 2008). Interpreting § 5-2-19 to allow only cities meeting the conditions for appointing the office of clerk to be able to do so renders the statute unconstitutional special legislation. To avoid constitutional infirmity, § 5-2-19 must be interpreted to allow Normal to appoint its town clerk.

b. Article 3.1 allows the Normal town clerk to be an appointed office

Conklin may contend the town clerk in Normal is an elected position based on references to an elected office of clerk in Article 3.1 of the Municipal Code. However, statutory authority allows Normal, as a town created by a special charter in 1867, to select its town clerk by appointment. Section 3-8-2 of the Municipal Code that was created by the General Assembly in 1949 and later became 65 ILCS 5/3-8-2 provided that:

The corporate authorities of villages incorporated and existing under special acts which now provide for or require the election of one or more of the following municipal officers, a treasurer, a clerk, a marshal, or a collector, may adopt this section by resolution and may, in lieu of such provisions or requirements, provide by ordinance for the appointment of such officers by the corporate authorities, prescribe their terms, duties, compensation and the amount of any bond.

Article 3 of the Municipal Code subsequently was repealed and replaced by Article 3.1 pursuant to Public Act 87-1119, effective May 13, 1993. Section 3.1-30-25 states that:

The corporate authorities of municipalities incorporated and existing under special acts that now provide for or require the election of one or more of the appointed officers referred to in this Division 30 may adopt this Division 30 by resolution and may, instead of the provisions or requirements of the special Acts, provide by

ordinance for the appointment of those officers by the corporate authorities and prescribe their terms, duties, compensation, and the amount of any bond required.

Section 3.1-30-25 and its precursor, § 3-8-2, both provide that municipalities, like Normal, having been incorporated and existing under a special act, may decide by ordinance to select offices such as town clerk by appointment. Section 3.1-25-90 specifies that a clerk shall be elected except in the case of a village “that was incorporated under a special Act and that adopts Section 3.1-30-25.” 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-90. Normal was incorporated under a special act and it adopted § 3-8-2 that later became § 3.1-30-25.³ Therefore, Normal is entitled to continue to appoint its clerk as a matter of law and Huonker property declined to certify nominating papers for an elective position of town clerk.

c. Normal’s Town Charter provides the town clerk is an appointed office

The Municipal Code, at 65 ILCS 5/1-1-3, provides that, “[a]ll municipalities incorporated under any special act in effect prior to July 1, 1872, which at the date of the passage of this Code are still functioning under the special act which created them, shall remain as properly incorporated under that special act.” Additionally, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-4, indicates in the event of a conflict between the Municipal Code and special charter provisions, the latter shall govern. The Legislature, by an Act approved February 25, 1867, incorporated the Town of Normal. See Exhibit D. Article V, § 2 of the Act states that, “The town council shall have the power to appoint a clerk, treasurer, assessor . . . and all other officers that may be necessary, and prescribe their duties” Pursuant to §§ 1-1-3 and 1-1-4, Normal retains the legal authority first granted to it by the Legislature in 1867 to appoint the position of town clerk. This authority granted by its Special Charter shall prevail in any conflict with the Municipal Code provisions set forth in Article 3.1. As a matter of law, the town clerk office in Normal remains an appointed position; therefore, Conklin does not have an unequivocal right to have Huonker certify her nominating papers for a position that does not exist in Normal’s managerial form of government.

³ No conflict exists between Article 3.1 and Article 5 with regard to Normal’s clerk being an appointed office because its incorporation pursuant to a special act in 1867 provides a statutory basis under Article 3.1.

D. Huonker Does Not Have An Unequivocal Duty To Certify Plaintiffs' Nominating Papers For Elected Positions That Do Not Exist In Normal

Plaintiffs' claims for the issuance of a writ of *mandamus* should be dismissed because Huonker does not have an unequivocal duty to certify their nominating papers for the elective positions of town clerk, town supervisor and town collector that do not exist in Normal. It is, of course, well established that *mandamus* may not be used to compel an act that requires an exercise of an official's discretion. *McFatrige v. Madigan*, 2013 IL 113676, ¶ 17 ("A writ of mandamus is appropriate when used to compel compliance with mandatory legal standards but not when the act in question involves the exercise of a public officer's discretion."). Mandamus is not appropriate here because the challenged act (determining the validity of nominating petitions) requires the Clerk's discretion.

1. Huonker must use her discretion to determine whether Plaintiffs' nominating papers are in "apparent conformity" with Election Code provisions

Section 10-8 of the Election Code provides: "nomination papers ... being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act, shall be deemed to be valid unless objection thereto is made in writing ..." 10 ILCS 5/10-8. Thus, there are two preconditions to nomination papers being deemed "valid." The second is that no objection to their validity has been made. The first, however, is that the petitions are required to be duly filed and in "apparent conformity" with the provisions of the Election Code.

The purpose of the apparent conformity rule is itself apparent: to further the State's interest in efficient and orderly elections. *Storer v. Brown*, 415 U.S. 724, 730 (1974) ("there must be a substantial regulation of elections if they are to be fair and honest and if some sort of order, rather than chaos, is to accompany the democratic process."). This provision also begs the question: "apparent" to whom? The answer is the town clerk because she is the election authority responsible for accepting nomination papers for municipal elections. 10 ILCS 5/1-3 (10); 5/10-6; *Pate*, 2019 Ill App (1st) 190449 at ¶33 ("the village clerk had the authority to make a determination and refuse to certify plaintiffs' names, even if no objection to the purported nomination papers was filed").

The legislature's use of the term "apparent" also demonstrates that election authorities must use their discretion in making that determination. What might be "apparent" to one election official might

not be to another. Making an apparent conformity determination is not like affixing a stamp, recording a deed, or some other ministerial function that every clerk does exactly the same way. Here, the General Assembly expressly designated local election officials as gatekeepers to ensure the facial sufficiency of nomination papers. That role requires local officials to make that determination on a case-by-case basis. This is not a ministerial function. As a result, *mandamus* is inappropriate.

In their Complaints, Plaintiffs also quote Section 10-8 and emphasize the words “this Act”, somehow suggesting that this makes a difference. It does not. Section 10-3 of the Election Code provides:

Nominations of independent candidates *for public office within any district or political subdivision less than the State*, may be made by nomination papers signed in the aggregate for each candidate by qualified voters...

10 ILCS 5/10-3 (emphasis added). This Section simply provides that nomination papers must relate to: (1) a public office; that is (2) within the political subdivision. Obviously, someone has to determine if the nomination papers meet these two requirements. If not the clerk, then who?

Section 2A-32 of the Election Code, regarding the timing of elections, further supports the clerk’s conclusion. Section 2A-32 provides:

Incorporated Towns with Population of 50,000 or More - President - Clerk – Collector – Assessor – Supervisor – Trustee – Time of Election. In each incorporated town with a population of 50,000 or more, a president, a clerk, a collector, a supervisor and an assessor, *when required*, shall be elected in every incorporated town at the consolidated election in 1985 and at the consolidated election every 4 years thereafter.

10 ILCS 5/2A-32 (emphasis added). This “when-required” qualification recognizes that there can be towns with a population of 50,000 or more where those officers are not required to be elected. Moreover, it also recognizes that a determination must be made as to whether those offices are required. Again, it is the clerk’s duty to make that determination.

2. Plaintiffs absurdly contend Huonker must certify their nominating papers because they correctly completed their election petitions

Plaintiffs appear to take the position that the clerk *must* certify to the county clerk for printing on the ballot the name of any person who submits nomination papers for *any* office so long as the person

files the paperwork that other candidates file (Statement of Candidacy, petition sheets, etc.). What if a person files nomination papers running for Dogcatcher? Or Prom King? Must the clerk certify those names for printing on the ballot? One is hard pressed to think of a more common sense and logical application of the “apparent conformity” power than simply determining that the nomination papers actually relate to a real public office.

If then, the clerk has the authority to determine that nomination papers relate to a real office, then she must also have the authority to determine whether the nomination papers relate to a real public office “within” the “political subdivision.” *Id.* What if Donald Trump showed up at the clerk’s office and filed the paperwork to run for President of the United States? Does the clerk have to certify his name for printing on the ballot in 2023 Municipal Election? Or J.B. Pritzker for Governor? Each of those is obviously a “public office.” Nonetheless, the clerk has the authority to turn those nomination papers away because, although they are public offices, they are not public offices within the political subdivision of Normal.

Plaintiffs cite a 1914 case about whether the Town of LaSalle should become an “anti-saloon” territory, to support their argument for mandamus. *People ex rel. Giese et al. v. Dillon, Town Clerk*, 266 Ill. 272 (1914). But that case supports the conclusion that mandamus is not appropriate here. In *Giese*, the Town Clerk refused to certify the anti-saloon referendum question for the ballot because, although the petition contained, on its face, enough signatures, he decided that a number of them were invalid (including because some “signers of said petition were women”). *Id.* at 275.

The Supreme Court explained the clerk’s powers as follows:

The statute imposes the absolute duty on the clerk to submit the question to be voted upon when a petition is filed in compliance with the statute. He is given no discretionary power when a petition proper on its face is filed. His only function is to determine whether, upon the face of the petition, it is in compliance with the law.

Id. at 276. The clerk, the Court concluded, “cannot institute an investigation to determine whether the parties signing it were legal voters...” *Id.*

In this case, the clerk did not, and need not, look beyond the face of the petitions to determine their facial compliance with the Election Code. The offices Plaintiffs seek appear on each and every page. She did not “institute an investigation” as the clerk did in *Giese*. She simply read the petitions and determined that they did not, any more than a petition for Dogcatcher or Prom King, relate to a “public office” within the “political subdivision” of the Town of Normal.⁴

Here, Plaintiffs have filed nomination papers seeking election to the offices of town supervisor, town collector, and town clerk. While these offices may be public offices in other places, they are not public offices within the political subdivision of Normal. The clerk properly determined that Plaintiffs’ nomination papers were not in “apparent conformity” because they did not relate to a “public office” within the “political subdivision” of Normal.

Interpreting § 10-8 of the Election Code to *require* the clerk to certify the names of candidates seeking non-existent offices for printing on the ballot is, of course, absurd.

The Illinois Supreme Court, in *People v. Hanna*, found that the Appellate Court’s interpretation of a section of the Administrative Code related to the testing of breath analysis instruments in Illinois could not stand due to its absurdity, observing that, “[W]here a plain or literal reading of a statute produces absurd results, the literal reading should yield[.]” 207 Ill.2d 486, 497-498 (2003). The court presumes the Legislature, in enacting a statute, did not intend absurdity, inconvenience, or injustice. *Land*, 202 Ill.2d at 422. Section 10-8 seeks to prevent election officials from arbitrarily and capriciously depriving an individual the right to appear on a general election ballot. Requiring Huonker to certify nominating papers for positions that do not exist does not further the statutory purpose. The absurdity of Plaintiffs’ claims means their *mandamus* actions must be dismissed, with prejudice.

E. The Requests For *Mandamus* Should Be Denied Because Granting The Claims Would Cause Disorder And Confusion And Fail To Promote Substantial Justice

Mandamus also should be denied where it would create disorder and confusion and would not promote substantial justice. *Lenit v. Powers*, 120 Ill.App.2d 411, 419 (1st Dist. 1969); *People ex rel. Harty*

⁴It also should be noted that the procedures for referenda under Article 28 of the Election Code differ than those for nominating petitions under Article 10. See *McHenry Township v. County of McHenry*, 2022 IL 127258 at ¶ 72.

v. Gulley, 2 Ill.App.2d 321, 329 (4th Dist. 1954). Normal's ordinances do not provide for an elected clerk, nor do they provide for the offices of collector and supervisor. Plaintiffs seek to nullify Normal's ordinances through nominating petitions. By doing so, they attempt to rig an election in their favor. It is now too late to file nomination papers to seek election in the February 28, 2023 election. 10 ILCS 5/10-6. As a result, granting a writ of *mandamus* would deprive any other potential candidates to run for these newly recognized offices, and would effectively elect Plaintiffs to these positions.

F. Granting Plaintiffs' Mandamus Actions Would Be Fruitless

Finally, *mandamus* should be denied where it would be fruitless. *Thornton v. Ramsey*, 24 Ill.App.2d 452, 459 (1st Dist. 1959). Here, ordering the clerk to certify Plaintiffs' names to go on the ballot would be fruitless for two reasons. First, the clerk's certification of Plaintiffs' names does not ensure the county clerk, who is actually responsible for preparing ballots, would comply. If the clerk certified a candidate for the office of Dogcatcher, would the county clerk add a ballot space? And even if the county clerk did comply, *mandamus* still would be fruitless because, as explained above, Plaintiff cannot be seated to these non-elected offices.

WHEREFORE, the Town of Normal and Angie Huonker respectfully request that this Honorable Court dismiss Plaintiffs' complaints for *mandamus*, with prejudice, and grant any further relief it deems just and fair.

VERIFIED COMPLAINT FOR MANDAMUS

NOW COMES, Petitioner, Amy Conklin, (hereinafter referred to as "Candidate") by and through her attorneys Thomas G. DeVore, and the Silver Lake Group, Ltd., and for her Verified Complaint Mandamus and Injunctive Relief against Respondents, Town of Normal (hereinafter referred to as the "Town") and Angie Huonker (hereinafter referred to as "Huonker"), (collectively both shall be hereinafter referred to as the "Defendants") and hereby alleges as follows:

PARTY PLAINTIFFS

1. The Candidate is a resident of the Incorporated Town of Normal.

PARTY DEFENDANTS

2. The Town is a body politic and has only those powers as provided to them by the Illinois Constitution and the Illinois legislature.
3. Huonker is currently the appointed clerk of the Town.

RELEVANT LEGAL FRAMEWORK

4. Mandamus is a proper remedy to compel a board or officer to perform a ministerial act where he is under a clear legal duty to do so. *People v. Knopf*, 198 Ill. 340, 64 N. E. 842, 1127.

5. The Illinois Supreme Court explained that the responsibility for determining whether an election petition apparently conforms to the law rests with the town clerk. *People ex rel. Giese et al. v. Dillon, Town Clerk*, 266 Ill. 272, 107 N.E. 583.
6. Specifically, the clerk's duty is "to determine whether, upon the face of the petition, it is in compliance with the law. *Id.*
7. If the petition on its face appears to comply with the statutory requisites, the clerk may not look outside the petition to determine whether in fact it does comply; he must submit the question to the voters. *Id.* (Emphasis Added)
8. The Election Code states that all nominating papers, "*being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act*" are deemed valid unless they are subject to a duly filed objection. (Emphasis added.) 10 ILCS 5/10-8 (West 1996).
9. Any village of fewer than 5,000 inhabitants may, by resolution adopted by not less than two-thirds of the village board, choose to have a clerk appointed by the village president with the concurrence of the village board. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-90) ¹
10. Otherwise, at the election for trustees in each village and incorporated town, whether incorporated under a general or special Act (other than a village that was incorporated under a special Act and that adopts Section 3.1-30-25), a clerk of the village or incorporated town *shall be elected* who shall hold office for a term of the same length of time as provided in this Article 3.1 for the mayor in a city, except that any such village or incorporated town that, before January 1, 1942, has adopted a 2 year term for village clerk shall continue to elect a village clerk for a term of 2 years. *Id.*

¹ It is clear the legislature was contemplating elected versus appointed positions for incorporated towns as the law specifically allows for a town clerk to be appointed only when the town has a population less than 5,000.

11. Incorporated town officers. For the general municipal election to be held in the year 1985 *in every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more* by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk *shall certify* the names of the candidates to the proper election authority *as provided by the general election law*. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-95)
12. A president, a *clerk*, an assessor, a *collector*, and a *supervisor* shall be elected for a term of 4 years and until their successors are elected and have qualified. *Id.*
13. A home rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office *only as* approved by referendum *or* as otherwise authorized by law. (See Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, § 6(f))
14. Although they have been granted extensive powers with respect to their local government and affairs (Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, 6(a)), home rule municipalities may change their manner of selecting officers only: (1) as provided by statute; or (2) as approved by a referendum. (Emphasis Added) (2005 Ill. Atty. Gen. Op. 007 (Ill.A.G.))
15. The constitutional mandate requires that changes in the manner of selecting officers of a home rule municipality or their terms are reserved to the voters by article VII, section 6(f), and can be effected only by referendum unless otherwise authorized by legislative enactment. *Leck v. Michaelson*, 111 Ill.2d 523, 491 N.E.2d 414, 96 Ill.Dec. 368.
16. The primary objective of statutory construction is to ascertain and give effect to the legislature's intent. *Evans v. Cook County State's Attorney*, 2021 IL 125513, ¶ 27, 451 Ill.Dec. 353, 183 N.E.3d 810.
17. The most reliable indicator of legislative intent is the language of the statute, given its plain and ordinary meaning. *People v. Casler*, 2020 IL 125117, ¶ 24, 450 Ill.Dec. 415, 181 N.E.3d 767.

18. When statutory language is plain and unambiguous, the statute must be applied as written without resort to aids of statutory construction. *People v. Howard*, 228 Ill. 2d 428, 438, 320 Ill.Dec. 868, 888 N.E.2d 85 (2008).
19. We may not depart from a statute's plain language by reading in exceptions, limitations, or conditions the legislature did not express. *People v. Lewis*, 223 Ill. 2d 393, 402, 307 Ill.Dec. 645, 860 N.E.2d 299 (2006).
20. Courts should not attempt to read a statute other than in the manner it was written. *Rosewood Care Center, Inc. v. Caterpillar, Inc.*, 226 Ill. 2d 559, 567, 315 Ill.Dec. 762, 877 N.E.2d 1091 (2007)

FACTUAL BASIS

21. The Candidate filed her nominating papers for the elected office of town clerk. (See attached Exhibit A)
22. The nominating papers were filed timely on November 28, 2022.
23. On or about December 02, 2022, the Town, through their counsel, sent a letter to the Candidate proclaiming her nominating papers lacked apparent conformity with the legal requirements and as such refused to certify the Candidates nominating papers to the election authorities. (See attached Exhibit B)
24. In the Town's correspondence it stated that given the Town has chosen in its local municipal code to appoint a town clerk, that the nominating papers lacked apparent conformity with legal requirements. (See attached relevant provisions of the Town code as Exhibit C)²

² The election code states the clerk shall certify if the nominating papers conform to the Act. The Act being the election code. There is no facially deficient defect in the nominating papers as required by the Act. The nominating papers comply with all requirements of the Act. The clerk and the Town are arbitrarily disregarding compulsory state law by proclaiming they local election code supersedes the state law.

25. Notwithstanding this letter from the Town on December 02, 2022, on December 05, 2022, two residents of the Town filed objections to the nominating papers of the Candidate. (See attached Exhibit D) ³
26. Notwithstanding the Town, and or Huonker, had deemed the nominating petition lacking apparent conformity, the Town's board of elections was convened on December 09, 2022 to consider the objections filed.
27. The Candidate filed her response to the objections with the election board. (See Exhibit E)
28. On or about December 27, 2022, counsel for the Town advised the Town would not be proceeding with the objections filed with the board of elections and was going to instead rely on the Town's December 02, 2022 letter that the nominating papers were not in apparent conformity with the legal requirements.
29. In essence, the Town is taking the position that the objections filed were moot given the Town had concluded the nominating papers were not in apparent conformity with the Town election code. (See Exhibit F)
30. Given the Town has refused to resolve this matter with the local election board, the Candidate was left with no choice but to seek relief directly from the Court.
31. The Town must certify the Candidate's name to the county officials before January 26, 2023. (See correspondence from county clerk attached as Exhibit G)

COUNT I
MANDAMUS

32. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 31 as if each had been specifically plead herein.

³ The Court will see the objections filed by the two unrelated objectors are identical. Upon information and belief, these objections were drafted by counsel for the Town in an effort to create the appearance citizen objectors.

33. The Candidate has a right to have her name placed on the ballot for the elected office of town clerk.
34. Huonker has a mandatory duty to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate if the nominating papers comply with the Illinois Election Code.
35. The nominating papers of the Candidate on their face comply with the Election Code.
36. Nothing on the face of the nominating papers was facially deficient and the Town has failed to point to any facial deficiencies of the requirements of the Election Code.
37. While two objectors filed objections the Town concluded these objections were rendered moot given its earlier determination that certification of the nominating papers was unnecessary given their lack of conformity to the local municipal code.⁴
38. The Election Code is clear in that all nominating papers, "*being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act,*" are deemed valid unless they are subject to a duly filed objection.
39. Furthermore, beginning in 1985, every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk shall certify the names of the candidates to the proper election authority as provided by the general election law.⁵
40. When this law was passed in Illinois, only two towns, being Cicero and Normal, had a population over 25,000.

⁴ The objections filed by the two citizens are identical legal arguments made by the Town in the letter sent to the Candidate on December 02. As previously stated, upon information and belief, the Town counsel drafted these written legal objections for the objectors as each is identical and states legal analysis which the Town is relying upon to assert the nominating papers lack apparent conformity.

⁵ The statute compels this office be elected in the Town. The Candidate complied with the election code and no objections have been raised stating anything to the contrary. The Town and/or Huonker cannot proclaim we have chosen not to provide for this office as an elected position in our municipal code and as such the Candidate has not met the legal requirements. The local municipal code is not the controlling law for which to measure the legal sufficiency of the nominating papers.

41. The statute says every incorporated town which clearly meant both of them.
42. The statute is clear and unambiguous and can be construed no other way that to demand the Town comply and elect this office.
43. The town of Cicero is in full compliance with the state statute and elects this office.
44. There is no legal basis for which the Town, and/or Huonker, can blatantly disregard state law and arbitrarily and capriciously refuse to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate that are in compliance with the Illinois Election Code for an elected office which is mandated upon the Town by state law.
45. The Town, and/or Huonker have no discretion to refuse to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate.
46. The Candidate has a clear right to be named on the ballot as her nominating papers comply with the Illinois Election Code for an office that is mandated by state law upon the Town.

WHEREFORE, the Candidate herein request that this court enter an Order:

- A. Finding the Candidate presented nominating papers as required by the Illinois Election Code;
- B. Finding that the Town, and/or Huonker, has a non-discretionary duty to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate;
- C. Finding the local municipal code is superseded by state law;
- D. Enter a writ ordering the Town, and/or Huonker to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate to the county election authorities before January 26, 2023.
- E. That the Court grant such other and further relief as is just and proper.

**Re: Nomination Papers for the office of Normal Town Clerk in the 2023
Municipal Election**

Dear Ms. Conklin:

I have been retained by the Town of Normal regarding the 2023 Municipal Election. You have filed nomination papers with the Town Clerk that seek to nominate you as a candidate for election to the office of Normal Town Clerk in the 2023 Election. Section 10-8 of the Illinois Election Code provides that: "certificates of nomination and nomination papers, and petitions to submit public questions to a referendum, being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act, shall be deemed to be valid..." 10 ILCS 5/10-8. Accordingly, the Town has an affirmative duty to determine if nomination papers filed with it are "in apparent conformity" with the provisions of the Election Code.

Pursuant to Chapter 2, Section 2.1-1 of the Normal Town Code, the offices of Town President, and Members of the Board of Trustee are elected municipal offices. The Code makes no provision for election of the Town Clerk. The only municipal offices to be contested at the 2023 Municipal Election, pursuant to Chapter 2, Section 2.2-1 of the Code, are three trustee positions. Accordingly, the nomination papers seeking to nominate you for the office of Town Clerk are not in apparent conformity with legal requirements.

As a result of this lack of apparent conformity with legal requirements, the Town cannot certify your name to the County Clerk for inclusion on the 2023 municipal ballot for election to an office that is not an elective office under the Town Code, and your name will not appear on the ballot.

EXHIBIT B

CHAPTER 2 - OFFICERS, ELECTED AND APPOINTED

DIVISION 1 - PRESIDENT

SEC. 2.1-1 ELECTION - TERM OF OFFICE. The Town President shall be elected for a term of four (4) years and he shall be the President of the Board of Trustees, as provided by Statute. The inauguration of any newly elected President shall take place at the first regular meeting of the corporate authorities in the month of May following such election. (Amended 3/1/93 by Ord. No. 4115)

SEC. 2.1-2 DUTIES. He shall be the chief executive officer of the Town and shall perform all such duties as may be required by him by Statute or Ordinance. He shall have the power and authority to inspect all books and records kept by any Town officer or employees at any reasonable time.

SEC. 2.1-2.5 COMPENSATION. The President shall receive a salary in an amount fixed from time to time by ordinance. Beginning on December 1, 2018, the salary for the President is as follows:

- A. For each term of office beginning before the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$18,000 per year, payable monthly while in office.
- B. For each term of office beginning after the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$32,000 per year, payable monthly while in office.

SEC. 2.1-3. If the President is unable to perform the duties of the office through either death, absence from the Town for physical or mental disability for such a length of time or of such severity as would reasonably require the appointment of a fully empowered replacement, the Board of Trustees may elect one of its members President pro tem. The President pro tem shall have all the powers, duties, responsibilities and authority of the President. (Amended 12/1/75)

SEC. 2.1-4 NOTE. The President and Board of Trustees at times are referred to in this Code as the Town Board, the Town Council, the Board, the Council, the Corporate Authority, or other comparable language. In such situations or cases, no distinction or differentiation is intended. (Amended 12/1/75)

DIVISION 2 - BOARD OF TRUSTEES

SEC. 2.2-1 ELECTION. The Trustees shall be elected in accordance with SEC. 1.1-1 of this Code and the Statutes made and provided therefore. The inauguration of any newly elected Trustee shall take place at the first regular meeting of the corporate authorities in the month of May following such election. (Amended 3/1/93 by Ord. No. 4115)

SEC. 2.2-2 COMPENSATION. Each member of the Board of Trustees shall receive a salary in an amount fixed from time to time by ordinance. Beginning on December 1, 2018, the salary for each member of the Board of Trustees is as follows:

- A. For each term of office beginning before the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$4,800 per year, payable monthly while the Trustee is in office.
- B. For each term of office beginning after the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$6,800 per year, payable monthly while the Trustee is in office.

(Amended 10/15/73)(Renumbered 12/1/76)(Amended 6/21/76)(Amended 2/7/77)(Amended 2/2/81)(Amended 4/20/81 - Eff. May, 1985)(Amended 2/15/88)(Entire Section Amended 12/17/18 by Ord. No. 5772).

DIVISION 3 - APPOINTED OFFICERS

SEC. 2.3-1 APPOINTMENT. At the second regular meeting of the Town Council held in the month of March of each year, or as soon thereafter as convenient, the Town Council, with the President of the Town, shall jointly make the appointment of all appointive members of Boards and Commissions as required by State Statute and as provided for in this Code. Those officers holding present appointments, and all those hereafter appointed, shall have their appointments automatically renewed each March without further action of the Town Council, unless the party or parties in question, or the Town Council, shall terminate said employment.

All appointive officers of the Town shall serve for a term of one year commencing with the fiscal year of April 1 following the time of appointment as hereinbefore set out or until their successors are appointed and qualified provided, they may be removed from office for any good cause shown. In the case of a vacancy in any of said appointive officers for any cause, an officer shall, as soon as possible, be appointed in the same manner to serve for the remainder of the unexpired fiscal year. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-2 BOND. Before entering upon his duties of office, each officer appointed shall execute a bond in the amount hereinafter provided conditioned upon the faithful performance of the duties of his respective office and with sureties to be approved by the Town Council.

The Town of Normal shall pay the premium, if any, on the furnishing of said bonds. (Amended 12/3/73)

SEC. 2.3-3 COMPENSATION. All officers appointed under this Code shall receive such compensation as the Board of Trustees and the President of the Town jointly shall fix from time to time by ordinance or resolution. All officers and assistants heretofore appointed shall serve and retain their same powers, duties and salary until April 1, 1969, or until their successors are appointed and qualified.

SEC. 2.3-4 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - OFFICE CREATED. The office of Municipal Manager is hereby created.

SEC. 2.3-5 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - APPOINTMENT. The Town Council shall appoint a Municipal Manager, who shall be the administrative head of the Municipal Government of the Town of Normal and who shall be responsible for the efficient administration of all departments. He shall be appointed without regard to his political beliefs and need not be a resident of the Town of Normal when appointed. The Municipal Manager shall be appointed for an indefinite term. In the case of the absence or disability of the Manager, the Town Council may designate a qualified administrative officer of the Town of Normal to perform the duties of the Manager during such absence or disability.

SEC. 2.3-6 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - REMOVAL FROM OFFICE. A Manager may at any time be removed from office by a majority vote of the members of the Town Council.

SEC. 2.3-7 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - DUTIES AND POWERS. The powers and duties of the Municipal Manager shall be:

- A. To enforce the laws and ordinances within the Town.
- B. To appoint and remove all directors of departments. No appointment shall be made upon any basis other than that of merit and fitness.
- C. To exercise control of all departments and division thereof created by said Article V of the Revised Cities and Villages Act of Illinois and by any ordinances of the Town and by this ordinance and all amendments thereto.
- D. To have all the powers and exercise all the duties granted by Statute to municipal clerks and comptrollers with respect to the preparation of the report of estimated funds necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the fiscal year for the consideration of the corporate authorities prior to the preparation of the annual appropriation ordinance.
- E. To attend all meetings of the Council with the right to take part in the discussions; but with no right to vote.
- F. To recommend to the Council for adoption such measure as he may deem necessary or expedient.
- G. To see that all terms and conditions imposed in favor of the Town or its inhabitants and any contract or public utility franchise are faithfully kept and performed.

- H. To make in the ordinary course of business all purchases of materials, services and supplies necessary for the Town, as provided for in the Annual Budget and as provided in the Town's Purchasing Manual. (Amended 6/3/74)(Amended 11/21/77)(Amended 10/19/87)(Amended 4/6/98)
- I. To have and exercise the power, authority, and duty of any director of a department or division thereof prescribed by this ordinance or any amendment thereof during the time when the office of any such director shall be vacant or no person shall have been appointed thereto.
- J. To prepare such regular and special reports as are necessary for the efficient operation of the Town government, including an agenda for each Council meeting whether such meeting be regular or special, and such agenda to be prepared and distributed in advance of said meeting to all necessary parties.
- K. To conduct and prepare the necessary studies and/or research to help the Council make its policy decisions.
- L. To prepare an annual budget for the presentation and adoption by the Council, and shall further work with the City Officials in helping to prepare information for the necessary appropriation and levy ordinances.
- M. To assume and do all other duties as specifically delegated and assigned to him by said Council.
- N. To prepare and submit to the Town Council, at monthly intervals, reports which will advise said Council of the financial condition and future needs of the Town, and in so doing he may make such other recommendations as he may deem desirable.
- O. To recommend to the Council a standard schedule of pay for each appointive office.
- P. To recommend to the governing body from time to time adoption of such measures as he may deem necessary or expedient for the health, welfare, or safety of the citizenry or for the future improvement of the administrative services.
- Q. To prescribe rules and regulations for the conduct of the various departments of the Town and divisions thereunder.
- R. To perform such other duties as may be prescribed by said Article V of the Revised Cities and Villages Act of Illinois by this ordinance or any ordinance or resolution of the Town Council.
- S. To authorize a change or changes in any contract with the Town provided a written determination is made that:

1. The circumstances said to necessitate the change(s) in performance were not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed;
2. Were not within the contemplation of the contract as signed; or
3. Are in the best interest of the Town. The City Manager shall promptly report to the Council all change orders which authorize or necessitate an increase or decrease in either the cost of a contract by ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or more or the time of completion by thirty (30) days or more.
(Added 7/3/89)

SEC. 2.3-8 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - SALARY. Compensation of the Municipal Manager shall be as determined by the Town Council.

SEC. 2.3-9 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - VACATION AND EMPLOYMENT RESTRICTIONS. The Municipal Manager shall be subject to the vacation schedule as authorized by the City Council, but not less than the provisions in existence in the Personnel Code for all other Town employees. He shall, likewise, be subject to the same sickness and disability provisions as other Town employees. He shall devote his entire time to the discharge of his official duties.
(Amended 7/16/73)

SEC. 2.3-10 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS. The Municipal Manager shall be paid for the use of his own private vehicle when used exclusively for Town business at the per mile rate established by the Town Council for compensated travel by other Town officials and/or employees, and he shall keep accurate records of same which shall be subject to Council approval prior to payment or the Town may provide a vehicle to be used by the City Manager for Town business. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-11 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - BOND. The Manager shall furnish a surety bond in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or such additional sum as may be established by the Town Council, which bond shall be approved by said Council. Said bond to be conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties as such Municipal Manager, and the premium on the bond shall be paid by the Town.

SEC. 2.3-12 EXECUTIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE POWERS AND DUTIES. The executive and administrative powers and duties of the Town shall be distributed and exercised through the departments and divisions thereof as provided by the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal of 1969 and as created and ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the Town Council and by reference hereto are made a part hereof as if the same were stated herein.

SEC. 2.3-13 APPOINTIVE OFFICERS - POWERS, DUTIES AND SALARIES. The powers, duties, and salaries of an appointive officer and employee shall be in accordance with the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal of 1969 and in accordance with ordinances passed and approved by the Town Council and are by reference made a part hereof as if the same were stated herein.

SEC. 2.3-14 AUDIT. At the close of each fiscal year the Town Council shall cause an independent audit of all accounts of the Town of Normal to be made by an accountant or accountants authorized to practice accounting under the laws of the State of Illinois.

SEC. 2.3-15 CITY MANAGER - FINALITY OF ACTION. All acts and things done by the City Manager pursuant to this Code shall, unless otherwise especially provided, be final and conclusive unless and until superseded by action of the President and/or Board of Trustees. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-16 DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Parks and Recreation, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-17 DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Director of Parks and Recreation to see to the overall administration of the recreation program of the Town, to be in charge of all parklands, to be the supervisor of all buildings and/or equipment belonging to said Town's Parks and Recreation Department and in general to be the chief administrative officer of the Town for said Department. He shall answer solely to the City Manager or the Town Council, as the case might be, and he shall have sole jurisdiction over the issuance of permits for the use of the Town's park facilities. His salary shall be as established by resolution of the Town Council and subject to the same controls as those affecting the other department heads.

SEC. 2.3-18 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Building Commissioner, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-19 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Building Commissioner to see to the enforcement of all ordinance provisions relating to buildings and zoning and to inspect all buildings or structures being erected or altered, as frequently as may be necessary to insure compliance with the Town ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-20 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - STOP ORDER. The Building Commissioner shall have the power to order all work stopped on construction or alteration or repair of buildings in the Town, when such work is being done in violation of any provisions of an ordinance relating thereto, or in violation of the zoning ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such order, except on the written permission of the Commissioner, provided that if the stop order is an oral one, it shall be followed by a written stop order within an hour. Such written stop order may be served by a policeman. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-21 BUILDING INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating any order of the Building Inspector shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00 for each day on which any work in violation of such stop order is done.

SEC. 2.3-22 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Plumbing Inspector, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-23 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Plumbing Inspector to see to the enforcement of all provisions of the ordinances relating to plumbing and plumbing equipment; and to make such inspections and perform such tests as may be necessary in the enforcement of such ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-24 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - STOP ORDER. The Plumbing Inspector shall have the power to order work stopped on the construction, alteration or repair of plumbing equipment when such work is being done in violation of any ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such a stop order except on written permission of the Plumbing Inspector; provided that if the stop order is an oral one it shall be followed by a written stop order within one hour. Such written stop order may be served by any policeman.

SEC. 2.3-25 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, or corporation violating or failing to comply with any of the terms and requirements of this article shall be fined a sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00, or be imprisoned for not to exceed six (6) months or both such fine and such imprisonment. Each day that any such violation or failure continues shall be considered as a separate and distinct offense and shall be punishable as such.

SEC. 2.3-26 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Director of Public Works, being a continuation of the former office of Superintendent of Public Works. The Director shall be appointed by the City Manager. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-27 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - DUTIES. The Director of Public Works is responsible for the organizing, directing and coordinating the activities of several divisions comprising the Public Works Department including municipal engineer, problems relating to the design, construction, and maintenance of streets, sewers, and other public works structures, the cleaning of streets, the collection and disposal of refuse and garbage and the maintenance of mechanical equipment and building. (Amended 3/7/72)(Amended 4/18/88)

SEC. 2.3-28 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - MOTOR FUEL TAX. All repairs, construction or reconstruction of any and all streets and of all adjuncts and appurtenances thereto which may be paid in whole or in part out of money received by the Town from the State of Illinois as its share of Motor Fuel Tax shall be under the control of the Director of Public Works. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-29 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Electrical Inspector, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-30 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Electrical Inspector to see to the enforcement of all provisions of the ordinances relating to electrical installations and electrical equipment and to make such inspections and perform such tests as may be necessary in the enforcement of such ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-31 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - STOP ORDER. The Electrical Inspector shall have the power to order work stopped on the construction, alteration or repair of electrical equipment or installations when such work is being done in violation of any ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such a stop order except on written permission of the Electrical Inspector; provided that if the stop order is an oral one it shall be followed by a written stop order within one hour. Such written stop order may be served by any policeman.

SEC. 2.3-32 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating or failing to comply with any of the terms and requirements of this article shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00, or be imprisoned for not to exceed six (6) months or both such fine and such imprisonment. Each day that any such violation or failure continues shall be considered as a separate and distinct offense and shall be punishable as such.

SEC. 2.3-33 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - COMPOSITION AND QUALIFICATION. All of the legal activities of the Town government are assigned to the Law Department of said Town. The Legal Department shall consist of a licensed attorney at law to be known as the Corporation Counsel. The Corporation Counsel shall be the responsible head of the Legal Department with the full authority to direct the carrying on of its activities. He shall be appointed by the City Manager, and his activities shall be authorized and supervised by the City Manager.

The Corporation Counsel shall at the time of his appointment be a practicing member of the Bar of McLean County, Illinois, and be of good standing therein and otherwise qualified by law to serve as legal officer of the Town. He shall devote such of his time and energies to the discharge of his official duties as such duties may from time to time be required. The Corporation Counsel shall be required upon conclusion of his terms of office to turn over official Town files and records to his successor in office. (Amended 1/5/73)(Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-34 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - SUITS AND ACTIONS. The Corporation Counsel shall prosecute or defend any and all suits or actions at law or equity to which the Town may be a party, or in which it may be interested, or which may be brought against, or by, any officer of the Town on behalf of the Town or in the capacity of such person as an officer of the Town. (Amended 3/5/80)

The Corporation Counsel may, with the approval of the City Manager, employ outside legal counsel to attend to the legal affairs of the Town in the event that attorneys within the Legal Department are unable to attend to such affairs due to a specialized nature of the legal matter, when a hearing officer or attorney is required and attorneys in the department have a conflict, or when otherwise authorized by the City Manager.

In the event the outside counsel is representing the Town, the City Manager is authorized, on behalf of the Town, to waive such matters as necessary to enable such outside counsel to

represent other clients doing business or otherwise interacting with the Town on matters unrelated to the outside counsel's representation of the Town.
(Entire Division Amended 5/21/07 by Ord. No. 5136)

SEC. 2.3-35 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - ADVICE. The Corporation Counsel shall be the legal advisor to the Town and shall render advice on all legal questions affecting the Town whenever requested to do so by any Town official. Upon request by the President, or the Town Council, he shall reduce any such opinion to writing.

The Corporation Counsel shall

1. advise and assist in the drafting of all Town ordinances, order, regulations, and contracts to which the Town is expected to become a party;
2. approve all ordinances as to form before the same are submitted to the Town Council;
3. approve all contracts before the same are signed by the proper officials;
4. be responsible for the handling of any and all legal affairs of the Town and;
5. be responsible for the prosecution of violations of Town ordinances before Courts having jurisdiction to try such offenses and in addition, shall have such other duties as may be assigned to him, provided that outside counsel may be hired with Council approval for special projects. (Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-36 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - JUDGMENTS. It shall be the duty of the Corporation Counsel to see to the full enforcement of all judgments or decrees rendered or entered in favor of the Town and of all similar interlocutory orders. (Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-37 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - COMPENSATION. The City Attorney shall receive such annual salary as is provided by ordinance and the same shall apply to the Assistant City Attorney. Additional compensation shall be paid for the usual services in the issuance and sale of municipal securities, being bond issues, of either revenue or general obligation forms; for obtaining of easements for the acquisition of property; and all matters pertaining to special assessments. Expenses incurred for travel and similar incidental expenses applicable to the business of the Town shall be reimbursed.

SEC. 2.3-38 TOWN CLERK - OFFICE CREATED. The office of the Town Clerk, heretofore established by Ordinance as an appointive office, is hereby retained. The Clerk shall be appointed by the City Manager, and receive such compensation as may be provided by Ordinance.

SEC. 2.3-39 TOWN CLERK - DUTIES. The Town Clerk shall be the recording officer of the municipality and have custody of all documents, books, records and papers pertaining to the Town or departments thereof, not specifically assigned to some other officer or department and shall be the keeper of the official seal of said Town. The Clerk must attend all meetings of the Town

Council, or Board, and keep the records of the proceedings thereof, and where required, to see to the publication of all ordinances, resolutions and notices requiring same. The Town Clerk shall be immediately in charge of the Deputy Clerk and shall be responsible for his acts. The Clerk shall furnish to the various departments of the State of Illinois all records and data so required or directed by Statute to be furnished. The Clerk of said Town shall keep the Town offices open during such hours as may be directed by the Town Council. All documents filed with the Clerk may be evidenced by certified copies and the passage and publication of ordinances and notices may be proved by such certificate. Said Clerk shall perform all duties prescribed by the Town Council of said Town or by law or ordinance, under the supervision of the City Manager. The Clerk shall not, however, be responsible for preparation of a report of estimated funds necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the fiscal year for the consideration of the Board of Trustees prior to the preparation of the Annual Budget or Appropriation Ordinance. (Amended 4/3/72)(Amended 11/15/76)

SEC. 2.3-40 TOWN CLERK - INDICES. The Town Clerk shall keep and maintain a proper index to all documents and records kept by him so that ready access thereto and use thereof may be had.

SEC. 2.3-41 TOWN CLERK - VACANCY. In case the office of Town Clerk shall become vacant for any reason, the City Manager shall appoint a successor. (Amended 4/3/72)(Amended 11/15/76)

SEC. 2.3-42 TOWN TREASURER - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Town Treasurer. The Town Treasurer shall be appointed by the City Manager and shall receive such compensation as may be provided by ordinance. (Amended 12/3/73)

SEC. 2.3-43 TOWN TREASURER - EX OFFICIO COLLECTOR. The Town Treasurer shall be ex officio collector and shall perform all duties of that office.

SEC. 2.3-44 TOWN TREASURER - GENERAL DUTIES. The Town Treasurer shall perform such duties as may be prescribed for him by Statute or ordinance, and shall perform such other duties and functions as assigned by him by the Town Council or the City Manager. It shall be the duty of the Town Treasurer to see to the accounting, bookkeeping and collection of funds; to make preparations for the disbursing of revenue; to receive all money paid in to the Town, whether directed from the person paying the money or from the hands of such other officer or employee as may receive it; to pay out money only on vouchers or orders properly signed by the President and Town Clerk; to supply the Town Clerk and the Town Council and all other officers of said Town all data pertaining to the Town's finances when so requested; to be responsible for the maintenance of records of the Water and Sewer Department and to be responsible for the preparation and collection of water and sewer charges. The Town Treasurer shall not retain any fees or other stipends received from the performance of his duties, but the same shall become the property of the Town.

SEC. 2.3-45 TOWN TREASURER - DEPOSIT OF FUNDS IN DESIGNATED DEPOSITORIES. The following financial institutions are designated depositories of and for the Town of Normal Funds:

Depositories herein designated shall, at all times, comply with the laws of the State of Illinois with reference to the requirements of depositories and shall promptly furnish such statements to the Town of Normal as are required by State Law. (Amended 3/7/72)(Amended 8/7/78)

SEC. 2.3-46 TOWN TREASURER - RECORDS. He shall keep records showing all money received by him, showing the source from which it is received and purpose for which it is paid and he shall keep records at all times showing the financial status of the Town.

SEC. 2.3-47 TOWN TREASURER - ACCOUNTING. The Treasurer shall keep such books and accounts as may be required by statute or ordinance, and he shall keep them in the manner required by the Board of Trustees.

SEC. 2.3-48 TOWN TREASURER - SPECIAL ASSESSMENT FUND. All moneys received on any special assessment shall be held by the Treasurer as a special fund to be applied only to the improvement, or bonds and vouchers issued therefore, together with interest thereon, for which the assessment was made and said money shall be used for no other purpose, unless to reimburse the Town for money expended for such improvements. Payment on bonds or vouchers shall be in accordance with the statutes and the laws and the Treasurer shall keep his books and accounts in such a manner so that proper appropriation in payments in principal and interest can be made and ascertained.

SEC. 2.3-49 TOWN TREASURER - WARRANTS AND TRANSFER OF FUNDS. All warrants drawn on the Treasurer must be signed by the President and countersigned by the Clerk, stating the particular fund or appropriation to which the same is chargeable, and the person to

whom payable; and no money shall be otherwise paid except as may be provided by statute. Money shall not be transferred by the Treasurer from one fund to another, after it has been collected or paid, except as may be ordered by the President and Board of Trustees or except in the manner and form prescribed by statutes. The Town Treasurer, or his designated agent, may electronically transfer Town funds either for investment purposes, or for the payment of Town debts, or for any other usual and customary purpose provided such electronic transfer of funds is approved by the Clerk, the Clerk's designee, or President of the Board of Trustees. Such transfer shall be reported monthly to the President and Board of Trustees for authorization or ratification. In the absence of the Clerk or Deputy Clerk, the City Manager or Assistant City Manager may also authorize the electronic transfer of funds. (Amended 2/21/94 by Ord. No. 4208)(Amended 2/16/98 by Ord. No. 4494)(Amended 2/21/05 by Ord. No. 4996)

SEC. 2.3-50 CHIEF OF POLICE - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of the Chief of Police for the Town of Normal, Illinois.

SEC. 2.3-51 CHIEF OF POLICE - APPOINTMENT. The Chief shall be appointed by the City Manager; provided that if the person appointed Chief was at the time of such promotion a member of the Department, he shall retain his status and rank while serving as Chief and shall revert to such status and rank when his term as Chief has ended. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-52 CHIEF OF POLICE - DUTIES. The Chief of Police shall be the keeper of the Town Jail and shall have custody of all persons incarcerated therein. He shall keep such records and make such reports concerning the activities of his department as may be required by statute or by the Town Council. The Chief shall be responsible for the performance by the Police Department of all its functions, and all persons who are members of the Department shall serve subject to the order of the Chief of Police.

SEC. 2.3-53 CHIEF OF POLICE - RULES AND REGULATIONS. The Chief of Police may make or prescribe such rules and regulations not inconsistent with rules and regulations promulgated by the Board of Police and Fire Commissioners as he shall deem advisable; such rules when approved by the Town Council shall be binding upon such members. Such rules and regulations may cover, besides the conduct of the members, uniforms and equipment being worn or carried, hours of service, vacations all other similar matters necessary or desirable for the efficiency of the Department.

SEC. 2.3-54 HEALTH INSPECTOR - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Health Inspector for the Town of Normal. The Chief of Police shall serve as ex officio Health Inspector.

SEC. 2.3-55 HEALTH INSPECTOR - DUTIES. The Health Inspector shall enforce all ordinances containing provisions for the protection of public health; he shall make inspections of food stuffs and of the premises used for storing or selling of food stuffs; he shall enforce all provisions as may be provided by ordinance; he shall perform such other duties and functions as is required by statute or ordinance.

SEC. 2.3-56 HEALTH INSPECTOR - REPORT. The Health Inspector shall make such reports to the Board of Trustees as may be required. He shall also make recommendations for rulings, orders or ordinances respecting the public health whenever he is requested to do so or whenever he deems it advisable or necessary.

SEC. 2.3-57 HEALTH INSPECTOR - COMPENSATION. No additional compensation shall be paid the Chief of Police for his duties as Health Inspector for the Town of Normal.

SEC. 2.3-58 TOWN ENGINEER.

- A. Appointment and qualifications. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore the office of Town Engineer. The Town Engineer shall be appointed by the City Manager and shall be a licensed professional engineer in the State of Illinois.
- B. Duties. The Town Engineer shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for all engineering questions and duties of the Town assigned to him. The Town Engineer shall attend meetings of the corporate authorities and give opinions, verbal and written, when requested. He shall also be the engineer for the Board of Local Improvements and shall attend all meetings of said Board. The Engineer shall be responsible for field inspection for all new construction except as specifically excluded by the Board of Trustees. (SEC. 2.3-58 added 1/2/73)(Renumbering revised 12/3/73)(Amended 2/7/78, Eff. 4/1/78)(Amended 4/18/88)

SEC. 2.3-59 INFORMATION SERVICES.

- A. Appointment. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Information Services, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Illinois law and Town ordinances applicable to the managerial form of government.
- B. Duties. The Director of Information Services shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for information storage, processing, and retrieval as those duties are assigned from time to time by the City Manager. (SEC. 2.3-59 added 3/17/97 by Ord. No. 4445)

SEC. 2.3-60 DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RESOURCES.

- A. Appointment. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Human Resources, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Illinois law and Town ordinances applicable to the managerial form of government.
- B. Duties. The Director of Human Resources shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for providing a comprehensive human resources management system as those duties are assigned and delineated from time to time by the City Manager. (SEC. 2.3-60 added 3/17/97 by Ord. No. 4445)

COMES NOW, Candidates Amy Conklin, Charles Sila, and Robert Shoraga (hereinafter referred to as "Candidates"), by and through their attorneys Thomas G. DeVore and the Silver Lake Group Ltd., and hereby files this consolidated response the objections filed by the objectors Patrick Dullard, and Jeffrey Fritzen, (hereinafter referred to as "Objectors"), and hereby pleads:

RELEVANT FACTUAL HISTORY

- 1) The Town of Normal is a home rule municipality.
- 2) The Town of Normal is an unincorporated town.
- 3) The Town of Normal has a population in excess of 25,000 citizens.
- 4) The Town of Normal has never by referendum eliminated the offices of Town Collector or Supervisor.
- 5) The Town of Normal has never by referendum altered the manner of choosing a Town Clerk to be by appointment instead of by election.
- 6) On or about November 28, 2022, Amy Conklin submitted to the Town of Normal her nominating papers for the elected office of Town Clerk.
- 7) On or about November 28, 2022, Charles Sila submitted to the Town of Normal his nominating papers for the elected office of Town Collector.

EXHIBIT E

- 8) On or about November 28, 2022, Robert Shoraga submitted to the Town of Normal his nominating papers for the elected office of Supervisor.
- 9) On or about December 02, 2022, counsel for the Town of Normal sent written notices to each Candidate stating the Town of Normal would not recognize the nominating papers of the Candidates.
- 10) On or about December 05, 2022, the Objectors filed a written objection to Amy Conklin's nominating papers.
- 11) The Objectors written objections to Amy Conklin's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.
- 12) As to Amy Conklin's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for an elected Town Clerk as is prescribes the Town Clerk to be an appointed position.
- 13) The Objectors to Amy Conklin's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.
- 14) The Objectors written objections to Charles Sila's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.
- 15) As to Charles Sila's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for a Town Collector.
- 16) The Objectors to Charles Sila's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.
- 17) The Objectors written objections to Robert Shoraga's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.

- 18) As to Robert Shoraga's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for a Supervisor.
- 19) The Objectors to Robert Shoraga's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.

LEGAL STANDARD

- 20) Any village of fewer than 5,000 inhabitants may, by resolution adopted by not less than two-thirds of the village board, choose to have a clerk appointed by the village president with the concurrence of the village board. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-90)
- 21) Otherwise, at the election for trustees in each village and incorporated town, whether incorporated under a general or special Act (other than a village that was incorporated under a special Act and that adopts Section 3.1-30-25), a clerk of the village or incorporated town *shall be elected* who shall hold office for a term of the same length of time as provided in this Article 3.1 for the mayor in a city, except that any such village or incorporated town that, before January 1, 1942, has adopted a 2 year term for village clerk shall continue to elect a village clerk for a term of 2 years. *Id.*
- 22) Incorporated town officers. For the general municipal election to be held in the year 1985 *in every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more* by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk *shall certify* the names of the candidates to the proper election authority as provided by the general election law. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-95)
- 23) A president, a *clerk*, an assessor, a *collector*, and a *supervisor* shall be elected for a term of 4 years and until their successors are elected and have qualified. *Id.*

- 24) A home rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office *only as* approved by referendum *or* as otherwise authorized by law. (See Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, § 6(f))
- 25) Although they have been granted extensive powers with respect to their local government and affairs (Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, 6(a)), home rule municipalities may change their manner of selecting officers only: (1) as provided by statute; or (2) as approved by a referendum. (Emphasis Added) (2005 Ill. Atty. Gen. Op. 007 (Ill.A.G.))
- 26) The constitutional mandate requires that changes in the manner of selecting officers of a home rule municipality or their terms are reserved to the voters by article VII, section 6(f), and can be effected only by referendum unless otherwise authorized by legislative enactment. *Leck v. Michaelson*, 111 Ill.2d 523, 491 N.E.2d 414, 96 Ill.Dec. 368.
- 27) The primary objective of statutory construction is to ascertain and give effect to the legislature's intent. *Evans v. Cook County State's Attorney*, 2021 IL 125513, ¶ 27, 451 Ill.Dec. 353, 183 N.E.3d 810.
- 28) The most reliable indicator of legislative intent is the language of the statute, given its plain and ordinary meaning. *People v. Caster*, 2020 IL 125117, ¶ 24, 450 Ill.Dec. 415, 181 N.E.3d 767.
- 29) When statutory language is plain and unambiguous, the statute must be applied as written without resort to aids of statutory construction. *People v. Howard*, 228 Ill. 2d 428, 438, 320 Ill.Dec. 868, 888 N.E.2d 85 (2008).
- 30) We may not depart from a statute's plain language by reading in exceptions, limitations, or conditions the legislature did not express. *People v. Lewis*, 223 Ill. 2d 393, 402, 307 Ill.Dec. 645, 860 N.E.2d 299 (2006).

31) Courts should not attempt to read a statute other than in the manner it was written. *Rosewood Care Center, Inc. v. Caterpillar, Inc.*, 226 Ill. 2d 559, 567, 315 Ill.Dec. 762, 877 N.E.2d 1091 (2007).

ARGUMENT

- 32) There are only two incorporated towns in the State of Illinois with a population over 25,000.
- 33) These two towns are Normal and Cicero.
- 34) Upon information and belief, when the controlling statutory provisions referenced above were adopted around 1985, Normal and Cicero were then also the only two incorporated towns in Illinois with a population in excess of 25,000.
- 35) The statute is plain and unambiguous when it states *every* incorporated town with a population over 25,000 shall elect for a four year term, *inter alia*, a clerk, collector, and supervisor.
- 36) As for Town Clerk, Illinois law does allow for the appointment of a town clerk by an incorporated town only if its population is under 5,000.
- 37) The statute is plain and unambiguous in that the city clerk shall certify the names for candidates of these offices.
- 38) The Objectors argue the Town of Normal election code does not provide for the offices of collector or supervisor.
- 39) The Objectors argue the Town of Normal election code fills the office of town clerk by appointment.
- 40) This question of law which controls the outcome of this matter is quite simply whether the Town of Normal can by local municipal action, and not by referendum, decide which offices are held in the town, and the manner for which these offices are filled.

- 41) The Objectors argue Illinois law which compels the election of these town offices only applies to the Town of Cicero.
- 42) The statute which compels the city clerk of the certify the names of the Candidates for these office is plain and unambiguous.
- 43) The statute which demands the Town of Normal to provide for the elected offices of, *inter alia*, clerk, collector, and supervisor is plain and unambiguous.
- 44) Illinois law commands that when statutory language is plain and unambiguous, the statute must be applied as written without resort to aids of statutory construction.
- 45) As a home rule municipality, the Town of Normal cannot alter the manner of selecting a town clerk except by referendum.
- 46) As a home rule municipality, the Town of Normal cannot choose willfully disregard providing for the offices of Supervisor or Town Collector except by referendum.
- 47) These referendums have never occurred which means state statute controls the requirement for these offices and their manner of selection.
- 48) To the extent the Town of Normal has chosen to appoint their town clerk, this local government action is void as it is in violation of state law.
- 49) To the extent the Town of Normal has chosen to not provide for a Supervisor or Town Collector, this local government action is void as it is in violation of state law.
- 50) The current town clerk is mandated by state law to certify the nominating papers of the Town Clerk, Town Collector and Supervisor as state law commands it.
- 51) It would be reversible error for this Board to conclude any local government action, which was not authorized by referendum, can supersede Illinois law.
- 52) The Illinois Constitution, as interpreted by Illinois case law, and former Illinois Attorney General compels this Board to deny the objections of the Objectors.

- 53) Any attempt to construe the plain and unambiguous state law on this topic in a self-serving manner to coincide with the Town of Normal's ultra vires conduct would be reversible error.
- 54) Suggesting statutory construction results in a conclusion that somehow the relevant state law only applies to the Town of Cicero would also be reversible error as the statute is crystal clear that it applies to *every* incorporated towns over 25,000.
- 55) There are only two of such towns and the legislature assuredly understood that.
- 56) If the legislature had intended the relevant statute to apply only to the Town of Cicero, they would have clearly said so.

SUMMARY

This is not the first time a local municipality due to inadvertence, or ignorance, was failing to comply with a clear statutory obligation placed upon them by the Illinois legislature. The Objectors admit the Town of Normal is an Incorporated Town. It is also a home rule municipality. These facts are not in dispute. As a home rule municipality, it may by referendum alter the manner of selection of its officers. It has never conducted such a referendum on the offices of Town Clerk, Town Collector and Supervisor. As such, it must select those offices as prescribed by state law. The state law is plain and unambiguous. The state law commands the current town clerk to certify for the ballot the Candidates names for these offices. The Town of Normal had no authority to disregard or alter the state law in this regard absent referendum of the people of the Town of Normal. While one Objector proclaims this will lead to an absurd result is of no legal consequence. While an alleged absurdity is of no legal consequence given the plain and unambiguous reading of the statute, the practical complexity of what the Town of Normal is now facing is a result of their having violated state law for decades.

This Board is not the council of the Town of Normal. This Board is charged with

upholding the election code of the State of Illinois and the Town of Normal. To the extent state law and local law conflict, this Board must decide which law controls. Before addressing this issue, the Candidates question the ability of this Board to be fair and impartial given their attorney, Mr. Michael Kasper, has already stated the Town of Normal has concluded their nominating papers to be invalid due to their opinion that local law controls. As stated above, even though its members overlap, this Board is independent of the town council, and has a legal obligation to challenge the lawfulness of the towns code. In front of this Board is a state statute which commands the nominating papers of the Candidates be certified. Any local election provisions adopted only by an act of its council, which might contradict or are inconsistent with, the state statute are void. Only a referendum adopted by the people of the Town of Normal could supersede the state law on this topic. The nominating papers of the three Candidates are in conformity with the controlling law, of which this Board is bound, and as such their names must be certified by the current town clerk and their names placed on the ballot. Any other decision would be reversible error.

VERIFIED COMPLAINT FOR MANDAMUS

NOW COMES, Petitioner, Robert Shoraga, (hereinafter referred to as "Candidate") by and through his attorneys Thomas G. DeVore, and the Silver Lake Group, Ltd., and for his Verified Complaint Mandamus and Injunctive Relief against Respondents, Town of Normal (hereinafter referred to as the "Town") and Angie Huonker (hereinafter referred to as "Huonker"), (collectively both shall be hereinafter referred to as the "Defendants") and hereby alleges as follows:

PARTY PLAINTIFFS

1. The Candidate is a resident of the Incorporated Town of Normal.

PARTY DEFENDANTS

2. The Town is a body politic and has only those powers as provided to them by the Illinois Constitution and the Illinois legislature.
3. Huonker is currently the appointed clerk of the Town.

RELEVANT LEGAL FRAMEWORK

4. Mandamus is a proper remedy to compel a board or officer to perform a ministerial act where he is under a clear legal duty to do so. *People v. Knopf*, 198 Ill. 340, 64 N. E. 842, 1127.

5. The Illinois Supreme Court explained that the responsibility for determining whether an election petition apparently conforms to the law rests with the town clerk. *People ex rel. Giese et al. v. Dillon, Town Clerk*, 266 Ill. 272, 107 N.E. 583.
6. Specifically, the clerk's duty is "to determine whether, upon the face of the petition, it is in compliance with the law. *Id.*"
7. If the petition on its face appears to comply with the statutory requisites, the clerk may not look outside the petition to determine whether in fact it does comply; he must submit the question to the voters. *Id.* (Emphasis Added)
8. The Election Code states that all nominating papers, "*being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act*," are deemed valid unless they are subject to a duly filed objection. (Emphasis added.) 10 ILCS 5/10-8 (West 1996).
9. Incorporated town officers. For the general municipal election to be held in the year 1985 *in every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more* by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk *shall certify* the names of the candidates to the proper election authority *as provided by the general election law*. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-95)
10. A president, a *clerk*, an assessor, a *collector*, and a *supervisor* shall be elected for a term of 4 years and until their successors are elected and have qualified. *Id.*
11. A home rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office *only as* approved by referendum *or* as otherwise authorized by law. (See Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, § 6(f))

FACTUAL BASIS

19. The Candidate filed his nominating papers for the elected office of town supervisor. (See attached Exhibit A)
20. The nominating papers were filed timely on November 28, 2022.
21. On or about December 02, 2022, the Town, through their counsel, sent a letter to the Candidate proclaiming his nominating papers lacked apparent conformity with the legal requirements and as such refused to certify the Candidates nominating papers to the election authorities. (See attached Exhibit B)
22. In the Town's correspondence it stated that given the Town has chosen in its local municipal code to not provide for a town supervisor, that the nominating papers lacked apparent conformity with legal requirements. (See attached relevant provisions of the Town code as Exhibit C) ¹
23. Notwithstanding this letter from the Town on December 02, 2022, on December 05, 2022, two residents of the Town filed objections to the nominating papers of the Candidate. (See attached Exhibit D) ²
24. Notwithstanding the Town, and or Huonker, had deemed the nominating petition lacking apparent conformity, the Town's board of elections was convened on December 09, 2022 to consider the objections filed.
25. The Candidate filed his response to the objections with the election board. (See Exhibit E)
26. On or about December 27, 2022, counsel for the Town advised the Town would not be proceeding with the objections filed with the board of elections and was going to instead rely

¹ The election code states the clerk shall certify if the nominating papers conform to the Act. The Act being the election code. There is no facially deficient defect in the nominating papers as required by the Act. The nominating papers comply with all requirements of the Act. The clerk and the Town are arbitrarily disregarding compulsory state law by proclaiming they local election code supersedes the state law.

² The Court will see the objections filed by the two unrelated objectors are identical. Upon information and belief, these objections were drafted by counsel for the Town in an effort to create the appearance citizen objectors.

on the Towns December 02, 2022 letter that the nominating papers were not in apparent conformity with the legal requirements.

27. In essence, the Town is taking the position that the objections filed were moot given the Town had concluded the nominating papers were not in apparent conformity with the Town election code. (See Exhibit F)

28. Given the Town has refused to resolve this matter with the local election board, the Candidate was left with no choice but to seek relief directly from the Court.

29. The Town must certify the Candidates name to the county officials before January 26, 2023. (See correspondence from county clerk attached as Exhibit G)

COUNT I
§ MANDAMUS

30. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 29 as if each had been specifically plead herein.

31. The Candidate has a right to have his name placed on the ballot for the elected office of town supervisor.

32. Huonker has a mandatory duty to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate if the nominating papers comply with the Illinois Election Code.

33. The nominating papers of the Candidate on their face comply with the Election Code.

34. Nothing on the face of the nominating papers was facially deficient and the Town has failed to point to any facial deficiencies of the requirements of the Election Code.

35. While two objectors filed objections the Town concluded these objections were rendered moot given its earlier determination that certification of the nominating papers was unnecessary given their lack of conformity to the local municipal code. ³

³ The objections filed by the two citizens are identical legal arguments made by the Town in the letter sent to the Candidate on December 02. As previously stated, upon information and belief, the Town counsel drafted these

36. The Election Code is clear in that all nominating papers, "*being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act*" are deemed valid unless they are subject to a duly filed objection.
37. Furthermore, beginning in 1985, every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk shall certify the names of the candidates to the proper election authority as provided by the general election law.⁴
38. When this law was passed in Illinois, only two towns, being Cicero and Normal, had a population over 25,000.
39. The statute says every incorporated town which clearly meant both of them.
40. The statute is clear and unambiguous and can be construed no other way that to demand the Town comply and elect this office.
41. The town of Cicero is in full compliance with the state statute and elects this office.
42. There is no legal basis for which the Town, and/or Huonker, can blatantly disregard state law and arbitrarily and capriciously refuse to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate that are in compliance with the Illinois Election Code for an elected office which is mandated upon the Town by state law.
43. The Town, and/or Huonker have no discretion to refuse to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate.
44. The Candidate has a clear right to be named on the ballot as his nominating papers comply

with the Illinois Election Code for an office that is mandated by state law upon the Town.

WHEREFORE, the Candidate herein request that this court enter an Order:

- A. Finding the Candidate presented nominating papers as required by the Illinois Election Code;
- B. Finding that the Town, and/or Huonker, has a non-discretionary duty to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate;
- C. Finding the local municipal code is superseded by state law;

**Re: Nomination Papers for the office of Normal Town Supervisor in the 2023
Municipal Election**

Dear Mr. Shoraga:

I have been retained by the Town of Normal regarding the 2023 Municipal Election. You have filed nomination papers with the Town Clerk that seek to nominate you as a candidate for election to the office of Town Supervisor in the 2023 Election. Section 10-8 of the Illinois Election Code provides that: "certificates of nomination and nomination papers, and petitions to submit public questions to a referendum, being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act, shall be deemed to be valid..." 10 ILCS 5/10-8. Accordingly, the Town has an affirmative duty to determine if nomination papers filed with it are "in apparent conformity" with the provisions of the Election Code.

Pursuant to Chapter 2, Section 2.1-1 of the Normal Town Code, the offices of Town President, and Members of the Board of Trustees are elected municipal offices. The Code makes no provision for election of a "Town Supervisor." The only municipal offices to be contested at the 2023 Municipal Election, pursuant to Chapter 2, Section 2.2-1 of the Code, are three trustee positions. Accordingly, the nomination papers seeking to nominate you for the office of Town Supervisor are not in apparent conformity with legal requirements.

As a result of this lack of apparent conformity with legal requirements, the Town cannot certify your name to the County Clerk for inclusion on the 2023 municipal ballot for election to an office that is not an elective office under the Town Code, and your name will not appear on the ballot.

EXHIBIT B

CHAPTER 2 - OFFICERS, ELECTED AND APPOINTED

DIVISION 1 - PRESIDENT

SEC. 2.1-1 ELECTION - TERM OF OFFICE. The Town President shall be elected for a term of four (4) years and he shall be the President of the Board of Trustees, as provided by Statute. The inauguration of any newly elected President shall take place at the first regular meeting of the corporate authorities in the month of May following such election. (Amended 3/1/93 by Ord. No. 4115)

SEC. 2.1-2 DUTIES. He shall be the chief executive officer of the Town and shall perform all such duties as may be required by him by Statute or Ordinance. He shall have the power and authority to inspect all books and records kept by any Town officer or employees at any reasonable time.

SEC. 2.1-2.5 COMPENSATION. The President shall receive a salary in an amount fixed from time to time by ordinance. Beginning on December 1, 2018, the salary for the President is as follows:

- A. For each term of office beginning before the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$18,000 per year, payable monthly while in office.
- B. For each term of office beginning after the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$32,000 per year, payable monthly while in office.

SEC. 2.1-3. If the President is unable to perform the duties of the office through either death, absence from the Town for physical or mental disability for such a length of time or of such severity as would reasonably require the appointment of a fully empowered replacement, the Board of Trustees may elect one of its members President pro tem. The President pro tem shall have all the powers, duties, responsibilities and authority of the President. (Amended 12/1/75)

SEC. 2.1-4 NOTE. The President and Board of Trustees at times are referred to in this Code as the Town Board, the Town Council, the Board, the Council, the Corporate Authority, or other comparable language. In such situations or cases, no distinction or differentiation is intended. (Amended 12/1/75)

DIVISION 2 - BOARD OF TRUSTEES

SEC. 2.2-1 ELECTION. The Trustees shall be elected in accordance with SEC. 1.1-1 of this Code and the Statutes made and provided therefore. The inauguration of any newly elected Trustee shall take place at the first regular meeting of the corporate authorities in the month of May following such election. (Amended 3/1/93 by Ord. No. 4115)

SEC. 2.2-2 COMPENSATION. Each member of the Board of Trustees shall receive a salary in an amount fixed from time to time by ordinance. Beginning on December 1, 2018, the salary for each member of the Board of Trustees is as follows:

- A. For each term of office beginning before the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$4,800 per year, payable monthly while the Trustee is in office.
- B. For each term of office beginning after the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$6,800 per year, payable monthly while the Trustee is in office.

(Amended 10/15/73)(Renumbered 12/1/76)(Amended 6/21/76)(Amended 2/7/77)(Amended 2/2/81)(Amended 4/20/81 - Eff. May, 1985)(Amended 2/15/88)(Entire Section Amended 12/17/11 by Ord. No. 5772).

DIVISION 3 - APPOINTED OFFICERS

SEC. 2.3-1 APPOINTMENT. At the second regular meeting of the Town Council held in the month of March of each year, or as soon thereafter as convenient, the Town Council, with the President of the Town, shall jointly make the appointment of all appointive members of Boards and Commissions as required by State Statute and as provided for in this Code. Those officers holding present appointments, and all those hereafter appointed, shall have their appointments automatically renewed each March without further action of the Town Council, unless the party or parties in question, or the Town Council, shall terminate said employment.

All appointive officers of the Town shall serve for a term of one year commencing with the fiscal year of April 1 following the time of appointment as hereinbefore set out or until their successors are appointed and qualified provided, they may be removed from office for any good cause shown. In the case of a vacancy in any of said appointive officers for any cause, an officer shall, as soon as possible, be appointed in the same manner to serve for the remainder of the unexpired fiscal year. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-2 BOND. Before entering upon his duties of office, each officer appointed shall execute a bond in the amount hereinafter provided conditioned upon the faithful performance of the duties of his respective office and with sureties to be approved by the Town Council.

SEC. 2.3-3

SEC. 2.3-3 COMPENSATION. All officers appointed under this Code shall receive such compensation as the Board of Trustees and the President of the Town jointly shall fix from time to time by ordinance or resolution. All officers and assistants heretofore appointed shall serve and retain their same powers, duties and salary until April 1, 1969, or until their successors are appointed and qualified.

SEC. 2.3-4 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - OFFICE CREATED. The office of Municipal Manager is hereby created.

SEC. 2.3-5 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - APPOINTMENT. The Town Council shall appoint a Municipal Manager, who shall be the administrative head of the Municipal Government of the Town of Normal and who shall be responsible for the efficient administration of all departments. He shall be appointed without regard to his political beliefs and need not be a resident of the Town of Normal when appointed. The Municipal Manager shall be appointed for an indefinite term. In the case of the absence or disability of the Manager, the Town Council may designate a qualified administrative officer of the Town of Normal to perform the duties of the Manager during such absence or disability.

SEC. 2.3-6 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - REMOVAL FROM OFFICE. A Manager may at any time be removed from office by a majority vote of the members of the Town Council.

SEC. 2.3-7 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - DUTIES AND POWERS. The powers and duties of the Municipal Manager shall be:

- A. To enforce the laws and ordinances within the Town.
- B. To appoint and remove all directors of departments. No appointment shall be made upon any basis other than that of merit and fitness.
- C. To exercise control of all departments and division thereof created by said Article V of the Revised Cities and Villages Act of Illinois and by any ordinances of the Town and by this ordinance and all amendments thereto.
- D. To have all the powers and exercise all the duties granted by Statute to municipal clerks and comptrollers with respect to the preparation of the report of estimated funds necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the fiscal year for the consideration of the corporate authorities prior to the preparation of the annual appropriation ordinance.
- E. To attend all meetings of the Council with the right to take part in the discussions; but with no right to vote.
- F. To recommend to the Council for adoption such measure as he may deem necessary or expedient.
- G. To see that all terms and conditions imposed in favor of the Town or its inhabitants and any contract or public utility franchise are faithfully kept and performed.

SEC. 2.3-7(Cont.1)

- H. To make in the ordinary course of business all purchases of materials, services and supplies necessary for the Town, as provided for in the Annual Budget and as provided in the Town's Purchasing Manual. (Amended 6/3/74)(Amended 11/21/77)(Amended 10/19/87)(Amended 4/6/98)
- I. To have and exercise the power, authority, and duty of any director of a department or division thereof prescribed by this ordinance or any amendment thereof during the time when the office of any such director shall be vacant or no person shall have been appointed thereto.
- J. To prepare such regular and special reports as are necessary for the efficient operation of the Town government, including an agenda for each Council meeting whether such meeting be regular or special, and such agenda to be prepared and distributed in advance of said meeting to all necessary parties.
- K. To conduct and prepare the necessary studies and/or research to help the Council make its policy decisions.
- L. To prepare an annual budget for the presentation and adoption by the Council, and shall further work with the City Officials in helping to prepare information for the necessary appropriation and levy ordinances.
- M. To assume and do all other duties as specifically delegated and assigned to him by said Council.
- N. To prepare and submit to the Town Council, at monthly intervals, reports which will advise said Council of the financial condition and future needs of the Town, and in so doing he may make such other recommendations as he may deem desirable.
- O. To recommend to the Council a standard schedule of pay for each appointive office.
- P. To recommend to the governing body from time to time adoption of such measures as he may deem necessary or expedient for the health, welfare, or safety of the citizenry or for the future improvement of the administrative services.
- Q. To prescribe rules and regulations for the conduct of the various departments of the Town and divisions thereunder.
- R. To perform such other duties as may be prescribed by said Article V of the Revised Cities and Villages Act of Illinois by this ordinance or any ordinance or resolution of the Town Council.
- S. To authorize a change or changes in any contract with the Town provided a written determination is made that:

1. The circumstances said to necessitate the change(s) in performance were not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed;
2. Were not within the contemplation of the contract as signed; or
3. Are in the best interest of the Town. The City Manager shall promptly report to the Council all change orders which authorize or necessitate an increase or decrease in either the cost of a contract by ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or more or the time of completion by thirty (30) days or more.
(Added 7/3/89)

SEC. 2.3-8 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - SALARY. Compensation of the Municipal Manager shall be as determined by the Town Council.

SEC. 2.3-9 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - VACATION AND EMPLOYMENT RESTRICTIONS. The Municipal Manager shall be subject to the vacation schedule as authorized by the City Council, but not less than the provisions in existence in the Personnel Code for all other Town employees. He shall, likewise, be subject to the same sickness and disability provisions as other Town employees. He shall devote his entire time to the discharge of his official duties.
(Amended 7/16/73)

SEC. 2.3-10 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS. The Municipal Manager shall be paid for the use of his own private vehicle when used exclusively for Town business at the per mile rate established by the Town Council for compensated travel by other Town officials and/or employees, and he shall keep accurate records of same which shall be subject to Council approval prior to payment or the Town may provide a vehicle to be used by the City Manager for Town business. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-11 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - BOND. The Manager shall furnish a surety bond in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or such additional sum as may be established by the Town Council, which bond shall be approved by said Council. Said bond to be conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties as such Municipal Manager, and the premium on the bond shall be paid by the Town.

SEC. 2.3-12 EXECUTIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE POWERS AND DUTIES. The executive and administrative powers and duties of the Town shall be distributed and exercised through the departments and divisions thereof as provided by the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal of 1969 and as created and ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the Town Council and by reference hereto are made a part hereof as if the same were stated herein.

SEC. 2.3-13 APPOINTIVE OFFICERS - POWERS, DUTIES AND SALARIES. The powers, duties, and salaries of an appointive officer and employee shall be in accordance with the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal of 1969 and in accordance with ordinances passed and approved by the Town Council and are by reference made a part hereof as if the same were stated herein.

SEC. 2.3-14 AUDIT. At the close of each fiscal year the Town Council shall cause an independent audit of all accounts of the Town of Normal to be made by an accountant or accountants authorized to practice accounting under the laws of the State of Illinois.

SEC. 2.3-15 CITY MANAGER - FINALITY OF ACTION. All acts and things done by the City Manager pursuant to this Code shall, unless otherwise especially provided, be final and conclusive unless and until superseded by action of the President and/or Board of Trustees. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-16 DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Parks and Recreation, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-17 DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Director of Parks and Recreation to see to the overall administration of the recreation program of the Town, to be in charge of all parklands, to be the supervisor of all buildings and/or equipment belonging to said Town's Parks and Recreation Department and in general to be the chief administrative officer of the Town for said Department. He shall answer solely to the City Manager or the Town Council, as the case might be, and he shall have sole jurisdiction over the issuance of permits for the use of the Town's park facilities. His salary shall be as established by resolution of the Town Council and subject to the same controls as those affecting the other department heads.

SEC. 2.3-18 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Building Commissioner, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-19 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Building Commissioner to see to the enforcement of all ordinance provisions relating to buildings and zoning and to inspect all buildings or structures being erected or altered, as frequently as may be necessary to insure compliance with the Town ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-20 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - STOP ORDER. The Building Commissioner shall have the power to order all work stopped on construction or alteration or repair of buildings in the Town, when such work is being done in violation of any provisions of an ordinance relating thereto, or in violation of the zoning ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such order, except on the written permission of the Commissioner, provided that if the stop order is an oral one, it shall be followed by a written stop order within an hour. Such written stop order may be served by a policeman. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-21 BUILDING INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating any order of the Building Inspector shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00 for each day on which any work in violation of such stop order is done.

SEC. 2.3-22 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Plumbing Inspector, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-23 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Plumbing Inspector to see to the enforcement of all provisions of the ordinances relating to plumbing and plumbing equipment; and to make such inspections and perform such tests as may be necessary in the enforcement of such ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-24 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - STOP ORDER. The Plumbing Inspector shall have the power to order work stopped on the construction, alteration or repair of plumbing equipment when such work is being done in violation of any ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such a stop order except on written permission of the Plumbing Inspector; provided that if the stop order is an oral one it shall be followed by a written stop order within one hour. Such written stop order may be served by any policeman.

SEC. 2.3-25 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, or corporation violating or failing to comply with any of the terms and requirements of this article shall be fined a sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00, or be imprisoned for not to exceed six (6) months or both such fine and such imprisonment. Each day that any such violation or failure continues shall be considered as a separate and distinct offense and shall be publishable as such.

SEC. 2.3-26 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Director of Public Works, being a continuation of the former office of Superintendent of Public Works. The Director shall be appointed by the City Manager. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-27 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - DUTIES. The Director of Public Works is responsible for the organizing, directing and coordinating the activities of several divisions comprising the Public Works Department including municipal engineer, problems relating to the design, construction, and maintenance of streets, sewers, and other public works structures, the cleaning of streets, the collection and disposal of refuse and garbage and the maintenance of mechanical equipment and building. (Amended 3/7/72)(Amended 4/18/88)

SEC. 2.3-28 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - MOTOR FUEL TAX. All repairs, construction or reconstruction of any and all streets and of all adjuncts and appurtenances thereto which may be paid in whole or in part out of money received by the Town from the State of Illinois as its share of Motor Fuel Tax shall be under the control of the Director of Public Works. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-29 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Electrical Inspector, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-30 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Electrical Inspector to see to the enforcement of all provisions of the ordinances relating to electrical installations and electrical equipment and to make such inspections and perform such tests as may be necessary in the enforcement of such ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-31 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - STOP ORDER. The Electrical Inspector shall have the power to order work stopped on the construction, alteration or repair of electrical equipment or installations when such work is being done in violation of any ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such a stop order except on written permission of the Electrical Inspector; provided that if the stop order is an oral one it shall be followed by a written stop order within one hour. Such written stop order may be served by any policeman.

SEC. 2.3-32 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating or failing to comply with any of the terms and requirements of this article shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00, or be imprisoned for not to exceed six (6) months or both such fine and such imprisonment. Each day that any such violation or failure continues shall be considered as a separate and distinct offense and shall be punishable as such.

SEC. 2.3-33 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - COMPOSITION AND QUALIFICATION. All of the legal activities of the Town government are assigned to the Law Department of said Town. The Legal Department shall consist of a licensed attorney at law to be known as the Corporation Counsel. The Corporation Counsel shall be the responsible head of the Legal Department with the full authority to direct the carrying on of its activities. He shall be appointed by the City Manager, and his activities shall be authorized and supervised by the City Manager.

The Corporation Counsel shall at the time of his appointment be a practicing member of the Bar of McLean County, Illinois, and be of good standing therein and otherwise qualified by law to serve as legal officer of the Town. He shall devote such of his time and energies to the discharge of his official duties as such duties may from time to time be required. The Corporation Counsel shall be required upon conclusion of his terms of office to turn over official Town files and records to his successor in office. (Amended 1/5/73)(Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-34 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - SUITS AND ACTIONS. The Corporation Counsel shall prosecute or defend any and all suits or actions at law or equity to which the Town may be a party, or in which it may be interested, or which may be brought against, or by, any officer of the Town on behalf of the Town or in the capacity of such person as an officer of the Town. (Amended 3/5/80)

The Corporation Counsel may, with the approval of the City Manager, employ outside legal counsel to attend to the legal affairs of the Town in the event that attorneys within the Legal Department are unable to attend to such affairs due to a specialized nature of the legal matter, when a hearing officer or attorney is required and attorneys in the department have a conflict, or when otherwise authorized by the City Manager.

In the event the outside counsel is representing the Town, the City Manager is authorized, on behalf of the Town, to waive such matters as necessary to enable such outside counsel to

represent other clients doing business or otherwise interacting with the Town on matters unrelated to the outside counsel's representation of the Town.

(Entire Division Amended 5/21/07 by Ord. No. 5136)

SEC. 2.3-35 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - ADVICE. The Corporation Counsel shall be the legal advisor to the Town and shall render advice on all legal questions affecting the Town whenever requested to do so by any Town official. Upon request by the President, or the Town Council, he shall reduce any such opinion to writing.

The Corporation Counsel shall

1. advise and assist in the drafting of all Town ordinances, order, regulations, and contracts to which the Town is expected to become a party;
2. approve all ordinances as to form before the same are submitted to the Town Council;
3. approve all contracts before the same are signed by the proper officials;
4. be responsible for the handling of any and all legal affairs of the Town and;
5. be responsible for the prosecution of violations of Town ordinances before Courts having jurisdiction to try such offenses and in addition, shall have such other duties as may be assigned to him, provided that outside counsel may be hired with Council approval for special projects. (Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-36 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - JUDGMENTS. It shall be the duty of the Corporation Counsel to see to the full enforcement of all judgments or decrees rendered or entered in favor of the Town and of all similar interlocutory orders. (Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-37 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - COMPENSATION. The City Attorney shall receive such annual salary as is provided by ordinance and the same shall apply to the Assistant City Attorney. Additional compensation shall be paid for the usual services in the issuance and sale of municipal securities, being bond issues, of either revenue or general obligation forms; for obtaining of easements for the acquisition of property; and all matters pertaining to special assessments. Expenses incurred for travel and similar incidental expenses applicable to the business of the Town shall be reimbursed.

SEC. 2.3-38 TOWN CLERK - OFFICE CREATED. The office of the Town Clerk, heretofore established by Ordinance as an appointive office, is hereby retained. The Clerk shall be appointed by the City Manager, and receive such compensation as may be provided by Ordinance.

SEC. 2.3-39 TOWN CLERK - DUTIES. The Town Clerk shall be the recording officer of the municipality and have custody of all documents, books, records and papers pertaining to the Town or departments thereof, not specifically assigned to some other officer or department and shall be the keeper of the official seal of said Town. The Clerk must attend all meetings of the Town

Council, or Board, and keep the records of the proceedings thereof, and where required, to see to the publication of all ordinances, resolutions and notices requiring same. The Town Clerk shall be immediately in charge of the Deputy Clerk and shall be responsible for his acts. The Clerk shall furnish to the various departments of the State of Illinois all records and data so required or directed by Statute to be furnished. The Clerk of said Town shall keep the Town offices open during such hours as may be directed by the Town Council. All documents filed with the Clerk may be evidenced by certified copies and the passage and publication of ordinances and notices may be proved by such certificate. Said Clerk shall perform all duties prescribed by the Town Council of said Town or by law or ordinance, under the supervision of the City Manager. The Clerk shall not, however, be responsible for preparation of a report of estimated funds necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the fiscal year for the consideration of the Board of Trustees prior to the preparation of the Annual Budget or Appropriation Ordinance. (Amended 4/3/72)(Amended 11/15/76)

SEC. 2.3-40 TOWN CLERK - INDICES. The Town Clerk shall keep and maintain a proper index to all documents and records kept by him so that ready access thereto and use thereof may be had.

SEC. 2.3-41 TOWN CLERK - VACANCY. In case the office of Town Clerk shall become vacant for any reason, the City Manager shall appoint a successor. (Amended 4/3/72)(Amended 11/15/76)

SEC. 2.3-42 TOWN TREASURER - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Town Treasurer. The Town Treasurer shall be appointed by the City Manager and shall receive such compensation as may be provided by ordinance. (Amended 12/3/73)

SEC. 2.3-43 TOWN TREASURER - EX OFFICIO COLLECTOR. The Town Treasurer shall be ex officio collector and shall perform all duties of that office.

SEC. 2.3-44 TOWN TREASURER - GENERAL DUTIES. The Town Treasurer shall perform such duties as may be prescribed for him by Statute or ordinance, and shall perform such other duties and functions as assigned by him by the Town Council or the City Manager. It shall be the duty of the Town Treasurer to see to the accounting, bookkeeping and collection of funds; to make preparations for the disbursing of revenue; to receive all money paid in to the Town, whether directed from the person paying the money or from the hands of such other officer or employee as may receive it; to pay out money only on vouchers or orders properly signed by the President and Town Clerk; to supply the Town Clerk and the Town Council and all other officers of said Town all data pertaining to the Town's finances when so requested; to be responsible for the maintenance of records of the Water and Sewer Department and to be responsible for the preparation and collection of water and sewer charges. The Town Treasurer shall not retain any fees or other stipends received from the performance of his duties, but the same shall become the property of the Town.

SEC. 2.3-45 TOWN TREASURER - DEPOSIT OF FUNDS IN DESIGNATED DEPOSITORIES. The following financial institutions are designated depositories of and for the Town of Normal Funds:

Depositories herein designated shall, at all times, comply with the laws of the State of Illinois with reference to the requirements of depositories and shall promptly furnish such statements to the Town of Normal as are required by State Law. (Amended 3/7/72)(Amended 8/7/78)

SEC. 2.3-46 TOWN TREASURER - RECORDS. He shall keep records showing all money received by him, showing the source from which it is received and purpose for which it is paid and he shall keep records at all times showing the financial status of the Town.

SEC. 2.3-47 TOWN TREASURER - ACCOUNTING. The Treasurer shall keep such books and accounts as may be required by statute or ordinance, and he shall keep them in the manner required by the Board of Trustees.

SEC. 2.3-48 TOWN TREASURER - SPECIAL ASSESSMENT FUND. All moneys received on any special assessment shall be held by the Treasurer as a special fund to be applied only to the improvement, or bonds and vouchers issued therefore, together with interest thereon, for which the assessment was made and said money shall be used for no other purpose, unless to reimburse the Town for money expended for such improvements. Payment on bonds or vouchers shall be in accordance with the statutes and the laws and the Treasurer shall keep his books and accounts in such a manner so that proper appropriation in payments in principal and interest can be made and ascertained.

SEC. 2.3-49 TOWN TREASURER - WARRANTS AND TRANSFER OF FUNDS. All warrants drawn on the Treasurer must be signed by the President and countersigned by the Clerk, stating the particular fund or appropriation to which the same is chargeable, and the person to

whom payable; and no money shall be otherwise paid except as may be provided by statute. Money shall not be transferred by the Treasurer from one fund to another, after it has been collected or paid, except as may be ordered by the President and Board of Trustees or except in the manner and form prescribed by statutes. The Town Treasurer, or his designated agent, may electronically transfer Town funds either for investment purposes, or for the payment of Town debts, or for any other usual and customary purpose provided such electronic transfer of funds is approved by the Clerk, the Clerk's designee, or President of the Board of Trustees. Such transfer shall be reported monthly to the President and Board of Trustees for authorization or ratification. In the absence of the Clerk or Deputy Clerk, the City Manager or Assistant City Manager may also authorize the electronic transfer of funds. (Amended 2/21/94 by Ord. No. 4208)(Amended 2/16/98 by Ord. No. 4494)(Amended 2/21/05 by Ord. No. 4996)

SEC. 2.3-50 CHIEF OF POLICE - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of the Chief of Police for the Town of Normal, Illinois.

SEC. 2.3-51 CHIEF OF POLICE - APPOINTMENT. The Chief shall be appointed by the City Manager; provided that if the person appointed Chief was at the time of such promotion a member of the Department, he shall retain his status and rank while serving as Chief and shall revert to such status and rank when his term as Chief has ended. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-52 CHIEF OF POLICE - DUTIES. The Chief of Police shall be the keeper of the Town Jail and shall have custody of all persons incarcerated therein. He shall keep such records and make such reports concerning the activities of his department as may be required by statute or by the Town Council. The Chief shall be responsible for the performance by the Police Department of all its functions, and all persons who are members of the Department shall serve subject to the order of the Chief of Police.

SEC. 2.3-53 CHIEF OF POLICE - RULES AND REGULATIONS. The Chief of Police may make or prescribe such rules and regulations not inconsistent with rules and regulations promulgated by the Board of Police and Fire Commissioners as he shall deem advisable; such rules when approved by the Town Council shall be binding upon such members. Such rules and regulations may cover, besides the conduct of the members, uniforms and equipment being worn or carried, hours of service, vacations all other similar matters necessary or desirable for the efficiency of the Department.

SEC. 2.3-54 HEALTH INSPECTOR - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Health Inspector for the Town of Normal. The Chief of Police shall serve as ex officio Health Inspector.

SEC. 2.3-55 HEALTH INSPECTOR - DUTIES. The Health Inspector shall enforce all ordinances containing provisions for the protection of public health; he shall make inspections of food stuffs and of the premises used for storing or selling of food stuffs; he shall enforce all provisions as may be provided by ordinance; he shall perform such other duties and functions as is required by statute or ordinance.

SEC. 2.3-56 HEALTH INSPECTOR - REPORT. The Health Inspector shall make such reports to the Board of Trustees as may be required. He shall also make recommendations for rulings, orders or ordinances respecting the public health whenever he is requested to do so or whenever he deems it advisable or necessary.

SEC. 2.3-57 HEALTH INSPECTOR - COMPENSATION. No additional compensation shall be paid the Chief of Police for his duties as Health Inspector for the Town of Normal.

SEC. 2.3-58 TOWN ENGINEER.

- A. Appointment and qualifications. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore the office of Town Engineer. The Town Engineer shall be appointed by the City Manager and shall be a licensed professional engineer in the State of Illinois.
- B. Duties. The Town Engineer shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for all engineering questions and duties of the Town assigned to him. The Town Engineer shall attend meetings of the corporate authorities and give opinions, verbal and written, when requested. He shall also be the engineer for the Board of Local Improvements and shall attend all meetings of said Board. The Engineer shall be responsible for field inspection for all new construction except as specifically excluded by the Board of Trustees. (SEC. 2.3-58 added 1/2/73)(Renumbering revised 12/3/73)(Amended 2/7/78, Eff. 4/1/78)(Amended 4/18/88)

SEC. 2.3-59 INFORMATION SERVICES.

- A. Appointment. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Information Services, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Illinois law and Town ordinances applicable to the managerial form of government.
- B. Duties. The Director of Information Services shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for information storage, processing, and retrieval as those duties are assigned from time to time by the City Manager. (SEC. 2.3-59 added 3/17/97 by Ord. No. 4445)

SEC. 2.3-60 DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RESOURCES.

- A. Appointment. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Human Resources, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Illinois law and Town ordinances applicable to the managerial form of government.
- B. Duties. The Director of Human Resources shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for providing a comprehensive human resources management system as those duties are assigned and delineated from time to time by the City Manager. (SEC. 2.3-60 added 3/17/97 by Ord. No. 4445)

**CONSOLIDATED RESPONSE OF AMY CONKLIN, CHARLES SILA,
AND ROBERT SHORAGA TO THE OBJECTIONS FILED BY
PATRICK DULLARD AND JEFFREY FRITZEN**

COMES NOW, Candidates Amy Conklin, Charles Sila, and Robert Shoraga (hereinafter referred to as "Candidates"), by and through their attorneys Thomas G. DeVore and the Silver Lake Group Ltd., and hereby files this consolidated response the objections filed by the objectors Patrick Dullard, and Jeffrey Fritzen, (hereinafter referred to as "Objectors"), and hereby pleads:

RELEVANT FACTUAL HISTORY

- 1) The Town of Normal is a home rule municipality.
- 2) The Town of Normal is an unincorporated town.
- 3) The Town of Normal has a population in excess of 25,000 citizens.
- 4) The Town of Normal has never by referendum eliminated the offices of Town Collector or Supervisor.
- 5) The Town of Normal has never by referendum altered the manner of choosing a Town Clerk to be by appointment instead of by election.
- 6) On or about November 28, 2022, Amy Conklin submitted to the Town of Normal her nominating papers for the elected office of Town Clerk.
- 7) On or about November 28, 2022, Charles Sila submitted to the Town of Normal his nominating papers for the elected office of Town Collector.

EXHIBIT E

- 8) On or about November 28, 2022, Robert Shoraga submitted to the Town of Normal his nominating papers for the elected office of Supervisor.
- 9) On or about December 02, 2022, counsel for the Town of Normal sent written notices to each Candidate stating the Town of Normal would not recognize the nominating papers of the Candidates.
- 10) On or about December 05, 2022, the Objectors filed a written objection to Amy Conklin's nominating papers.
- 11) The Objectors written objections to Amy Conklin's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.
- 12) As to Amy Conklin's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for an elected Town Clerk as is prescribes the Town Clerk to be an appointed position.
- 13) The Objectors to Amy Conklin's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.
- 14) The Objectors written objections to Charles Sila's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.
- 15) As to Charles Sila's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for a Town Collector.
- 16) The Objectors to Charles Sila's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.
- 17) The Objectors written objections to Robert Shoraga's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.

- 18) As to Robert Shoraga's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for a Supervisor.
- 19) The Objectors to Robert Shoraga's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.

LEGAL STANDARD

- 20) Any village of fewer than 5,000 inhabitants may, by resolution adopted by not less than two-thirds of the village board, choose to have a clerk appointed by the village president with the concurrence of the village board. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-90)
- 21) Otherwise, at the election for trustees in each village and incorporated town, whether incorporated under a general or special Act (other than a village that was incorporated under a special Act and that adopts Section 3.1-30-25), a clerk of the village or incorporated town *shall be elected* who shall hold office for a term of the same length of time as provided in this Article 3.1 for the mayor in a city, except that any such village or incorporated town that, before January 1, 1942, has adopted a 2 year term for village clerk shall continue to elect a village clerk for a term of 2 years. *Id.*
- 22) Incorporated town officers. For the general municipal election to be held in the year 1985 *in every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more* by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk *shall certify* the names of the candidates to the proper election authority as provided by the general election law. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-95)
- 23) A president, a *clerk*, an assessor, a *collector*, and a *supervisor* shall be elected for a term of 4 years and until their successors are elected and have qualified. *Id.*

- 24) A home rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office *only as* approved by referendum *or* as otherwise authorized by law. (See Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, § 6(f))
- 25) Although they have been granted extensive powers with respect to their local government and affairs (Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, 6(a)), home rule municipalities may change their manner of selecting officers only: (1) as provided by statute; or (2) as approved by a referendum. (Emphasis Added) (2005 Ill. Atty. Gen. Op. 007 (Ill.A.G.))
- 26) The constitutional mandate requires that changes in the manner of selecting officers of a home rule municipality or their terms are reserved to the voters by article VII, section 6(f), and can be effected only by referendum unless otherwise authorized by legislative enactment. *Leck v. Michaelson*, 111 Ill.2d 523, 491 N.E.2d 414, 96 Ill.Dec. 368.
- 27) The primary objective of statutory construction is to ascertain and give effect to the legislature's intent. *Evans v. Cook County State's Attorney*, 2021 IL 125513, ¶ 27, 451 Ill.Dec. 353, 183 N.E.3d 810.
- 28) The most reliable indicator of legislative intent is the language of the statute, given its plain and ordinary meaning. *People v. Casler*, 2020 IL 125117, ¶ 24, 450 Ill.Dec. 415, 181 N.E.3d 767.
- 29) When statutory language is plain and unambiguous, the statute must be applied as written without resort to aids of statutory construction. *People v. Howard*, 228 Ill. 2d 428, 438, 320 Ill.Dec. 868, 888 N.E.2d 85 (2008).
- 30) We may not depart from a statute's plain language by reading in exceptions, limitations, or conditions the legislature did not express. *People v. Lewis*, 223 Ill. 2d 393, 402, 307 Ill.Dec. 645, 860 N.E.2d 299 (2006).

31) Courts should not attempt to read a statute other than in the manner it was written. *Rosewood Care Center, Inc. v. Caterpillar, Inc.*, 226 Ill. 2d 559, 567, 315 Ill.Dec. 762, 877 N.E.2d 1091 (2007).

ARGUMENT

32) There are only two incorporated towns in the State of Illinois with a population over 25,000.

33) These two towns are Normal and Cicero.

34) Upon information and belief, when the controlling statutory provisions referenced above were adopted around 1985, Normal and Cicero were then also the only two incorporated towns in Illinois with a population in excess of 25,000.

35) The statute is plain and unambiguous when it states *every* incorporated town with a population over 25,000 shall elect for a four year term, *inter alia*, a clerk, collector, and supervisor.

36) As for Town Clerk, Illinois law does allow for the appointment of a town clerk by an incorporated town only if its population is under 5,000.

37) The statute is plain and unambiguous in that the city clerk shall certify the names for candidates of these offices.

38) The Objectors argue the Town of Normal election code does not provide for the offices of collector or supervisor.

39) The Objectors argue the Town of Normal election code fills the office of town clerk by appointment.

40) This question of law which controls the outcome of this matter is quite simply whether the Town of Normal can by local municipal action, and not by referendum, decide which offices are held in the town, and the manner for which these offices are filled.

- 41) The Objectors argue Illinois law which compels the election of these town offices only applies to the Town of Cicero.
- 42) The statute which compels the city clerk of the certify the names of the Candidates for these office is plain and unambiguous.
- 43) The statute which demands the Town of Normal to provide for the elected offices of, *inter alia*, clerk, collector, and supervisor is plain and unambiguous.
- 44) Illinois law commands that when statutory language is plain and unambiguous, the statute must be applied as written without resort to aids of statutory construction.
- 45) As a home rule municipality, the Town of Normal cannot alter the manner of selecting a town clerk except by referendum.
- 46) As a home rule municipality, the Town of Normal cannot choose willfully disregard providing for the offices of Supervisor or Town Collector except by referendum.
- 47) These referendums have never occurred which means state statute controls the requirement for these offices and their manner of selection.
- 48) To the extent the Town of Normal has chosen to appoint their town clerk, this local government action is void as it is in violation of state law.
- 49) To the extent the Town of Normal has chosen to not provide for a Supervisor or Town Collector, this local government action is void as it is in violation of state law.
- 50) The current town clerk is mandated by state law to certify the nominating papers of the Town Clerk, Town Collector and Supervisor as state law commands it.
- 51) It would be reversible error for this Board to conclude any local government action, which was not authorized by referendum, can supersede Illinois law.
- 52) The Illinois Constitution, as interpreted by Illinois case law, and former Illinois Attorney General compels this Board to deny the objections of the Objectors.

- 53) Any attempt to construe the plain and unambiguous state law on this topic in a self-serving manner to coincide with the Town of Normal's ultra vires conduct would be reversible error.
- 54) Suggesting statutory construction results in a conclusion that somehow the relevant state law only applies to the Town of Cicero would also be reversible error as the statute is crystal clear that it applies to *every* incorporated towns over 25,000.
- 55) There are only two of such towns and the legislature assuredly understood that.
- 56) If the legislature had intended the relevant statute to apply only to the Town of Cicero, they would have clearly said so.

SUMMARY

This is not the first time a local municipality due to inadvertence, or ignorance, was failing to comply with a clear statutory obligation placed upon them by the Illinois legislature. The Objectors admit the Town of Normal is an Incorporated Town. It is also a home rule municipality. These facts are not in dispute. As a home rule municipality, it may by referendum alter the manner of selection of its officers. It has never conducted such a referendum on the offices of Town Clerk, Town Collector and Supervisor. As such, it must select those offices as prescribed by state law. The state law is plain and unambiguous. The state law commands the current town clerk to certify for the ballot the Candidates names for these offices. The Town of Normal had no authority to disregard or alter the state law in this regard absent referendum of the people of the Town of Normal. While one Objector proclaims this will lead to an absurd result is of no legal consequence. While an alleged absurdity is of no legal consequence given the plain and unambiguous reading of the statute, the practical complexity of what the Town of Normal is now facing is a result of their having violated state law for decades.

This Board is not the council of the Town of Normal. This Board is charged with

upholding the election code of the State of Illinois and the Town of Normal. To the extent state law and local law conflict, this Board must decide which law controls. Before addressing this issue, the Candidates question the ability of this Board to be fair and impartial given their attorney, Mr. Michael Kasper, has already stated the Town of Normal has concluded their nominating papers to be invalid due to their opinion that local law controls. As stated above, even though its members overlap, this Board is independent of the town council, and has a legal obligation to challenge the lawfulness of the towns code. In front of this Board is a state statute which commands the nominating papers of the Candidates be certified. Any local election provisions adopted only by an act of its council, which might contradict or are inconsistent with, the state statute are void. Only a referendum adopted by the people of the Town of Normal could supersede the state law on this topic. The nominating papers of the three Candidates are in conformity with the controlling law, of which this Board is bound, and as such their names must be certified by the current town clerk and their names placed on the ballot. Any other decision would be reversible error.

VERIFIED COMPLAINT FOR MANDAMUS

NOW COMES, Petitioner, Charles Sila, (hereinafter referred to as “Candidate”) by and through his attorneys Thomas G. DeVore, and the Silver Lake Group, Ltd., and for his Verified Complaint Mandamus and Injunctive Relief against Respondents, Town of Normal (hereinafter referred to as the “Town”) and Angie Huonker (hereinafter referred to as “Huonker”), (collectively both shall be hereinafter referred to as the “Defendants”) and hereby alleges as follows:

PARTY PLAINTIFFS

1. The **Candidate** is a resident of the Incorporated Town of Normal.

PARTY DEFENDANTS

2. The Town is a body politic and has only those powers as provided to them by the Illinois Constitution and the Illinois legislature.
3. Huonker is currently the appointed clerk of the Town.

RELEVANT LEGAL FRAMEWORK

4. Mandamus is a proper remedy to compel a board or officer to perform a ministerial act where he is under a clear legal duty to do so. *People v. Knopf*, 198 Ill. 340, 64 N. E. 842, 1127.

5. The Illinois Supreme Court explained that the responsibility for determining whether an election petition apparently conforms to the law rests with the town clerk. *People ex rel. Giese et al. v. Dillon, Town Clerk*, 266 Ill. 272, 107 N.E. 583.
6. Specifically, the clerk's duty is "to determine whether, upon the face of the petition, it is in compliance with the law. *Id.*
7. If the petition on its face appears to comply with the statutory requisites, the clerk may not look outside the petition to determine whether in fact it does comply; he must submit the question to the voters. *Id.* (Emphasis Added)
8. The Election Code states that all nominating papers, "*being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act,*" are deemed valid unless they are subject to a duly filed objection. (Emphasis added.) 10 ILCS 5/10-8 (West 1996).
9. Incorporated town officers. For the general municipal election to be held in the year 1985 *in every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more* by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk *shall certify* the names of the candidates to the proper election authority *as provided by the general election law*. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-95)
10. A president, a *clerk*, an assessor, a *collector*, and a *supervisor* shall be elected for a term of 4 years and until their successors are elected and have qualified. *Id.*
11. A home rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office *only as* approved by referendum *or* as otherwise authorized by law. (See Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, § 6(f))
12. Although they have been granted extensive powers with respect to their local government and affairs (Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, 6(a)), home rule municipalities may change their

- manner of selecting officers only: (1) as provided by statute; or (2) as approved by a referendum. (Emphasis Added) (2005 Ill. Atty. Gen. Op. 007 (Ill.A.G.))
13. The constitutional mandate requires that changes in the manner of selecting officers of a home rule municipality or their terms are reserved to the voters by article VII, section 6(f), and can be effected only by referendum unless otherwise authorized by legislative enactment. *Leck v. Michaelson*, 111 Ill.2d 523, 491 N.E.2d 414, 96 Ill.Dec. 368.
 14. The primary objective of statutory construction is to ascertain and give effect to the legislature's intent. *Evans v. Cook County State's Attorney*, 2021 IL 125513, ¶ 27, 451 Ill.Dec. 353, 183 N.E.3d 810.
 15. The most reliable indicator of legislative intent is the language of the statute, given its plain and ordinary meaning. *People v. Casler*, 2020 IL 125117, ¶ 24, 450 Ill.Dec. 415, 181 N.E.3d 767.
 16. When statutory language is plain and unambiguous, the statute must be applied as written without resort to aids of statutory construction. *People v. Howard*, 228 Ill. 2d 428, 438, 320 Ill.Dec. 868, 888 N.E.2d 85 (2008).
 17. We may not depart from a statute's plain language by reading in exceptions, limitations, or conditions the legislature did not express. *People v. Lewis*, 223 Ill. 2d 393, 402, 307 Ill.Dec. 645, 860 N.E.2d 299 (2006).
 18. Courts should not attempt to read a statute other than in the manner it was written. *Rosewood Care Center, Inc. v. Caterpillar, Inc.*, 226 Ill. 2d 559, 567, 315 Ill.Dec. 762, 877 N.E.2d 1091 (2007)

FACTUAL BASIS

19. The Candidate filed his nominating papers for the elected office of town collector. (See attached Exhibit A)
20. The nominating papers were filed timely on November 28, 2022.
21. On or about December 02, 2022, the Town, through their counsel, sent a letter to the Candidate proclaiming his nominating papers lacked apparent conformity with the legal requirements and as such refused to certify the Candidates nominating papers to the election authorities. (See attached Exhibit B)
22. In the Town's correspondence it stated that given the Town has chosen in its local municipal code to not provide for a town collector, that the nominating papers lacked apparent conformity with legal requirements. (See attached relevant provisions of the Town code as Exhibit C) ¹
23. Notwithstanding this letter from the Town on December 02, 2022, on December 05, 2022, two residents of the Town filed objections to the nominating papers of the Candidate. (See attached Exhibit D) ²
24. Notwithstanding the Town, and or Huonker, had deemed the nominating petition lacking apparent conformity, the Town's board of elections was convened on December 09, 2022 to consider the objections filed.
25. The Candidate filed his response to the objections with the election board. (See Exhibit E)
26. On or about December 27, 2022, counsel for the Town advised the Town would not be proceeding with the objections filed with the board of elections and was going to instead rely

¹ The election code states the clerk shall certify if the nominating papers conform to the Act. The Act being the election code. There is no facially deficient defect in the nominating papers as required by the Act. The nominating papers comply with all requirements of the Act. The clerk and the Town are arbitrarily disregarding compulsory state law by proclaiming they local election code supersedes the state law.

² The Court will see the objections filed by the two unrelated objectors are identical. Upon information and belief, these objections were drafted by counsel for the Town in an effort to create the appearance citizen objectors.

- on the Towns December 02, 2022 letter that the nominating papers were not in apparent conformity with the legal requirements.
27. In essence, the Town is taking the position that the objections filed were moot given the Town had concluded the nominating papers were not in apparent conformity with the Town election code. (See Exhibit F)
28. Given the Town has refused to resolve this matter with the local election board, the Candidate was left with no choice but to seek relief directly from the Court.
29. The Town must certify the Candidates name to the county officials before January 26, 2023.
(See correspondence from county clerk attached as Exhibit G)

COUNT I
MANDAMUS

30. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 29 as if each had been specifically plead herein.
31. The Candidate has a right to have his name placed on the ballot for the elected office of town collector.
32. Huonker has a mandatory duty to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate if the nominating papers comply with the Illinois Election Code.
33. The nominating papers of the Candidate on their face comply with the Election Code.
34. Nothing on the face of the nominating papers was facially deficient and the Town has failed to point to any facial deficiencies of the requirements of the Election Code.
35. While two objectors filed objections the Town concluded these objections were rendered moot given its earlier determination that certification of the nominating papers was unnecessary given their lack of conformity to the local municipal code. ³

³ The objections filed by the two citizens are identical legal arguments made by the Town in the letter sent to the Candidate on December 02. As previously stated, upon information and belief, the Town counsel drafted these

36. The Election Code is clear in that all nominating papers, "*being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act,*" are deemed valid unless they are subject to a duly filed objection.
37. Furthermore, beginning in 1985, every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk shall certify the names of the candidates to the proper election authority as provided by the general election law.⁴
38. When this law was passed in Illinois, only two towns, being Cicero and Normal, had a population over 25,000.
39. The statute says every incorporated town which clearly meant both of them.
40. The statute is clear and unambiguous and can be construed no other way that to demand the Town comply and elect this office.
41. The town of Cicero is in full compliance with the state statute and elects this office.
42. There is no legal basis for which the Town, and/or Huonker, can blatantly disregard state law and arbitrarily and capriciously refuse to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate that are in compliance with the Illinois Election Code for an elected office which is mandated upon the Town by state law.
43. The Town, and/or Huonker have no discretion to refuse to certify the nominating papers of the Candidate.
44. The Candidate has a clear right to be named on the ballot as his nominating papers comply

written legal objections for the objectors as each is identical and states legal analysis which the Town is relying upon to assert the nominating papers lack apparent conformity.

⁴ The statute compels this office be elected in the Town. The Candidate complied with the election code and no objections have been raised stating anything to the contrary. with the Illinois Election Code for an office that is mandated by state law upon the Town.

**Re: Nomination Papers for the office of Normal Town Collector in the 2023
Municipal Election**

Dear Ms. Conklin:

I have been retained by the Town of Normal regarding the 2023 Municipal Election. You have filed nomination papers with the Town Clerk that seek to nominate you as a candidate for election to the office of Town Collector in the 2023 Election. Section 10-8 of the Illinois Election Code provides that: "certificates of nomination and nomination papers, and petitions to submit public questions to a referendum, being filed as required by this Code, and being in apparent conformity with the provisions of this Act, shall be deemed to be valid..." 10 ILCS 5/10-8. Accordingly, the Town has an affirmative duty to determine if nomination papers filed with it are "in apparent conformity" with the provisions of the Election Code.

Pursuant to Chapter 2, Section 2.1-1 of the Normal Town Code, the offices of Town President, and Members of the Board of Trustee are elected municipal offices. The Code makes no provision for election of the Town Collector. The only municipal offices to be contested at the 2023 Municipal Election, pursuant to Chapter 2, Section 2.2-1 of the Code, are three trustee positions. Accordingly, the nomination papers seeking to nominate you for the office of Town Collector are not in apparent conformity with legal requirements.

As a result of this lack of apparent conformity with legal requirements, the Town cannot certify your name to the County Clerk for inclusion on the 2023 municipal ballot for election to an office that is not an elective office under the Town Code, and your name will not appear on the ballot.

EXHIBIT B

CHAPTER 2 - OFFICERS, ELECTED AND APPOINTED

DIVISION 1 - PRESIDENT

SEC. 2.1-1 ELECTION - TERM OF OFFICE. The Town President shall be elected for a term of four (4) years and he shall be the President of the Board of Trustees, as provided by Statute. The inauguration of any newly elected President shall take place at the first regular meeting of the corporate authorities in the month of May following such election. (Amended 3/1/93 by Ord. No. 4115)

SEC. 2.1-2 DUTIES. He shall be the chief executive officer of the Town and shall perform all such duties as may be required by him by Statute or Ordinance. He shall have the power and authority to inspect all books and records kept by any Town officer or employees at any reasonable time.

SEC. 2.1-2.5 COMPENSATION. The President shall receive a salary in an amount fixed from time to time by ordinance. Beginning on December 1, 2018, the salary for the President is as follows:

- A. For each term of office beginning before the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$18,000 per year, payable monthly while in office.
- B. For each term of office beginning after the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$32,000 per year, payable monthly while in office.

SEC. 2.1-3. If the President is unable to perform the duties of the office through either death, absence from the Town for physical or mental disability for such a length of time or of such severity as would reasonably require the appointment of a fully empowered replacement, the Board of Trustees may elect one of its members President pro tem. The President pro tem shall have all the powers, duties, responsibilities and authority of the President. (Amended 12/1/75)

SEC. 2.1-4 NOTE. The President and Board of Trustees at times are referred to in this Code as the Town Board, the Town Council, the Board, the Council, the Corporate Authority, or other comparable language. In such situations or cases, no distinction or differentiation is intended. (Amended 12/1/75)

EXHIBIT C

DIVISION 2 - BOARD OF TRUSTEES

SEC. 2.2-1 ELECTION. The Trustees shall be elected in accordance with SEC. 1.1-1 of this Code and the Statutes made and provided therefore. The inauguration of any newly elected Trustee shall take place at the first regular meeting of the corporate authorities in the month of May following such election. (Amended 3/1/93 by Ord. No. 4115)

SEC. 2.2-2 COMPENSATION. Each member of the Board of Trustees shall receive a salary in an amount fixed from time to time by ordinance. Beginning on December 1, 2018, the salary for each member of the Board of Trustees is as follows:

- A. For each term of office beginning before the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$4,800 per year, payable monthly while the Trustee is in office.
- B. For each term of office beginning after the 2021 municipal election, the salary is \$6,800 per year, payable monthly while the Trustee is in office.

(Amended 10/15/73)(Renumbered 12/1/76)(Amended 6/21/76)(Amended 2/7/77)(Amended 2/2/81)(Amended 4/20/81 - Eff. May, 1985)(Amended 2/15/88)(Entire Section Amended 12/17/18 by Ord. No. 5772).

DIVISION 3 - APPOINTED OFFICERS

SEC. 2.3-1 APPOINTMENT. At the second regular meeting of the Town Council held in the month of March of each year, or as soon thereafter as convenient, the Town Council, with the President of the Town, shall jointly make the appointment of all appointive members of Boards and Commissions as required by State Statute and as provided for in this Code. Those officers holding present appointments, and all those hereafter appointed, shall have their appointments automatically renewed each March without further action of the Town Council, unless the party or parties in question, or the Town Council, shall terminate said employment.

All appointive officers of the Town shall serve for a term of one year commencing with the fiscal year of April 1 following the time of appointment as hereinbefore set out or until their successors are appointed and qualified provided, they may be removed from office for any good cause shown. In the case of a vacancy in any of said appointive officers for any cause, an officer shall, as soon as possible, be appointed in the same manner to serve for the remainder of the unexpired fiscal year. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-2 BOND. Before entering upon his duties of office, each officer appointed shall execute a bond in the amount hereinafter provided conditioned upon the faithful performance of the duties of his respective office and with sureties to be approved by the Town Council.

SEC. 2.3-3 COMPENSATION. All officers appointed under this Code shall receive such compensation as the Board of Trustees and the President of the Town jointly shall fix from time to time by ordinance or resolution. All officers and assistants heretofore appointed shall serve and retain their same powers, duties and salary until April 1, 1969, or until their successors are appointed and qualified.

SEC. 2.3-4 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - OFFICE CREATED. The office of Municipal Manager is hereby created.

SEC. 2.3-5 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - APPOINTMENT. The Town Council shall appoint a Municipal Manager, who shall be the administrative head of the Municipal Government of the Town of Normal and who shall be responsible for the efficient administration of all departments. He shall be appointed without regard to his political beliefs and need not be a resident of the Town of Normal when appointed. The Municipal Manager shall be appointed for an indefinite term. In the case of the absence or disability of the Manager, the Town Council may designate a qualified administrative officer of the Town of Normal to perform the duties of the Manager during such absence or disability.

SEC. 2.3-6 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - REMOVAL FROM OFFICE. A Manager may at any time be removed from office by a majority vote of the members of the Town Council.

SEC. 2.3-7 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - DUTIES AND POWERS. The powers and duties of the Municipal Manager shall be:

- A. To enforce the laws and ordinances within the Town.
- B. To appoint and remove all directors of departments. No appointment shall be made upon any basis other than that of merit and fitness.
- C. To exercise control of all departments and division thereof created by said Article V of the Revised Cities and Villages Act of Illinois and by any ordinances of the Town and by this ordinance and all amendments thereto.
- D. To have all the powers and exercise all the duties granted by Statute to municipal clerks and comptrollers with respect to the preparation of the report of estimated funds necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the fiscal year for the consideration of the corporate authorities prior to the preparation of the annual appropriation ordinance.
- E. To attend all meetings of the Council with the right to take part in the discussions; but with no right to vote.
- F. To recommend to the Council for adoption such measure as he may deem necessary or expedient.
- G. To see that all terms and conditions imposed in favor of the Town or its inhabitants and any contract or public utility franchise are faithfully kept and performed.

- H. To make in the ordinary course of business all purchases of materials, services and supplies necessary for the Town, as provided for in the Annual Budget and as provided in the Town's Purchasing Manual. (Amended 6/3/74)(Amended 11/21/77)(Amended 10/19/87)(Amended 4/6/98)
- I. To have and exercise the power, authority, and duty of any director of a department or division thereof prescribed by this ordinance or any amendment thereof during the time when the office of any such director shall be vacant or no person shall have been appointed thereto.
- J. To prepare such regular and special reports as are necessary for the efficient operation of the Town government, including an agenda for each Council meeting whether such meeting be regular or special, and such agenda to be prepared and distributed in advance of said meeting to all necessary parties.
- K. To conduct and prepare the necessary studies and/or research to help the Council make its policy decisions.
- L. To prepare an annual budget for the presentation and adoption by the Council, and shall further work with the City Officials in helping to prepare information for the necessary appropriation and levy ordinances.
- M. To assume and do all other duties as specifically delegated and assigned to him by said Council.
- N. To prepare and submit to the Town Council, at monthly intervals, reports which will advise said Council of the financial condition and future needs of the Town, and in so doing he may make such other recommendations as he may deem desirable.
- O. To recommend to the Council a standard schedule of pay for each appointive office.
- P. To recommend to the governing body from time to time adoption of such measures as he may deem necessary or expedient for the health, welfare, or safety of the citizenry or for the future improvement of the administrative services.
- Q. To prescribe rules and regulations for the conduct of the various departments of the Town and divisions thereunder.
- R. To perform such other duties as may be prescribed by said Article V of the Revised Cities and Villages Act of Illinois by this ordinance or any ordinance or resolution of the Town Council.
- S. To authorize a ~~change~~ or changes in any contract with the Town provided a written determination is made that:

1. The circumstances said to necessitate the change(s) in performance were not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed;
2. Were not within the contemplation of the contract as signed; or
3. Are in the best interest of the Town. The City Manager shall promptly report to the Council all change orders which authorize or necessitate an increase or decrease in either the cost of a contract by ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) or more or the time of completion by thirty (30) days or more.
(Added 7/3/89)

SEC. 2.3-8 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - SALARY. Compensation of the Municipal Manager shall be as determined by the Town Council.

SEC. 2.3-9 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - VACATION AND EMPLOYMENT RESTRICTIONS. The Municipal Manager shall be subject to the vacation schedule as authorized by the City Council, but not less than the provisions in existence in the Personnel Code for all other Town employees. He shall, likewise, be subject to the same sickness and disability provisions as other Town employees. He shall devote his entire time to the discharge of his official duties.
(Amended 7/16/73)

SEC. 2.3-10 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS. The Municipal Manager shall be paid for the use of his own private vehicle when used exclusively for Town business at the per mile rate established by the Town Council for compensated travel by other Town officials and/or employees, and he shall keep accurate records of same which shall be subject to Council approval prior to payment or the Town may provide a vehicle to be used by the City Manager for Town business. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-11 MUNICIPAL MANAGER - BOND. The Manager shall furnish a surety bond in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or such additional sum as may be established by the Town Council, which bond shall be approved by said Council. Said bond to be conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties as such Municipal Manager, and the premium on the bond shall be paid by the Town.

SEC. 2.3-12 EXECUTIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE POWERS AND DUTIES. The executive and administrative powers and duties of the Town shall be distributed and exercised through the departments and divisions thereof as provided by the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal of 1969 and as created and ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the Town Council and by reference hereto are made a part hereof as if the same were stated herein.

SEC. 2.3-13 APPOINTIVE OFFICERS - POWERS, DUTIES AND SALARIES. The powers, duties, and salaries of an appointive officer and employee shall be in accordance with the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal of 1969 and in accordance with ordinances passed and approved by the Town Council and are by reference made a part hereof as if the same were stated herein.

SEC. 2.3-14 AUDIT. At the close of each fiscal year the Town Council shall cause an independent audit of all accounts of the Town of Normal to be made by an accountant or accountants authorized to practice accounting under the laws of the State of Illinois.

SEC. 2.3-15 CITY MANAGER - FINALITY OF ACTION. All acts and things done by the City Manager pursuant to this Code shall, unless otherwise especially provided, be final and conclusive unless and until superseded by action of the President and/or Board of Trustees. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-16 DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Parks and Recreation, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-17 DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Director of Parks and Recreation to see to the overall administration of the recreation program of the Town, to be in charge of all parklands, to be the supervisor of all buildings and/or equipment belonging to said Town's Parks and Recreation Department and in general to be the chief administrative officer of the Town for said Department. He shall answer solely to the City Manager or the Town Council, as the case might be, and he shall have sole jurisdiction over the issuance of permits for the use of the Town's park facilities. His salary shall be as established by resolution of the Town Council and subject to the same controls as those affecting the other department heads.

SEC. 2.3-18 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Building Commissioner, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-19 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Building Commissioner to see to the enforcement of all ordinance provisions relating to buildings and zoning and to inspect all buildings or structures being erected or altered, as frequently as may be necessary to insure compliance with the Town ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-20 BUILDING COMMISSIONER - STOP ORDER. The Building Commissioner shall have the power to order all work stopped on construction or alteration or repair of buildings in the Town, when such work is being done in violation of any provisions of an ordinance relating thereto, or in violation of the zoning ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such order, except on the written permission of the Commissioner, provided that if the stop order is an oral one, it shall be followed by a written stop order within an hour. Such written stop order may be served by a policeman. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-21 BUILDING INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating any order of the Building Inspector shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00 for each day on which any work in violation of such stop order is done.

SEC. 2.3-22 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Plumbing Inspector, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-23 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Plumbing Inspector to see to the enforcement of all provisions of the ordinances relating to plumbing and plumbing equipment; and to make such inspections and perform such tests as may be necessary in the enforcement of such ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-24 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - STOP ORDER. The Plumbing Inspector shall have the power to order work stopped on the construction, alteration or repair of plumbing equipment when such work is being done in violation of any ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such a stop order except on written permission of the Plumbing Inspector; provided that if the stop order is an oral one it shall be followed by a written stop order within one hour. Such written stop order may be served by any policeman.

SEC. 2.3-25 PLUMBING INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, or corporation violating or failing to comply with any of the terms and requirements of this article shall be fined a sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00, or be imprisoned for not to exceed six (6) months or both such fine and such imprisonment. Each day that any such violation or failure continues shall be considered as a separate and distinct offense and shall be publishable as such.

SEC. 2.3-26 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Director of Public Works, being a continuation of the former office of Superintendent of Public Works. The Director shall be appointed by the City Manager. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-27 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - DUTIES. The Director of Public Works is responsible for the organizing, directing and coordinating the activities of several divisions comprising the Public Works Department including municipal engineer; problems relating to the design, construction, and maintenance of streets, sewers, and other public works structures, the cleaning of streets, the collection and disposal of refuse and garbage and the maintenance of mechanical equipment and building. (Amended 3/7/72)(Amended 4/18/88)

SEC. 2.3-28 DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - MOTOR FUEL TAX. All repairs, construction or reconstruction of any and all streets and of all adjuncts and appurtenances thereto which may be paid in whole or in part out of money received by the Town from the State of Illinois as its share of Motor Fuel Tax shall be under the control of the Director of Public Works. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-29 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - APPOINTMENT. There is hereby created, and continued as heretofore, the position of Electrical Inspector, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Statutes made and provided applicable to the managerial form of municipal government. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-30 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Electrical Inspector to see to the enforcement of all provisions of the ordinances relating to electrical installations and electrical equipment and to make such inspections and perform such tests as may be necessary in the enforcement of such ordinances.

SEC. 2.3-31 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - STOP ORDER. The Electrical Inspector shall have the power to order work stopped on the construction, alteration or repair of electrical equipment or installations when such work is being done in violation of any ordinance. Work shall not be resumed after the issuance of such a stop order except on written permission of the Electrical Inspector; provided that if the stop order is an oral one it shall be followed by a written stop order within one hour. Such written stop order may be served by any policeman.

SEC. 2.3-32 ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR - PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating or failing to comply with any of the terms and requirements of this article shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00, or be imprisoned for not to exceed six (6) months or both such fine and such imprisonment. Each day that any such violation or failure continues shall be considered as a separate and distinct offense and shall be punishable as such.

SEC. 2.3-33 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - COMPOSITION AND QUALIFICATION. All of the legal activities of the Town government are assigned to the Law Department of said Town. The Legal Department shall consist of a licensed attorney at law to be known as the Corporation Counsel. The Corporation Counsel shall be the responsible head of the Legal Department with the full authority to direct the carrying on of its activities. He shall be appointed by the City Manager, and his activities shall be authorized and supervised by the City Manager.

The Corporation Counsel shall at the time of his appointment be a practicing member of the Bar of McLean County, Illinois, and be of good standing therein and otherwise qualified by law to serve as legal officer of the Town. He shall devote such of his time and energies to the discharge of his official duties as such duties may from time to time be required. The Corporation Counsel shall be required upon conclusion of his terms of office to turn over official Town files and records to his successor in office. (Amended 1/5/73)(Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-34 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - SUITS AND ACTIONS. The Corporation Counsel shall prosecute or defend any and all suits or actions at law or equity to which the Town may be a party, or in which it may be interested, or which may be brought against, or by, any officer of the Town on behalf of the Town or in the capacity of such person as an officer of the Town. (Amended 3/5/80)

The Corporation Counsel may, with the approval of the City Manager, employ outside legal counsel to attend to the legal affairs of the Town in the event that attorneys within the Legal Department are unable to attend to such affairs due to a specialized nature of the legal matter, when a hearing officer or attorney is required and attorneys in the department have a conflict, or when otherwise authorized by the City Manager.

In the event the outside counsel is representing the Town, the City Manager is authorized, on behalf of the Town, to waive such matters as necessary to enable such outside counsel to

represent other clients doing business or otherwise interacting with the Town on matters unrelated to the outside counsel's representation of the Town.

(Entire Division Amended 5/21/07 by Ord. No. 5136)

SEC. 2.3-35 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - ADVICE. The Corporation Counsel shall be the legal advisor to the Town and shall render advice on all legal questions affecting the Town whenever requested to do so by any Town official. Upon request by the President, or the Town Council, he shall reduce any such opinion to writing.

The Corporation Counsel shall

1. advise and assist in the drafting of all Town ordinances, order, regulations, and contracts to which the Town is expected to become a party;
2. approve all ordinances as to form before the same are submitted to the Town Council;
3. approve all contracts before the same are signed by the proper officials;
4. be responsible for the handling of any and all legal affairs of the Town and;
5. be responsible for the prosecution of violations of Town ordinances before Courts having jurisdiction to try such offenses and in addition, shall have such other duties as may be assigned to him, provided that outside counsel may be hired with Council approval for special projects. (Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-36 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - JUDGMENTS. It shall be the duty of the Corporation Counsel to see to the full enforcement of all judgments or decrees rendered or entered in favor of the Town and of all similar interlocutory orders. (Amended 3/5/80)

SEC. 2.3-37 LEGAL DEPARTMENT - COMPENSATION. The City Attorney shall receive such annual salary as is provided by ordinance and the same shall apply to the Assistant City Attorney. Additional compensation shall be paid for the usual services in the issuance and sale of municipal securities, being bond issues, of either revenue or general obligation forms; for obtaining of easements for the acquisition of property; and all matters pertaining to special assessments. Expenses incurred for travel and similar incidental expenses applicable to the business of the Town shall be reimbursed.

SEC. 2.3-38 TOWN CLERK - OFFICE CREATED. The office of the Town Clerk, heretofore established by Ordinance as an appointive office, is hereby retained. The Clerk shall be appointed by the City Manager, and receive such compensation as may be provided by Ordinance.

SEC. 2.3-39 TOWN CLERK - DUTIES. The Town Clerk shall be the recording officer of the municipality and have custody of all documents, books, records and papers pertaining to the Town or departments thereof, not specifically assigned to some other officer or department and shall be the keeper of the official seal of said Town. The Clerk must attend all meetings of the Town

Council, or Board, and keep the records of the proceedings thereof, and where required, to see to the publication of all ordinances, resolutions and notices requiring same. The Town Clerk shall be immediately in charge of the Deputy Clerk and shall be responsible for his acts. The Clerk shall furnish to the various departments of the State of Illinois all records and data so required or directed by Statute to be furnished. The Clerk of said Town shall keep the Town offices open during such hours as may be directed by the Town Council. All documents filed with the Clerk may be evidenced by certified copies and the passage and publication of ordinances and notices may be proved by such certificate. Said Clerk shall perform all duties prescribed by the Town Council of said Town or by law or ordinance, under the supervision of the City Manager. The Clerk shall not, however, be responsible for preparation of a report of estimated funds necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the fiscal year for the consideration of the Board of Trustees prior to the preparation of the Annual Budget or Appropriation Ordinance. (Amended 4/3/72)(Amended 11/15/76)

SEC. 2.3-40 TOWN CLERK - INDICES. The Town Clerk shall keep and maintain a proper index to all documents and records kept by him so that ready access thereto and use thereof may be had.

SEC. 2.3-41 TOWN CLERK - VACANCY. In case the office of Town Clerk shall become vacant for any reason, the City Manager shall appoint a successor. (Amended 4/3/72)(Amended 11/15/76)

SEC. 2.3-42 TOWN TREASURER - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Town Treasurer. The Town Treasurer shall be appointed by the City Manager and shall receive such compensation as may be provided by ordinance. (Amended 12/3/73)

SEC. 2.3-43 TOWN TREASURER - EX OFFICIO COLLECTOR. The Town Treasurer shall be ex officio collector and shall perform all duties of that office.

SEC. 2.3-44 TOWN TREASURER - GENERAL DUTIES. The Town Treasurer shall perform such duties as may be prescribed for him by Statute or ordinance, and shall perform such other duties and functions as assigned by him by the Town Council or the City Manager. It shall be the duty of the Town Treasurer to see to the accounting, bookkeeping and collection of funds; to make preparations for the disbursing of revenue; to receive all money paid in to the Town, whether directed from the person paying the money or from the hands of such other officer or employee as may receive it; to pay out money only on vouchers or orders properly signed by the President and Town Clerk; to supply the Town Clerk and the Town Council and all other officers of said Town all data pertaining to the Town's finances when so requested; to be responsible for the maintenance of records of the Water and Sewer Department and to be responsible for the preparation and collection of water and sewer charges. The Town Treasurer shall not retain any fees or other stipends received from the performance of his duties, but the same shall become the property of the Town.

SEC. 2.3-45 TOWN TREASURER - DEPOSIT OF FUNDS IN DESIGNATED DEPOSITORIES. The following financial institutions are designated depositories of and for the Town of Normal Funds:

Depositories herein designated shall, at all times, comply with the laws of the State of Illinois with reference to the requirements of depositories and shall promptly furnish such statements to the Town of Normal as are required by State Law. (Amended 3/7/72)(Amended 11/7/78)

SEC. 2.3-46 TOWN TREASURER - RECORDS. He shall keep records showing all money received by him, showing the source from which it is received and purpose for which it is paid and he shall keep records at all times showing the financial status of the Town.

SEC. 2.3-47 TOWN TREASURER - ACCOUNTING. The Treasurer shall keep such books and accounts as may be required by statute or ordinance, and he shall keep them in the manner required by the Board of Trustees.

SEC. 2.3-48 TOWN TREASURER - SPECIAL ASSESSMENT FUND. All moneys received on any special assessment shall be held by the Treasurer as a special fund to be applied only to the improvement, or bonds and vouchers issued therefore, together with interest thereon, for which the assessment was made and said money shall be used for no other purpose, unless to reimburse the Town for money expended for such improvements. Payment on bonds or vouchers shall be in accordance with the statutes and the laws and the Treasurer shall keep his books and accounts in such a manner so that proper appropriation in payments in principal and interest can be made and ascertained.

SEC. 2.3-49 TOWN TREASURER - WARRANTS AND TRANSFER OF FUNDS. All warrants drawn on the Treasurer must be signed by the President and countersigned by the Clerk, stating the particular fund or appropriation to which the same is chargeable, and the person to

whom payable; and no money shall be otherwise paid except as may be provided by statute. Money shall not be transferred by the Treasurer from one fund to another, after it has been collected or paid, except as may be ordered by the President and Board of Trustees or except in the manner and form prescribed by statutes. The Town Treasurer, or his designated agent, may electronically transfer Town funds either for investment purposes, or for the payment of Town debts, or for any other usual and customary purpose provided such electronic transfer of funds is approved by the Clerk, the Clerk's designee, or President of the Board of Trustees. Such transfer shall be reported monthly to the President and Board of Trustees for authorization or ratification. In the absence of the Clerk or Deputy Clerk, the City Manager or Assistant City Manager may also authorize the electronic transfer of funds. (Amended 2/21/94 by Ord. No. 4208)(Amended 2/16/98 by Ord. No. 4494)(Amended 2/21/05 by Ord. No. 4996)

SEC. 2.3-50 CHIEF OF POLICE - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of the Chief of Police for the Town of Normal, Illinois.

SEC. 2.3-51 CHIEF OF POLICE - APPOINTMENT. The Chief shall be appointed by the City Manager; provided that if the person appointed Chief was at the time of such promotion a member of the Department, he shall retain his status and rank while serving as Chief and shall revert to such status and rank when his term as Chief has ended. (Amended 3/7/72)

SEC. 2.3-52 CHIEF OF POLICE - DUTIES. The Chief of Police shall be the keeper of the Town Jail and shall have custody of all persons incarcerated therein. He shall keep such records and make such reports concerning the activities of his department as may be required by statute or by the Town Council. The Chief shall be responsible for the performance by the Police Department of all its functions, and all persons who are members of the Department shall serve subject to the order of the Chief of Police.

SEC. 2.3-53 CHIEF OF POLICE - RULES AND REGULATIONS. The Chief of Police may make or prescribe such rules and regulations not inconsistent with rules and regulations promulgated by the Board of Police and Fire Commissioners as he shall deem advisable; such rules when approved by the Town Council shall be binding upon such members. Such rules and regulations may cover, besides the conduct of the members, uniforms and equipment being worn or carried, hours of service, vacations all other similar matters necessary or desirable for the efficiency of the Department.

SEC. 2.3-54 HEALTH INSPECTOR - OFFICE CREATED. There is hereby created the office of Health Inspector for the Town of Normal. The Chief of Police shall serve as ex officio Health Inspector.

SEC. 2.3-55 HEALTH INSPECTOR - DUTIES. The Health Inspector shall enforce all ordinances containing provisions for the protection of public health; he shall make inspections of food stuffs and of the premises used for storing or selling of food stuffs; he shall enforce all provisions as may be provided by ordinance; he shall perform such other duties and functions as is required by statute or ordinance.

SEC. 2.3-56 HEALTH INSPECTOR - REPORT. The Health Inspector shall make such reports to the Board of Trustees as may be required. He shall also make recommendations for rulings, orders or ordinances respecting the public health whenever he is requested to do so or whenever he deems it advisable or necessary.

SEC. 2.3-57 HEALTH INSPECTOR - COMPENSATION. No additional compensation shall be paid the Chief of Police for his duties as Health Inspector for the Town of Normal.

SEC. 2.3-58 TOWN ENGINEER.

- A. Appointment and qualifications. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore the office of Town Engineer. The Town Engineer shall be appointed by the City Manager and shall be a licensed professional engineer in the State of Illinois.
- B. Duties. The Town Engineer shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for all engineering questions and duties of the Town assigned to him. The Town Engineer shall attend meetings of the corporate authorities and give opinions, verbal and written, when requested. He shall also be the engineer for the Board of Local Improvements and shall attend all meetings of said Board. The Engineer shall be responsible for field inspection for all new construction except as specifically excluded by the Board of Trustees. (SEC. 2.3-58 added 1/2/73)(Renumbering revised 12/3/73)(Amended 2/7/78, Eff. 4/1/78)(Amended 4/18/88)

SEC. 2.3-59 INFORMATION SERVICES.

- A. Appointment. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Information Services, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Illinois law and Town ordinances applicable to the managerial form of government.
- B. Duties. The Director of Information Services shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for information storage, processing, and retrieval as those duties are assigned from time to time by the City Manager. (SEC. 2.3-59 added 3/17/97 by Ord. No. 4445)

SEC. 2.3-60 DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RESOURCES.

- A. Appointment. There is hereby created and continued as heretofore, the position of Director of Human Resources, who shall be appointed by the City Manager in accordance with Illinois law and Town ordinances applicable to the managerial form of government.
- B. Duties. The Director of Human Resources shall be under the supervision of the City Manager and shall be responsible for providing a comprehensive human resources management system as those duties are assigned and delineated from time to time by the City Manager. (SEC. 2.3-60 added 3/17/97 by Ord. No. 4445)

RELEVANT FACTUAL HISTORY

- 1) The Town of Normal is a home rule municipality.

- 4) The Town of Normal has never by referendum eliminated the offices of Town Collector or Supervisor.

- 6) On or about November 28, 2022, Amy Conklin submitted to the Town of Normal her nominating papers for the elected office of Town Clerk.
- 7) On or about November 28, 2022, Charles Sila submitted to the Town of Normal his nominating papers for the elected office of Town Collector.

- 8) On or about November 28, 2022, Robert Shoraga submitted to the Town of Normal his nominating papers for the elected office of Supervisor.
- 9) On or about December 02, 2022, counsel for the Town of Normal sent written notices to each Candidate stating the Town of Normal would not recognize the nominating papers of the Candidates.
- 10) On or about December 05, 2022, the Objectors filed a written objection to Amy Conklin's nominating papers.
- 11) The Objectors written objections to Amy Conklin's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.
- 12) As to Amy Conklin's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for an elected Town Clerk as is prescribes the Town Clerk to be an appointed position.
- 13) The Objectors to Amy Conklin's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.
- 14) The Objectors written objections to Charles Sila's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.
- 15) As to Charles Sila's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for a Town Collector.
- 16) The Objectors to Charles Sila's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.
- 17) The Objectors written objections to Robert Shoraga's nominating papers are identical in form and content but only differ by the name and address of the Objectors.

- 18) As to Robert Shoraga's written objections, the Objectors raise no substantive defects in the nominating papers but raise merely legal arguments that the Town of Normal does not provide in their local municipal code for a Supervisor.
- 19) The Objectors to Robert Shoraga's nominating papers also make reference to their perceived statutory interpretation of an Illinois statute.

LEGAL STANDARD

- 20) Any village of fewer than 5,000 inhabitants may, by resolution adopted by not less than two-thirds of the village board, choose to have a clerk appointed by the village president with the concurrence of the village board. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-90)
- 21) Otherwise, at the election for trustees in each village and incorporated town, whether incorporated under a general or special Act (other than a village that was incorporated under a special Act and that adopts Section 3.1-30-25), a clerk of the village or incorporated town *shall be elected* who shall hold office for a term of the same length of time as provided in this Article 3.1 for the mayor in a city, except that any such village or incorporated town that, before January 1, 1942, has adopted a 2 year term for village clerk shall continue to elect a village clerk for a term of 2 years. *Id.*
- 22) Incorporated town officers. For the general municipal election to be held in the year 1985 *in every incorporated town with a population of 25,000 or more* by the last official census, and every 4 years thereafter, the municipal clerk *shall certify* the names of the candidates to the proper election authority as provided by the general election law. (See 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-95)
- 23) A president, a *clerk*, an assessor, a *collector*, and a *supervisor* shall be elected for a term of 4 years and until their successors are elected and have qualified. *Id.*

- 24) A home rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection and terms of office *only as* approved by referendum *or* as otherwise authorized by law. (See Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, § 6(f))
- 25) Although they have been granted extensive powers with respect to their local government and affairs (Ill. Const. 1970, art. VII, 6(a)), home rule municipalities may change their manner of selecting officers only: (1) as provided by statute; or (2) as approved by a referendum. (Emphasis Added) (2005 Ill. Atty. Gen. Op. 007 (Ill.A.G.))
- 26) The constitutional mandate requires that changes in the manner of selecting officers of a home rule municipality or their terms are reserved to the voters by article VII, section 6(f), and can be effected only by referendum unless otherwise authorized by legislative enactment. *Leck v. Michaelson*, 111 Ill.2d 523, 491 N.E.2d 414, 96 Ill.Dec. 368.
- 27) The primary objective of statutory construction is to ascertain and give effect to the legislature's intent. *Evans v. Cook County State's Attorney*, 2021 IL 125513, ¶ 27, 451 Ill.Dec. 353, 183 N.E.3d 810.
- 28) The most reliable indicator of legislative intent is the language of the statute, given its plain and ordinary meaning. *People v. Casler*, 2020 IL 125117, ¶ 24, 450 Ill.Dec. 415, 181 N.E.3d 767.
- 29) When statutory language is plain and unambiguous, the statute must be applied as written without resort to aids of statutory construction. *People v. Howard*, 228 Ill. 2d 428, 438, 320 Ill.Dec. 868, 888 N.E.2d 85 (2008).
- 30) We may not depart from a statute's plain language by reading in exceptions, limitations, or conditions the legislature did not express. *People v. Lewis*, 223 Ill. 2d 393, 402, 307 Ill.Dec. 645, 860 N.E.2d 299 (2006).

31) Courts should not attempt to read a statute other than in the manner it was written. *Rosewood Care Center, Inc. v. Caterpillar, Inc.*, 226 Ill. 2d 559, 567, 315 Ill.Dec. 762, 877 N.E.2d 1091 (2007).

ARGUMENT

- 32) There are only two incorporated towns in the State of Illinois with a population over 25,000.
- 33) These two towns are Normal and Cicero.
- 34) Upon information and belief, when the controlling statutory provisions referenced above were adopted around 1985, Normal and Cicero were then also the only two incorporated towns in Illinois with a population in excess of 25,000.
- 35) The statute is plain and unambiguous when it states *every* incorporated town with a population over 25,000 shall elect for a four year term, *inter alia*, a clerk, collector, and supervisor.
- 36) As for Town Clerk, Illinois law does allow for the appointment of a town clerk by an incorporated town only if its population is under 5,000.
- 37) The statute is plain and unambiguous in that the city clerk shall certify the names for candidates of these offices.
- 38) The Objectors argue the Town of Normal election code does not provide for the offices of collector or supervisor.
- 39) The Objectors argue the Town of Normal election code fills the office of town clerk by appointment.
- 40) This question of law which controls the outcome of this matter is quite simply whether the Town of Normal can by local municipal action, and not by referendum, decide which offices are held in the town, and the manner for which these offices are filled.

- 41) The Objectors argue Illinois law which compels the election of these town offices only applies to the Town of Cicero.
- 42) The statute which compels the city clerk of the certify the names of the Candidates for these office is plain and unambiguous.
- 43) The statute which demands the Town of Normal to provide for the elected offices of, *inter alia*, clerk, collector, and supervisor is plain and unambiguous.
- 44) Illinois law commands that when statutory language is plain and unambiguous, the statute must be applied as written without resort to aids of statutory construction.
- 45) As a home rule municipality, the Town of Normal cannot alter the manner of selecting a town clerk except by referendum.
- 46) As a home rule municipality, the Town of Normal cannot choose willfully disregard providing for the offices of Supervisor or Town Collector except by referendum.
- 47) These referendums have never occurred which means state statute controls the requirement for these offices and their manner of selection.
- 48) To the extent the Town of Normal has chosen to appoint their town clerk, this local government action is void as it is in violation of state law.
- 49) To the extent the Town of Normal has chosen to not provide for a Supervisor or Town Collector, this local government action is void as it is in violation of state law.
- 50) The current town clerk is mandated by state law to certify the nominating papers of the Town Clerk, Town Collector and Supervisor as state law commands it.
- 51) It would be reversible error for this Board to conclude any local government action, which was not authorized by referendum, can supersede Illinois law.
- 52) The Illinois Constitution, as interpreted by Illinois case law, and former Illinois Attorney General compels this Board to deny the objections of the Objectors.

- 53) Any attempt to construe the plain and unambiguous state law on this topic in a self-serving manner to coincide with the Town of Normal's ultra vires conduct would be reversible error.
- 54) Suggesting statutory construction results in a conclusion that somehow the relevant state law only applies to the Town of Cicero would also be reversible error as the statute is crystal clear that it applies to *every* incorporated towns over 25,000.
- 55) There are only two of such towns and the legislature assuredly understood that.
- 56) If the legislature had intended the relevant statute to apply only to the Town of Cicero, they would have clearly said so.

SUMMARY

This is not the first time a local municipality due to inadvertence, or ignorance, was failing to comply with a clear statutory obligation placed upon them by the Illinois legislature. The Objectors admit the Town of Normal is an Incorporated Town. It is also a home rule municipality. These facts are not in dispute. As a home rule municipality, it may by referendum alter the manner of selection of its officers. It has never conducted such a referendum on the offices of Town Clerk, Town Collector and Supervisor. As such, it must select those offices as prescribed by state law. The state law is plain and unambiguous. The state law commands the current town clerk to certify for the ballot the Candidates names for these offices. The Town of Normal had no authority to disregard or alter the state law in this regard absent referendum of the people of the Town of Normal. While one Objector proclaims this will lead to an absurd result of no legal consequence. While an alleged absurdity is of no legal consequence given the plain and unambiguous reading of the statute, the practical complexity of what the Town of Normal is now facing is a result of their having violated state law for decades.

This Board is not the council of the Town of Normal. This Board is charged with

upholding the election code of the State of Illinois and the Town of Normal. To the extent state law and local law conflict, this Board must decide which law controls. Before addressing this issue, the Candidates question the ability of this Board to be fair and impartial given their attorney, Mr. Michael Kasper, has already stated the Town of Normal has concluded their nominating papers to be invalid due to their opinion that local law controls. As stated above, even though its members overlap, this Board is independent of the town council, and has a legal obligation to challenge the lawfulness of the towns code. In front of this Board is a state statute which commands the nominating papers of the Candidates be certified. Any local election provisions adopted only by an act of its council, which might contradict or are inconsistent with, the state statute are void. Only a referendum adopted by the people of the Town of Normal could supersede the state law on this topic. The nominating papers of the three Candidates are in conformity with the controlling law, of which this Board is bound, and as such their names must be certified by the current town clerk and their names placed on the ballot. Any other decision would be reversible error.

EXHIBIT D

*An Act to Incorporate the Town of Normal, Private Laws of the State of Illinois
Passed by the Twenty-Fifth General Assembly, 1867, Volume III, pp. 321-36*

Wenona, may be executed by the president of the corporation hereby created, and shall be acknowledged as other conveyances, and, when executed and acknowledged, as aforesaid, it shall be deemed and taken in all courts and places to be *prima facie* evidence of the existing and regularity of all such prior proceedings as might otherwise be required to be proved, in order to establish the title to the purchase; and such deed shall be evidence, as aforesaid, without any proof of any proceedings prior to the issuing thereof.

§ 17. The town council are hereby expressly and forever prohibited from granting license to any person or persons in said town of Wenona to sell, traffic, exchange, barter or give away any strong beer, ale, lager beer, wine, rum, gin, brandy, whisky or intoxicating liquors, drinks or beverages of any kind whatever, including Hostetter's Stomach Bitters, Plantation Bitters, Hobson's Bitters, Red Jacket Bitters, or any other bitters, of whatever name or kind, containing intoxicating liquors; and no person shall be permitted to bring to the town or keep about his, her or their premises, saloon, cellar, dwelling house, out house, or in any other place in said town or within three miles thereof, any of the above named drinks, liquors or intoxicating beverages, for the purpose of trafficking therein in any way whatever: *Provided*, the town council may grant license to the druggists in said town, if deemed by the town council to be discreet persons, to sell wines or other spirituous liquors for mechanical, medicinal and sacramental purposes only. And the said council shall have power, at any regular meeting, to revoke said license. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section of this charter shall forfeit and pay into the treasury of the corporation, for the use of the inhabitants of said town, not less than twenty five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offense, to be recovered by an action of debt before the police magistrate or other justice of the peace in said town; and in case any offender or offenders shall refuse or fail to pay such fine or fines and costs that may be adjudged or assessed against him, her or them by said police magistrate or other justice of the peace, and said offender or offenders shall forthwith be committed to the county jail for a term of not less than thirty days, unless said fine or fines and costs be sooner paid.

 § 18. The president and trustees created by this act as the town council of Wenona shall hold their offices for one year and until their successors are elected and qualified; and the police magistrate elected by virtue of this act shall hold his office for two years and until his successor is elected and qualified.

Act to be submitted to legal voters.
 § 19. This charter shall be submitted to the vote of the people of the town of Wenona on the last Monday of April

next, and, if adopted by a majority of the votes cast, it shall become a law from the time the same is so adopted; otherwise to be null and void. The present president and trustees of the town of Wenona shall post up notices for election notices of the time and place of holding said election. And if this charter is adopted, it shall be the duty of the judges of said election to cause a certified copy of the same to be filed in the county clerk's office of said county of Marion shall.

§ 20. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.
 Approved February 28, 1867.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Normal.

In force Feb'y 28, 1867.

ARTICLE I.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly*, That the inhabitants and residents of the town of Normal, in the county of McLean, and state of Illinois, are hereby constituted and declared a body corporate and politic, by the name and style of "The Town of Normal;" and, by that name, shall have perpetual succession; and may have and use a common seal, which they may alter at pleasure; have power to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in all courts and places where justice is administered, in all actions whatever; to purchase, receive and hold property, both real and personal, within the limits of said town and beyond its limits, when needed for burial grounds or other corporate purposes; to sell, lease and convey property, real and personal, for the use of said town; to protect and improve any such property as the public good may require.

Name and style

Corporate powers.

§ 2. The town limits of the said town of Normal shall be bounded as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point one mile due west of the central point of section twenty-eight, (28,) township twenty-four (24) north, range two (2) east, in McLean county, Illinois; thence north one mile; thence east two miles; thence south two miles; thence west two miles; thence north one mile, to the place of beginning; *Provided*, that all tracts of land within the town boundaries which are in extent ten acres or more, and used for agricultural or horticultural purposes only, and not a portion of a residence, nor laid out into town lots, shall be exempt from taxation for town revenue until the same shall be entirely

divided into town lots; and each lot when so divided, shall be taxed as other town lots.

§ 2. Whenever any tract of land adjoining said town shall be laid off into town lots, platted and duly recorded, as required by law, the same shall be annexed to and form a part of the town of Normal: *Provided*, that the town council shall have power to require that all additions and subdivisions hereafter made to said town shall be so laid out and platted as to correspond and conform to the regular blocks, streets and alleys already laid out and established within said town; and no map or plat of any addition or subdivision to said town shall be entitled to record or be recorded in the office of the recorder of McLean county until the same shall be approved by the town council of said town; and all such additions shall be null and void until a correct map or plat thereof shall be approved by said town council.

ARTICLE II.

§ 1. The legislative powers of the town of Normal shall be vested in a town council, composed of five trustees, to be elected, annually, by the qualified voters of said town; and no person shall be a trustee of said town who has not arrived at the age of twenty-one years, and who has not resided in said town one year next preceding his election, and is not a citizen of the United States. And the said trustees shall, at their first meeting, proceed to elect one of their number president; and shall have power to fill all vacancies in said board which may be occasioned by death, resignation or removal: *Provided*, the vacancy shall not exceed six months.

§ 2. The town council shall determine the qualifications, returns and elections of its own members. A majority shall constitute a quorum, but a smaller number may adjourn from time to time, and compel the attendance of absent members, under such penalties as may be prescribed by ordinance; which have power to determine the rules of their own proceedings; furnish a method for disciplinary conduct, and, with a concurrence of three-fifths, expel a member.

§ 3. Each member of the town council shall, before entering upon the duties of the office, take an oath to perform the duties of his office to the best of his knowledge and ability, to support the constitution of the United States and of this state. And there shall be at least one regular meeting of said town council in each month, at such time and place as may be prescribed by ordinance: *Provided*, that the president or any three members of said council may call special meetings of said council, first giving such notice, in writing, as shall be provided for by the council.

ARTICLE III.

§ 1. There shall be elected in the town of Normal, by the qualified voters thereof, on the first Monday of March, 1867, and on the first Monday of March every four years thereafter, a police magistrate and a town constable, who shall hold their respective offices for four years and until their successors shall be elected and qualified.

§ 2. No person shall be eligible to the office of police magistrate or to the office of town constable who shall not have been a resident of the town one year next preceding his election, or who shall not be a citizen of the United States.

§ 3. For the election of five trustees, a police magistrate, and a town constable, the town of Normal is hereby declared an election precinct.

§ 4. The police magistrate shall be commissioned by the governor of the state of Illinois as a justice of the peace, and, as such, shall give bond and take and subscribe the same oath of office as other justices of the peace, and, as such, shall be a conservator of the peace for said town, and shall have power and authority to administer oaths, issue writs and processes; to take depositions and acknowledgments of deeds, mortgages and other instruments of writing and certify the names of other justices of the peace; and he shall have exclusive jurisdiction of all cases arising under the ordinances of the corporation, and concurrent jurisdiction, power and authority arising in all cases whatsoever, with other justices of the peace, under the laws of this state, and shall be entitled to such fees for his services as shall be fixed by town ordinance, and, when not so fixed, as other justices of the peace, in similar cases: *Provided*, that upon the necessary oath being made by the defendant, as required by law governing justices of the peace, a change of venue shall be granted, in all cases, from the police magistrate of the town in the nearest justice of the peace, who is hereby invested, in such cases, with all the authority of the police magistrate, and he shall proceed to try the same: *Provided, also*, that in the event of absence, sickness, death or resignation of the police magistrate, the next nearest justice of the peace of McLean county be invested with all the power conferred upon the police magistrate by the provisions of this act.

§ 5. The town constable shall have the same power, power and authority, rights, privileges and qualifications, shall have the same jurisdiction and be entitled to the same fees, and be liable to the same penalties, as constables now are or may hereafter be under the laws of this state, and shall be placed under such bonds, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of his office, as may be prescribed by ordinance of the corporation hereby created.

Punishes for neglect of duty

§ 4. In case the police magistrate shall at any time be guilty of culpable omission of duty or shall wilfully or corruptly be guilty of corruption, of oppression, malconduct or partiality in the discharge of the duties of his office, he shall be liable to be indicted in the circuit court of Melean county, and, on conviction, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding two hundred dollars and removed from office.

ARTICLE IV.

Time and place of election of officers

§ 1. On the first Monday of March, 1867, an election shall be held in said town of Normal for five trustees, a day of March of each year (unless otherwise provided) an election shall be held for the election of said trustees, who shall hold their offices for one year and until their successors shall be elected and qualified; and, however thereafter, on the first Monday of March, every four years, an election shall be held for the election of a police magistrate and town constable, who shall hold their offices for four years and until their successors shall be elected and qualified; which first election shall commence at ten o'clock, a. m., and close at four o'clock, p. m. of said day; and, for the purpose of said first election, the present board of trustees of the town of Normal and any hereby constituted corporate trustees for said town.

Publication of ordinance

§ 2. It shall be the duty of said board of trustees hereby constituted, or any commission, to give at least ten days' notice of the time and place of holding said first election, by posting up notices in at least three of the most public places in said town, to the judges of said first election, to appoint their own clerks, receive and examine the votes, declare the result, furnish to each one of the persons elected a certificate of the election, notify the clerk of the county court of Melean county, and lay the poll-books of such election before the board in its first meeting. All subsequent elections shall be held and conducted and returns made as may be prescribed by ordinance.

When to hold election

§ 3. A failure to hold said first election on the first Monday, but said first election may be held on any day after the first Monday of March, 1867, by giving ten days' notice, and conducting the same as prescribed in section two of article four of this charter.

How

§ 4. If two or more persons shall receive an equal number of votes for police magistrate or town constable, the board shall proceed to determine the same by lot; and when there shall be a tie in the election of members of the town council the judge of election shall cast the same to the

police magistrate, who shall determine the same, by lot, in such manner as shall be prescribed by ordinance; and all contested elections shall be determined as prescribed by ordinance.

§ 5. All persons who are entitled to vote for state officers and who shall have been actual residents of said town ninety days next preceding said election shall be entitled to vote for said officers.

ARTICLE V

OF THE LEGISLATIVE POWERS OF THE COUNCIL.

§ 1. The town council shall have power and authority to levy and collect taxes upon all property, real and personal, within the limits of the town, not exceeding ten mills on the dollar, upon the assessed value thereof, and may enforce the payment of the same in manner to be prescribed by ordinance, not repugnant to the constitution of the United States and of this state; and the town council is hereby authorized and empowered to provide for the sale of personal property for the taxes due thereon, as also for the sale of real estate for the taxes due thereon, in such manner as shall be prescribed by ordinance: *Provided*, that such ordinances are not inconsistent with the constitution of the United States or of this state.

§ 2. The town council shall have power to appoint a clerk, treasurer, assessor, supervisor of streets, pound master, or mowers, and all other officers that may be necessary, and prescribe their duties, and to require of all officers appointed in pursuance of this charter bonds, with good penalties and securities for the faithful performance of their duties as may be deemed expedient; also, to require all officers appointed, as aforesaid, to take an oath for the faithful performance of the duties of their respective offices, before entering upon the discharge of the same.

§ 3. To appropriate money and provide for the payment of the expenses of the town.

§ 4. To make regulations to secure the general health of the inhabitants of said town, and to prevent the introduction of contagious diseases into the town.

§ 5. To provide for the town with water, to sink and keep in repair wells and pumps in the streets, for the convenience of the inhabitants.

§ 6. To open, alter, extend, grade or otherwise improve and keep in repair streets and alleys, and remove obstructions therefrom, and to construct and keep in repair bridges.

§ 7. To license, tax and regulate auctioneers, hawkers, broom-makers, barbers, druggists, peddlers, parol-makers and money-changers, and hackmen.

§ 8. To license, tax, regulate and suppress theatrical and other exhibitions, shows and amusements.

§ 9. To provide for the inspection and weighing of hay, and stove-coal, measuring of charcoal, wood and other fuel, sold in said town.

§ 10. To provide for the extinguishment and prevention of fires, and to organize and regulate fire companies.

§ 11. To regulate the fixing of chimneys and the flues thereof.

§ 12. To regulate the storage of tar, pitch, rosin, gunpowder and other combustible materials.

§ 13. To prevent the running at large of dogs, and to provide for the destruction of the same when running at large contrary to ordinance.

§ 14. To prevent the firing of guns and other coruhns, titles or firearms within the limits of said town.

§ 15. To restrain, regulate or prohibit the running at large of cattle, horses, sheep, swine, goats and other animals, and to authorize the distraining, impounding and sale of the same, and to prohibit any indecent exhibitions of horses and other animals.

§ 16. To prevent horse-racing or any immoderate riding or driving within the limits of said town of horses or other animals; to compel persons to secure their horses standing or remaining in any street or alley or public road in said town.

§ 17. To establish and maintain a public pound or pounds and appoint pound master or masters, and prescribe his or their duties.

§ 18. To define and declare what shall be deemed nuisances; to punish the authors thereof; to authorize and direct the abatement of nuisances and the removal of the same to a distance from the boundaries of said town.

§ 19. To erect market-places; to establish markets and market-places, and provide for the regulation thereof.

§ 20. To provide for inclosing, improving and regulating all public grounds.

§ 21. To borrow money on the credit of the town; *Provided*, that no sum or sums of money shall be borrowed at a greater rate of interest than ten per cent. per annum, nor shall the interest on the aggregate of all sums borrowed and outstanding ever exceed one-half of the town revenue arising from taxes assessed on real property within the limits of said corporation.

§ 22. To regulate the election of town officers, and to provide for removing from office any person holding office created by ordinance.

§ 23. To regulate the police of the town; to impose penalties, fines and forfeitures for the breach of any ordinance; for recovery and appropriation of such fines and

forfeitures, and for the enforcement of such penalties: *Provided*, that the right of trial by jury shall in no case be denied to any person charged with the breach of any of the provisions of this act or any ordinance.

§ 24. To provide for taking enumerations of the inhabi-
tants of the town.

§ 25. To fix the compensation of town officers, to regu-
late the fees of jurors, witnesses and others, for services rendered under this act or by any ordinance.

§ 26. To require railroad companies to construct and keep in repair suitable crossings at the intersections of streets and alleys, where the town council shall deem it necessary; to prohibit and restrain railroad companies from doing storage or warehouse business or collecting pay for storage; to regulate the speed of locomotive engines within the town limits; also, to regulate the running of horse railway cars or street cars, propelled by steam or otherwise; the laying down of tracks for the same, the transportation of passengers therein, and the kind of rail to be used within the town limits.

§ 27. The town council shall have power to make and enforce all regulations necessary and proper for carrying into effect all the powers specified in this act: *Provided*, that such ordinances are not repugnant to nor inconsistent with the constitution of the United States or of this state.

§ 28. The town council shall have power to provide for the punishment of offenders against the ordinances of said town, by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding thirty days for any one offense, in all cases where the offenders shall fail or refuse to pay the fines and forfeitures which may be recovered against them.

§ 29. To provide for the erection and improvement of town buildings and school buildings for the use of said town.

§ 30. To provide for lighting streets and erecting lamps, lanterns, to provide lamps therefor and regulate and control the lighting of the same.

§ 31. To tax, restrain, prohibit and suppress tipping houses, dram shops, gaming houses, bawdy houses and other disorderly and disreputable houses within said town, but not to license any house or place for the sale of intoxicating drinks of any kind as above.

§ 32. To regulate the inspection of butter, lard and other provisions.

§ 33. The style of the ordinances of the town shall be, *Ordinance*, *As passed by the Town Council of the Town of Norwich*.

§ 34. All ordinances passed by the town council shall, within one month after they shall have been passed, be published in some newspaper published in said town, or in some other way, to be provided by ordinance; in case no newspaper is published in the town, and shall not be in force until they shall have been published as aforesaid.

Proof of notices

§ 25. All ordinances of the town may be proved by the seal of the corporation, and, when printed or published in book or pamphlet form, and purporting to be printed or published by the authority of the corporation the same shall be received in evidence in all courts and places without further proof.

ARTICLE VI
OF THE PARISHMENT.

Presiding officer

§ 1. The president shall preside at all meetings of the town council, and shall have the casting vote, and no other; and in case of his non-attendance at any meeting, the council shall appoint one of their number chairman, who shall preside at that meeting.

Duties of.

§ 2. The president shall be active and vigilant in enforcing the laws and ordinances for the government of the town; he shall inspect the conduct of all the subordinate officers of the town, and cause negligence and positive violation to be prosecuted and punished.

Exhibit books-

§ 3. He shall have power, whenever he may deem it necessary, to require of any officer of said town an exhibit of his books and papers; and shall have power to do all other acts required of him by any ordinance made in pursuance of this act.

ARTICLE VII.

OF INCORPORATIONS IN SPECIAL CASES.

Taking private property for public use.

§ 1. Whenever it shall be necessary to take property for opening or altering any public street or alley, the corporation shall make just compensation to the owners of such property, and pay or tender the same before opening such street or alley; and in case the amount of such compensation can not be agreed upon, the police magistrate shall cause the same to be ascertained by a jury of six disinterested freeholders of the town.

Compensation.

§ 2. Whenever all the owners of property on a street or alley proposed to be opened shall petition for the opening of the same, the town council shall provide for the opening or altering the same; but no compensation shall be allowed to such owners for their property so taken.

Benefits, etc

§ 3. All juries empaneled to inquire into the amount of benefit or damages which shall happen to the owners of property proposed to be taken for opening any street or alley, shall first be sworn to that effect, and shall return to the police magistrate their judgment, in writing, signed by each juror. Provided, always, that in the assessment of such damages the jury shall take into consideration the benefit as well as injury happening to the owner of prop-

erty proposed to be taken for opening or altering a street or alley by such opening or altering.

§ 4. The police magistrate shall have power, for good cause shown, within ten days after any request shall have been returned to him, as aforesaid, to set aside the same and cause a new request to be made.

§ 5. The town council shall have power, by ordinance, special cases to levy and collect a special tax on holders of lots on any street or alley, or any part of any street or alley, according to the respective fronts owned by them, for the purpose of grading or paving and otherwise improving such street or alley. Provided, that the tax shall in no case exceed one-half the expense of paving, grading or otherwise improving said street or alley.

§ 6. The town council shall have power to cause all sidewalks owned or occupants of premises to build sidewalks and keep the same in repair in front of said premises, and, when not built according to the orders of the town council, to build and repair the same, and assess the costs thereof against said premises, and collect the same as other town taxes are collected.

ARTICLE VIII

SCHOOLS AND SCHOOL FUNDS.

§ 1. The town of Normal, as hereby incorporated, and School-town, shall constitute a school district, and be known as "Normal School District."

§ 2. The government of said district, for school purposes, shall be vested in a board of five persons, to be styled "The Board of Education of Normal School District."

§ 3. There shall be elected by the qualified voters of said district, at the first election for town officers herein provided for, five persons, who shall constitute said board, and hold their offices for one, two, three, four and five years, respectively, and until their successors shall be elected and qualified. At the first meeting they shall draw lots for their respective terms of office for one, two, three, four and five years. And, thereafter, on the first Monday of March, annually, there shall be an election for the purpose of electing one member of said board, who shall hold his office for five years and until his successor is elected and qualified. All vacancies in said board shall be filled by said annual elections; but any vacancy happening before the term of the regular annual election, by death, resignation or removal from the district, shall be filled by the remaining members of the board; and the person so appointed shall hold the office till the next annual election.

Election of board.

and until his successor shall be chosen and qualified. The meetings for said election of said member or members of said board shall be notified and called, and the poll-book opened and kept, the votes canvassed and the returns made in the same manner as for election of other town officers: *Provided*, that the ballot for a member or for members of the said board of education shall be upon a separate slip of paper, and form no part of a ballot for other town officers. In case of a tie in any election of members of said board, the judges of election shall decide the same, by lot, on the day of election or as soon thereafter as may be.

Name and style.

§ 4. The said board of education shall be a body corporate and politic, by the name and style of "The Board of Education of Normal School District," may have common seal, and change the same at pleasure; and as such may contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in and before any tribunal having competent jurisdiction.

Quarterly sessions.

§ 5. It shall be the duty of the said board to hold quarterly sessions, on the second Monday in March, June, September and December of each year; and they shall meet, by adjournment, at such times as they may think proper; and the president of the board or any two members thereof may call a special meeting of the board by giving a verbal notice of the time and place and object thereof, or by leaving a written notice thereof at the residence of each member of the board. And, at all meetings, a majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Said board shall organize by appointing one of their number president; and they shall also elect a clerk, who may be a member of the board, and treasurer, who shall not be a member of the board, who shall hold their respective offices during the pleasure of the board, and until their successors shall be elected and qualified. The president shall preside at all meetings of the board at which he shall be present; and it shall be the duty of the clerk to be present at said meetings, and to record in a book to be provided for that purpose all the official proceedings of said board; which records shall be public and open to the inspection of any person interested; and all said proceedings, when recorded, shall be signed by the president and clerk, and a copy, certified by the clerk, shall be *prima facie* evidence of such proceedings in all courts and other places. If the president or clerk shall be absent, the board may appoint a president or clerk *pro tem*. The treasurer shall execute to said board an official bond, with good and sufficient securities—such bond to be approved by the board—in such sums as the board shall determine, but to be, as nearly as can be ascertained, no double the amount of all moneys that will be likely to be at any one time in his hands; and said bond for the faithful performance of his duties as treasurer in safely keeping and promptly paying over all

moneys which he shall receive as such treasurer, as he shall from time to time be directed by order of the board or required by law so to do. He shall keep a true and accurate record in proper books for that purpose, of all moneys received and paid out for what purpose and upon what and whose account; but he shall pay out no moneys except upon order of the board; and for all money paid out he shall take and file with the papers of his office proper vouchers, and he shall settle his accounts with the board at least once in each year, and oftener if the board should so require.

§ 6. No member of the board shall receive any compensation for his attendance at the meetings of the board, nor for the performance of his ordinary duties; but for extraordinary services reasonable compensation may be allowed—the board to determine what are extraordinary services and the compensation therefor. The clerk and treasurer shall receive such compensation as the board shall prescribe.

Compensation of board and officers.

§ 7. The treasurer shall, under the direction of the board, demand and receive from the officer or officers having the custody thereof any interest or other moneys from any school fund or other source to which the Normal school district, or any part thereof, or the schools or other teachers therein would be entitled if this act had not been passed; and the moneys so received from such funds or sources shall be placed in the treasury, to be used and expended, under the order and direction of the board, for the support of the schools, and for school purposes, in the same manner as other funds that shall come into the treasury by taxation or otherwise.

Disposition of moneys, &c.

§ 8. The said Normal school district shall be exempt from the jurisdiction of trustees of schools in the township in which said Normal school district is located, so far as common schools are concerned; and the school committee of McLean county shall, in the distribution of the school funds that may come into his hands, appropriation to the school fund as said Normal school district may be entitled to, upon a *pro rata* distribution of said funds among the several townships of said county, to the said Normal school district; and upon the filing of the bond of the treasurer of the said board of education, the said school commissioner shall pay over to the said treasurer the amount due said district. All taxes levied in accordance with the provisions of this act, for school purposes, shall be paid over by the officers collecting the same to the treasurer of the board of education; and said board shall have the entire and exclusive control of all school funds of said Normal school district, or any part thereof, whether consisting of the proceeds of the school lands, or any other property or town-ship fund belonging and to belong to said district, or any

part thereof, or derived from taxation, loans or otherwise— to be used by them as provided by this act; and they may receive, by gift, grant, donation, devise, bequest or legacy, made for the use of any school or schools or library or other school purposes within their jurisdiction; and they shall be and are hereby invested in their corporate capacity, with the title, care and custody of all lots, lands, school houses, school libraries, apparatus and other property belonging or appertaining to the common schools of the said district, or any of them, with full power to control the same, in such manner as they may think will promote the interests of schools or the cause of education, and not inconsistent with the provisions of this act; and when, in their opinion, it may be for the interest of said district to sell any lot or tract of land or building belonging to said district, or any part thereof, said board may sell and convey the same, in the name of the board; and all such conveyances, as well as all other conveyances, contracts and assignments of the board shall be executed by the president of said board; and all conveyances of real and personal estate and assignments of choses in action, which shall be made to said board, shall be made to said board in its corporate name; and said board may purchase and hold such real estate and personal property as may be necessary for the establishment and support of schools, and such real estate so may be purchased under any sale, upon execution or decree, in favor of said board, or in satisfaction of any debts due said board; and as any title thereafter may sell and convey the same.

§ 9. For the purpose of erecting school houses and purchasing school sites, it shall be lawful for said board to borrow, at a rate of interest not exceeding ten per cent. per annum, and issue bonds therefor, in sums not less than one hundred dollars, which bonds shall be executed by the president and clerk of said board, in the name of the board, and countersigned by the treasurer of the board; and to secure the payment of said bonds said board may mortgage any part of the whole property belonging to said board.

§ 10. The said board shall, on or before the first Monday in April in each year report to the town council of the said town of Normal, in writing, respecting all moneys received, how and for what purpose expended, with the proper vouchers therefor, and give such other information in regard to said schools as they may deem important, specifying in said annual report the amount of money necessary to be raised by taxation for school purposes for the ensuing school year; and the said town council shall, annually, upon the coming in of such report or within thirty days thereafter, proceed to levy a tax sufficient to meet such expenses, according to the estimate of said board—and said tax to be levied and collected as other town taxes are levied and collected—upon all the taxable property in

said town: *Provided*, said tax shall not for any one year exceed two per cent of the taxable property of said town, according to its assessed value.

§ 11. The said board of education shall have the entire control, management and control of all the common schools, and transact all business which may be necessary in relation to said common schools in said district, and shall have all the rights, powers and authority necessary for the proper management of the schools and school funds, with the power to make all such rules, orders and requirements as they may deem necessary, to carry their powers and duties into effect and perfect a good system of public instruction and common schools in said district.

§ 12. Said board, at the end of each year of their term of office, shall cause to be prepared and published a statement exhibiting the condition of schools for the preceding year; which statement shall be substantially as follows, viz:

First.—The whole number of scholars which have been taught in said year.

Second.—What number of teachers have been employed in each school, stating the name of each teacher; the time employed, and the compensation paid.

Third.—The whole number of scholars in all the schools, giving the number of males and females in each school, separately, and the average number in attendance during the year.

Fourth.—The amount of all funds received into the treasury of the board during the year, and the sources whence derived, stating the amount received from each source.

Fifth.—The amount paid out for salaries, rent, fuel, furniture, etc.

Sixth.—The amount and kinds of unexpended funds on hand at the end of the year.

Seventh.—A statement of the total amount received and the total amount paid out for school purposes during the year.

§ 13. Said board shall have power and authority to divide said school district into two or more school districts, when, in the opinion of the board, it shall seem advisable.

ARTICLE IX.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

§ 1. The inhabitants of the town of Normal are hereby taxed labor—excepted from working on any road beyond the limits of the town, and from paying any tax to procure laborers to work on the same.

§ 2. The town council shall have the power and it is their duty to make the only, when it may be necessary, for the purpose of keeping in repair the streets and alleys of said

Town, to require every able-bodied male inhabitant of said town, over twenty-two years of age and under fifty, to labor on said streets and alleys not exceeding three days in each year; and any person failing to perform such labor, when duly notified by the supervisors of streets of said town, shall forfeit and pay the sum of one dollar and fifty cents to said town, for each and every day so refused and neglected.

Annual statement. § 8. The town council shall cause to be published, annually a full and complete statement of all moneys received and expended during the preceding year, and of what account received and expended.

Ordinances in force. § 4. All ordinances and resolutions passed by the president and trustees of the town of Normal shall remain in force until the same shall have been repealed by the town council hereby created.

Suits at law. § 5. All suits, actions and prosecutions instituted, commenced or brought by the corporation hereby created shall be instituted, commenced and prosecuted in the name of the town of Normal.

Prosecutions. § 6. All actions, fines, penalties and forfeitures which accrue to the president and trustees of the town of Normal shall be vested in and be prosecuted by the corporation hereby created.

Vested property. § 7. All property, real and personal, belonging to the president and trustees of the town of Normal, for the use of the inhabitants of said town, shall be and is hereby declared to be vested in the corporation hereby created.

Termination of act. § 8. This act shall not invalidate any act done by the president and trustees of the town of Normal, nor divest them of any rights which have accrued to them prior to the passage of this act.

Transmittal of laws. § 9. The president and trustees of the town of Normal shall, as soon as may be after the passage of this act, take measures to promulgate this law within the limits of the town of Normal, and cause their proclamation for the election of officers and cause the same to be published, by written or printed notices, at least ten days before the election of said town officers.

Appeals. § 10. Appeals shall be allowed, in all cases arising under the provisions of this act or of any ordinance passed in pursuance of this act, to the circuit court of McLean county; and every such appeal shall be taken and granted in the same manner and with like effect as appeals are taken from and granted by justices of the peace in the circuit court in similar cases, under the laws of this state: *Provided*, that when the town shall appeal, a bond, filed by the clerk of the council, in the name of the town, shall be deemed sufficient to obtain an appeal.

Violation of act. § 11. Whenever the police magistrate or town constable shall remove from the town, resign or die and the office shall otherwise be vacated, the town council shall immediately

provide for filling of such vacancy by election: *Provided*, that if such vacancy occur within three months of the next regular election of such officers the town council shall fill such vacancy.

§ 12. The town constable or any other officer authorized by law to execute writs or other process issued by the police magistrate shall have power to execute the same anywhere within the limits of McLean county, and shall be entitled to the same fees as other constables in like cases.

§ 13. All fines and penalties, recoverable by indictment or action, for any offenses committed within the limits of said town and which are not required by law to be paid into the county treasury or to the school commissioners of said county, shall hereafter be paid into the town treasury, for the use of said town.

§ 14. Deeds of lands sold for taxes, heretofore made or hereafter to be made under any ordinances of said town, may be executed by the president of the corporation hereby created, and shall be acknowledged as other conveyances, and, when executed and acknowledged as aforesaid, they shall be deemed and taken in all courts and places, as *prima facie* evidence of the existence and regularity of all such prior proceedings, no right otherwise be required to be proved in order to establish the title to the purchase; and such deed shall be evidence, as aforesaid, without any proof of any proceeding prior to the issuing thereof.

§ 15. The town council are hereby expressly and forever prohibited from granting license to any person or persons in said town of Normal to sell, traffic, exchange, barter or give away any strong beer, wine, rum, gin, brandy, whiskey or intoxicating liquors, drinks or beverages of any kind whatever, including Hostetter's Stomach Bitters, Plantation Bitters, Radock's Bitters, Red Jacket Bitters, Swain's Bourbon Bitters, or any other bitters of what ever kind or name, containing intoxicating liquors; and no person shall be permitted to bring into the town of Normal about him, her or their premises, saloon, cellar, dwelling, not house or in any other place, in said town, any of the above named drinks or intoxicating beverages, for the purpose of trafficking therein in any way whatever: *Provided*, the town council may grant license to two discreet persons, and no more, in said town, to sell wine or other spirituous liquors, for medicinal and sacramental purposes, only; and the said council shall have power, at any regular meeting, to revoke said license. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall forfeit and pay into the treasury of the corporation not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offense, to be recovered by action of debt before the police magistrate or other justice of the peace in said town; and in case any offender shall refuse

or fail to pay such fine or fines and costs, as may be adjudged against him, her or them, by said police magistrates or other justices of the peace, then said offender shall forthwith be committed to the county jail for a term of not less than thirty days, unless said fine or fines and costs be sooner paid.

§ 16. This act is hereby declared a public act, and may be read in evidence in all courts of law and equity in this state, without proof.

§ 17. All acts or parts of acts coming within the provisions of this charter or contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions are hereby repealed.

§ 18. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly, That Robinson street, in the town of Dunton, Cook county, be and the same is hereby vacated.
APPROVED MARCH 7, 1867.

In force July 25, 1867. AN ACT to change the name of the town of Jamestown, in Sangamon county, Illinois.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly, That the name of the town of Jamestown, in Sangamon county, Illinois, be and the same is hereby changed to that of "Howlath."

§ 2. This act shall be deemed a public act, and shall be in force from and after its passage.
APPROVED FEBRUARY 25, 1867.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Sparland. In force March 9, 1867.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

ARTICLE I.

SECTION 1. That the inhabitants and residents of the town of Sparland, in the county of Marshall and state of Illinois, be and they are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name and style of "The Town of Sparland;" and, by that name, shall have perpetual succession; and may have and use a common seal, which powers they may change and alter at pleasure; shall have power to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in all courts and places where justice is administered, in all actions whatever; to purchase, receive and hold property, both real and personal, within and beyond the limits of said town, for the benefit of the dead, and for other corporate purposes; to sell, lease and convey property, real and personal, for the use of said town; to protect and dispose of any such property as the public good may require.

§ 2. The boundaries of said town shall include within their limits all of that district of country known and described as follows, viz: Beginning at the north-west corner of the south-east forty (40) of the south-west quarter of section eleven (11); thence south to the south-west corner of the north-east forty (40) of the south-west quarter of section of fourteen (14); thence east to the south-east corner of the north-west forty (40) of south-east quarter of section fourteen (14); thence north to the north-east corner of the south-west forty (40) of the south-east quarter of section eleven (11); thence west to the place of beginning, in township No. twelve (12) north, of range No. nine (9) east of the fourth principal meridian, being one mile long and one-half mile wide.

§ 3. Whenever any tract of land adjoining the town of Sparland shall be laid off into lots and recorded according to law, the same shall be annexed to and form a part of the town of Sparland.

ARTICLE II.

§ 1. ORDINANCE NO. 248

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A TOWN CLERK FOR THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF NORMAL, AND FURTHER PRESCRIBING THE DUTIES AND COMPENSATION AND BOND REQUIRED FOR SAID POSITION.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Normal, McLean County, Illinois, has, by Resolution, pursuant to the statutory authority, declared and provided that the office of Town Clerk for the Town of Normal be an appointive office, rather than an elective one, and has provided for the appointment to said office.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF NORMAL, MCLEAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION ONE: That on or before the first regular meeting of the Town Council in the month of April, the President and Members of the Board of Trustees, voting jointly, shall designate and appoint a Town Clerk for the Town of Normal, to serve for the ensuing fiscal year.

SECTION TWO: That said Clerk shall be the Recording Officer of the municipality and have custody of all documents not specifically assigned to some other officer. That said Clerk shall be the keeper of the official seal of said Town and of the papers and records of said Town. That said Clerk must attend all meetings of the Council or Board and keep the records of the proceedings thereof, and, where required, see to the publication of all ordinances, resolutions and notices requiring same. The Town Clerk shall have general supervision over all officers charged with the receipt, collection or disbursement of revenue, and shall be immediately in charge of the bookkeeper and deputy clerk, and shall be responsible for the acts of each and shall have custody of all documents, books and papers pertaining to the various departments of said Town, including the records of the Water and Sewer Departments in particular, and shall be responsible for the preparation and collection of water and sewer charges. The said Clerk shall furnish to the various departments of the State of

Illinois all records and data so required or directed by statute to be furnished, and shall more particularly be the official Registrar of vital Statistics and must keep the records and make the reports to the State Department of Health that are required by statute in connection with births and deaths. The Clerk of said Town shall keep the Town offices open during such hours as may be directed by the Town Council. That all documents filed with the Clerk may be evidenced by certified copies, and the passage and publication of ordinances and notices may be proved by such Certificate. Said Clerk shall perform all duties prescribed by the Town Council of said Town, or by law or ordinances, and shall give bond in the penal sum of Ten Thousand and No/100 (\$10,000.00) Dollars, which bond shall, however, be paid for from the Town Treasury.

SECTION THREE: The Town Clerk shall receive as compensation an annual salary which shall be determined by Resolution prior to the time of appointment of said Clerk, and if not so determined at that time shall be the amount established in the Appropriation Ordinance of the Town of Normal, said salary to constitute the entire compensation of said Clerk for the performance of all duties imposed upon said Clerk, except for fees received for acting as a Notary Public, which said fees may be retained by said Clerk. Any and all other fees received by the Clerk, whether prescribed by statute or ordinance, for the performance of any act in the capacity of Town Clerk, for the performance of which by said person is made possible by the position of Town Clerk, shall be the property of the Town of Normal, and shall forthwith be paid by said Clerk into the Town Treasury.

SECTION FOUR: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE: Should a Court of competent jurisdiction for any reason hold that the application of some part of this Ordinance is invalid, such holding shall not invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION SIX: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and due publication.

OPINION

I
The initial question that requires resolution is whether in this cause the objector has sufficient standing to present an objection.

Clearly the general rule pertaining to suits by taxpayers against municipalities is that a taxpayer must show some special injury or damage not peculiar to the public at large. Such suits are generally in the form of an injunction to restrain the municipality from certain acts. Volume 10, Illinois Law and Practice - Cities and Villages Section 1631 - 1636.

This proceeding is an entirely different matter. Petitions have been filed requesting a proposition be placed before the voters of the Town of Normal. Under the provisions of Chapter 24, Ill. Rev. Stat. 1967, Section 5-1-5, this Court is required to conduct ". . . a hearing on the sufficiency (of the petitions). . .". (All subsequent statutory citations will be to Chapter 24, Illinois Revised Statutes 1967, the "Illinois Municipal Code", unless indicated otherwise.)

Thus no taxpayer is bringing an action against a municipality, but rather, this proceeding is to give objectors an opportunity to test the validity of this proceeding. While the only notice provided is notice to the Town Clerk and to the Mayor of the Town

the Statute provides no limitation as to who may appear and object. To hold that the right to object is limited to the officials of the Town of Normal is to adopt an unwarranted assumption that they are the only ones so interested. The cases cited by the petitioners do not require a contrary result and are not pertinent to this issue.

The Court holds that the objector as a taxpayer does have standing to appear in these proceedings and present an objection.

II

It is therefore necessary for the Court to construe the language setting forth the Court's function in this cause. All concerned concede that the petitions presented are in proper form and meet all of the requirements of the statute. Thus they are "sufficient" in that limited sense.

Objector contends, however, that the petition must not only be in proper form, but also the Court must determine whether or not an election held can legally accomplish the petitioner's ultimate purpose: the adoption of a valid managerial form of government.

Again, the Court's function under Section 5-1-5 is to determine the "sufficiency" of the petition. The scope of the inquiry is not delineated by statute.

An examination of Words and Phrases, Volume 40 A, pages 111-116, would indicate a common definition of sufficiency to be adequate to accomplish a given purpose. In the Court's opinion the broad definition of sufficiency should be adopted and inquiry properly held in this cause to determine if an affirmative vote on the proposition would accomplish the petitioners' purpose.

Objector contends that the express language of Section 5-1-1 excludes the Town of Normal from the class of municipalities that may adopt the managerial form of municipal government, in that it applies only to cities and villages. Petitioners contend that a reasonable construction of the Acts of the Legislature is that the Town is permitted to adopt this form of government.

The Town of Normal is an incorporated town operating under the provisions of a special charter of the Legislature enacted February 25, 1867.

The operative statutes pertaining to municipalities adopting a managerial form of government are as follows:

Section 5-1-4

"Cities and villages described in Section 5-1-1 in order to vest themselves with the managerial form of municipal government, shall act in accordance with the procedure provided in Sections 5-1-4 through 5-1-11 unless modified elsewhere in this Article 5." (Emphasis supplied.)

Section 5-1-1

"All cities and villages with less than 500,000 inhabitants, which are treated as properly incorporated, . . . , shall have the rights, powers and authority conferred in this Article 5, by proceeding as provided in Section 5-1-4." (Emphasis supplied.)

The recognition of municipalities incorporated under special Acts as being properly incorporated is contained in the second paragraph of Section 1-1-3, in which it is stated that:

"All municipalities incorporated under any special act in effect prior to July 1, 1872, which at the date of the passage of this Code are still functioning under the special act which created them, shall remain as properly incorporated under that special act." (Emphasis supplied.)

The application of the Illinois Municipal Code to special charter or special act municipalities and the rules of construction for interpretation of those special acts and the Code are contained in Section 1-1-4.

"

"This Code shall also apply generally to all municipalities incorporated and now existing under a special charter except to the extent that this Code is in conflict with any provision in a special charter, and except as otherwise provided in subsection (1) of Section 1-1-2. In the event that there is a conflict between a provision in this Code and a provision in a special charter, the special charter shall govern except where a provision in this Code is stated to apply to municipalities incorporated under a special charter, or to municipalities whether incorporated under a general or special act, or words to that effect, or where it is otherwise made manifest that this Code or any other Illinois statute is intended to govern despite the inconsistent provisions in the special charter.

"However, if a particular section of this Code is limited to cities or villages or incorporated towns or any combination thereof, or to cities, villages, or incorporated towns of a specified type or any combination thereof, that intention shall prevail." (Emphasis supplied.)

Article 5 of the Illinois Municipal Code is designated as "The Managerial Form of Municipal Government". This includes Sections 5-1-1 through Section 5-5-6. A reading of this Article would indicate that all of the references to municipalities in Sections 5-1-1 through 5-2-14 refer only to cities, villages, or cities and/or villages.

The first reference to any villages incorporated under special act is in Section 5-2-15, which provides for the filling of vacancies in the office of trustee in villages, ". . . whether incorporated under a general or special act, . . .". Further reference to special act villages is made in Section 5-2-16 and 5-2-17.

It is Section 5-2-17 which contains the sole reference to "incorporated towns" in this article.

To put this in proper perspective it is necessary to examine the context in which the reference arises.

Section 5-2-12 provides in part:

"Except in villages which were governed by Article 4 immediately before the adoption of the managerial form of municipal government, the village board shall be elected at large and shall consist of a president and number of trustees provided for in Sections 5-2-15 or 5-2-17, whichever is applicable."

Section 5-2-15 referred to applies to villages including those under special act which elected trustees in one manner and Section 5-2-17 applies,

"In every village specified in Section 5-2-12 incorporated and existing under any special act which, prior to June 4, 1909, pursuant to any special act, annually elected members of its legislative body, the electors therein, . . .
"However the electors of any such village or incorporated town may adopt a two year term for their trustees. . ."
(Emphasis Supplied.)

These provisions of Section 5-2-17 are essentially identical to the provisions for the election of trustees in incorporated towns existing under special act under non-managerial form of government. (See Section 3-5-4.)

The reference to
inc. town in
5-2-17

It is the opinion of the Court that the reference to incorporated towns existing under special act contained in Section 5-2-17 was not intended to be descriptive of a status prior to reorganization but rather is an operative provision recognizing the status of such a town after it had adopted the Managerial Form of government. A municipality adopting the managerial form does not change its status as a city, village or town. The Court finds no provisions requiring a town to forfeit its charter before availing itself of such a form of government.

The statement in The People vs. Campbell, 285 Ill. 557 at page 560 that, "A city or village having a special charter can adopt the commission form of government only by organizing under the general law" was clearly correct at that time. Laws 1871-72, page 218, Article XIII, Section 1, provided at the time of this decision that only cities and villages incorporated under the general incorporation laws could avail themselves of the Commission form of government. (See Smith-Hurd Illinois Annotated Statutes, Volume 24, Section 4-2-1, Historical notes). Under subsequent amendments, however, this is not true. (See Section 4-2-1 and Section 1-1-3).

The legislature is presumed to act constitutionally and to intend the meaning of its acts. In consideration of Article 5 it is clear that it applies to all cities, villages, and villages incorporated under special act containing less than 50000 inhabitants. The exclusion of towns incorporated under special act would be unconstitutional. The People vs. Campbell, 285 Ill. 557, 561.

That the terms "city" and "village" may include incorporated town, see The People vs. Groves, 258 Ill. 124, 130 and cases cited therein.

Where two equally persuasive constructions may be adopted the Court will adopt the one that upholds the constitutionality of legislation. In this case the weight of persuasion is not balanced but is in favor of a construction that includes incorporated towns under special acts as within the class of municipalities permitted to adopt managerial form of government.

For the reasons stated above the objections filed will be denied and an Order entered directing the Town of Normal to submit the proposition at the general municipal elections to be held March 3, 1970.

5. That the governing body of the Town of Normal should be directed to submit the proposition to the electorate at the general municipal election to be held in the Town of Normal on March 2, 1970.


IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the objection heretofore filed be and the same is hereby ordered overruled and denied.

An Ordinance Creating the Office of Municipal Manager for the Town of Normal and Providing for His Powers and Duties (Ordinance No. 820)

ORDINANCE NO. 820

3/16/70

Creating the Office of Municipal Manager for
the Town of Normal.

(*Effective 3/2/70*)

ORDINANCE NO. 920

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF MUNICIPAL MANAGER FOR THE TOWN OF NORMAL AND PROVIDING FOR HIS POWERS AND DUTIES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF NORMAL, McLEAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS;

SECTION ONE: The office of Municipal Manager is hereby created.

SECTION TWO: The Town Council shall appoint a Municipal Manager, who shall be the administrative head of the Municipal Government of the Town of Normal and who shall be responsible for the efficient administration of all departments. He shall be appointed without regard to his political beliefs and need not be a resident of the Town of Normal when appointed. The Municipal Manager shall be appointed for an indefinite term. In the case of the absence or disability of the Manager, the Town Council may designate a qualified administrative officer of the Town of Normal to perform the duties of the Manager during such absence or disability. A Manager may at any time be removed from office by a majority vote of the members of the Town Council.

SECTION THREE: The powers and duties of the Municipal Manager shall be:

1. To enforce the laws and ordinances within the Town ;
2. To appoint and remove all directors of departments. No appointment shall be made upon any basis other than that of merit and fitness;
3. To exercise control of all departments and divisions thereof created by said Article V of the Revised Cities and Villages Act of Illinois and by any ordinances of the Town and by this ordinance and all amendments thereto;
4. To have all the powers and exercise all the duties granted by statute to municipal clerks and comptrollers with respect to the preparation of the report of estimated funds necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the fiscal year for the consideration of the corporate authorities prior to the preparation of the annual appropriation ordinance.
5. To attend all meetings of the Council with the right to take part in the discussions; but with no right to vote;
6. To recommend to the Council for adoption such measure as he may deem necessary or expedient;

7. To see that all terms and conditions imposed in favor of the Town or its inhabitants and any contract or public utility franchise are faithfully kept and performed;

8. To make in the ordinary course of business all purchases of materials and supplies necessary for the Town as provided for in the annual appropriation ordinance, provided that on purchases of more than \$500.00 he shall first procure the approval of the Town Council before making such purchases, and in all cases he shall comply with the statutory provisions as to solicitation of bids;

9. To have and exercise the power, authority, and duty of any director of a department or division thereof prescribed by this ordinance or any amendment thereof during the time when the office of any such director shall be vacant or no person shall have been appointed thereto.

10. To prepare such regular and special reports as are necessary for the efficient operation of the Town government, including an agenda for each Council meeting whether such meeting be regular or special, and such agenda to be prepared and distributed in advance of said meeting to all necessary parties.

11. To conduct and prepare the necessary studies and/or research to help the Council make its policy decisions.

12. To prepare an annual budget for the presentation and adoption by the Council, and shall further work with the City officials in helping to prepare information for the necessary appropriation and levy ordinances.

13. To assume and do all other duties as specifically delegated and assigned to him by said Council.

14. To prepare and submit to the Town Council, at monthly intervals, reports which will advise said Council of the financial condition and future needs of the Town, and in so doing he may make such other recommendations as he may deem desirable.

15. To recommend to the Council a standard schedule of pay for each appointive office.

16. To recommend to the governing body from time to time adoption of such measures as he may deem necessary or expedient for the health, welfare, or safety of the citizenry or for the future improvement of the administrative services.

17. To prescribe rules and regulations for the conduct of the various departments of the Town and divisions thereunder.

18. To perform such other duties as may be prescribed by said Article V of the Revised Cities and Villages Act of Illinois by this ordinance or any ordinance or resolution of the Town Council.

SECTION FOUR: The Executive and Administrative powers and duties of the Town shall be distributed and exercised through the departments and divisions thereof as provided by the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal of 1969 and as created and ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the Town Council and by reference hereto are made a part hereof as if the same were stated herein.

SECTION FIVE: The powers, duties, and salaries of an appointive officer and employee shall be in accordance with the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal of 1969 and in accordance with ordinances passed and approved by the Town Council and are by reference made a part hereof as if the same were stated herein.

SECTION SIX: Town Attorney

1. There is hereby established the office of Town Attorney which shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Town Council.

2. The Town Attorney shall be responsible for all legal matters pertaining to the Town of Normal.

SECTION SEVEN: Compensation of the Municipal Manager shall be as determined by the Town Council.

SECTION EIGHT: The Municipal Manager shall be subject to the same vacation schedule as in existence for all other Town employees, and he shall be allowed credit for any time that he may have served in any other capacity other than that of Municipal Manager. He shall, likewise, be subject to the same sickness and disability provisions as other Town employees. He shall devote his entire time to the discharge of his official duties.

SECTION NINE: The Municipal Manager shall be paid for the use of his own private vehicle when used exclusively for Town business at the per mile rate established by the Town Council for compensated travel by other Town officials

and/or employees, and he shall keep accurate records of same which shall be subject to Council approval prior to payment.

SECTION TEN: At the close of each fiscal year the Town Council shall cause an independent audit of all accounts of the Town to be made by an accountant or accountants authorized to practice accounting under the laws of the State of Illinois.


SECTION ELEVEN: The Manager shall furnish a surety bond in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or such additional sum as may be established by the Town Council, which bond shall be approved by said Council. Said bond to be conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties as such Municipal Manager, and the premium on the bond shall be paid by the Town;

SECTION TWELVE: This ordinance supersedes and repeals all ordinances, parts of ordinances, or resolutions in conflict or inconsistent therewith, and all such ordinances, parts of ordinances or resolutions of the Town of Normal in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed;


SECTION THIRTEEN: If any section, clause, sentence, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance is held invalid by any court, the remaining provisions thereof shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect in like manner as though said remaining portions have been passed without such invalid section, clause, sentence, paragraph, part, or provision;

SECTION FOURTEEN: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and due publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 1001

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2.3-38 AND SECTION 2.3-39 OF CHAPTER 2, "OFFICERS", OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF NORMAL, 1969.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF NORMAL, McLEAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION ONE. That Section 2.3-38 of Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal, 1969 be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

SEC. 2.3-38 TOWN CLERK - OFFICE. The office of Town Clerk, heretofore established by Ordinance as an appointive office, is hereby retained. The Clerk shall be appointed by the City Manager, and receive such compensation as may be provided by Ordinance.

SECTION TWO. That Section 2.3-39 of Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code of the Town of Normal, 1969 be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

SEC. 2.3-39 TOWN CLERK - DUTIES. The Town Clerk shall be the recording officer of the municipality and have custody of all documents not specifically assigned to some other officer. Said Clerk shall be the keeper of the official seal of said Town and of the papers and records of said Town. The Clerk must attend all meetings of the Town Council, or Board, and keep the records of the proceedings thereof, and where required, see to the publication of all ordinances, resolutions and notices requiring same. The Town Clerk shall be immediately in charge of the deputy clerk and shall be responsible for his acts, and shall have custody of all documents, books and papers pertaining to the various departments of said Town, including the records of the Water and Sewer Departments, in particular. The Clerk shall furnish to the various departments of the State of Illinois all records and data so required or directed by Statute to be furnished and shall more particularly be the official registrar of vital statistics and must keep the records and make the reports to the State Department of Health that are required by Statute in connection with births and deaths. The Clerk of said Town shall keep the Town offices open during such hours as may be directed by the Town Council. All documents filed with the Clerk may be evidenced by certified copies and the passage and publication of ordinances and notices may be proved by such certificate. Said Clerk shall perform all duties prescribed by the Town Council of said Town or by law or ordinance, under the supervision of the City Manager. He shall not, however, be responsible for preparation of a report of estimated funds necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the fiscal year for the consideration of the Board of Trustees prior to the preparation of the Annual Budget or Appropriation Ordinance.

SECTION THREE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
