On 08/05/2026, at 1518 hours, Officer Doran and I, Officer Young were dispatched to assist in a vehicle accident /rollover on West Raab Rd. Officer Doran and I responded lights and sirens due to there being power lines down on the road way and it being a danger to vehicles driving in the immediate area.

It should be noted; I am equipped with a Body Worn Camera (BWC) which I have reviewed portions of. For clarity and brevity, I have paraphrased and summarized the following incident. The items discussed may or may not be written in the order they appear on my BWC. The words I have chosen for this report may not be the exact words used by the parties involved.

Upon arrival, I observed multiple power lines down on the road. A blue vehicle was trapped in the roadway under the power lines and a black Subaru bearing the Illinois registration [REDACTED] 5 ILCS on it's side next to the electrical pole. For further details regarding the scene of the crash, please refer to Officer Castillo's report. I assisted in blocking off the intersection of N Parkside Rd and W Raab Rd. Officer Fields took our spot in order for us to assist in interviewing driver.

The driver of the vehicle, AWJELIQUE CALLAHAN (DOB: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c):) was transported by Normal Emergency Services to Carle Bromenn hospital for treatment. Officer Doran and I met with Awjelique at Carle Bromenn hospital.

I spoke with Awjelique while she was laying down at Carle Bromenn Hospital in room 12. Awjelique was in a neck brace. I observed Awjelique eye's were glassy. I introduced myself as Officer Young with the Normal Police department and asked what her name was. She stated her name, as AWJELIQUE CALLAHAN (DOB: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS) and I asked Awjelique if she could tell me what had happened. Awjelique stated that she was heading to work, which is at Rivian. She stated that [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): Third party (DOB: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c):), [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): was also in the vehicle during the crash. She stated they were running late to work. They were supposed to be at work at 3:30 pm. I asked Awjelique to summarize what she had seen, heard, and or observed. Awjelique stated that everything was fine and then before she knew it she had crashed. She stated that they had been drinking a "little bit". Awjelique and [REDACTED] 5 ILCS were celebrating their anniversary and that she had just got her daughter back. I asked her if she had been drinking at home to which she stated, "Yes". I asked Awjelique how many drinks she had, to which she stated, "4 shots". I reiterated that she had said, "4 shots", to which she stated "Yes". I asked Awjelique how long ago she had taken the shots. She stated she did not know due to her making meals that she and [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): were going to sell to people at work. I asked Awjelique if she knew how fast she was going. She stated that she does not know how fast she was going, but stated, "I was moving because I was trying to get to work". I asked Awjelique besides the 4 shots, if she had anything else to drink. She stated that she had smoked a "black," but denied smoking cannabis.

I advised Awjelique that I was going to conduct Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFST's). It should be noted that during the administration of this test, I could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from Awjelique person.

Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN)

- Awjelique displayed equal tracking and equal pupil size in both eyes and did not have resting nystagmus.
- Awjelique displayed lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes.

- Awjelique displayed distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes.
- Awjelique displayed onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes.

Due to Awjelique injuries and her being in a neck brace, I was not able to conduct the Walk and Turn (WAT) and the One Leg Stand (OLS). It was confirmed with Awjelique due to her injuries, she was not able to complete these tests.

I determined there to be probable cause for her arrest for DUI due to Awjelique's driving behavior, her own admissions, the clues from HGN, and my observation of signs of impairment. I read the Warning to Motorist to Awjelique at 1636 hours, which she signed accordingly.

At approximately 1656 hours, Carle Bromenn ER Tech KINSEY DURFLINGER (DOB: 5 ILCS 7(1)(c)), drew blood for a DUI blood kit, which I observed was sealed prior to opening for testing. I took custody of this DUI blood kit which I retained until later securing into evidence.

Awjelique was issued the following UTT's all with mandatory court date of 08/25/2026:

Driving under the influence- UTT #314128
 Improper Lane Usage (West Raab Rd & Trumbull Avenue)- UTT #066406
 Reckless Driving- UTT #066407
 Speeding 35+ MPH Above Limit- UTT #066408

I read Awjelique her Miranda rights from my department issued Miranda warning card. Awjelique advised she understood her rights but was not willing to speak to me. I completed the alcohol influence report accordingly. I provided Awjelique with her UTT's, driver information exchange, her copy of the Warning to Motorist that was signed, and the Tow hearing paperwork.

My BWC, squad footage, were uploaded into evidence.com under this case number and properly classified. The alcohol influence report, UTT's, Legal draw blood kit form, and Warning to Motorist are attached to this report.

The Sworn report will be attached at a later date, once the results are received from the crime lab.

I request this case be cleared with an adult arrest. At this time I am awaiting the toxicology results from the crime lab.

On 08/05/2026 at approximately 1518 hours, Officer Hunter #124 and I, Officer Armstrong #866, responded to the area of W. Raab Rd and Trumbull Ave for a single vehicle roll-over accident. 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): Third party name(s) and identifiers

It should be noted; I am equipped with an Axon 4 Body Worn Camera (BWC). For clarity and brevity, I have paraphrased and summarized the following incident. The items discussed may or may not be written in the order they appear on my BWC. The words I have chosen for this report may not be the exact words used by the parties involved. Currently, I have not watched my BWC.

Upon arrival, I observed two power poles that had been snapped in half because of the crash, with power lines down and covering the street. I also observed a blue sedan that was trapped underneath the active power lines with a passenger stuck in the driver's seat. The suspect vehicle that caused the crash, a black Subaru Crosstrek, rolled over and was laying on the passenger side completely mangled.

Prior to our arrival, NFD arrived on scene and was treating both occupants of the suspect vehicle. The male passenger, later identified as 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): Third party (M/ 5 DOB: 5 ILCS 7(1)(c):), was walking on his own accord but limping and the female driver, later identified as AWJELIQUE CALLAHAN (F/ 5 DOB: 5 ILCS 7(1)(c):), was walking upright with assistance from paramedics. I spoke with 5 ILCS who stated the following in summary:

On Wednesday, 08/05/2026 at approximately 1518 hours I was on routine patrol. I was wearing full NPD uniform and driving marked patrol vehicle NL 74. I responded to the area of Raab Road and Parkside Road for a vehicle crash. [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and 5 ILCS 7(1)(d)(iv): Statements provided by third parties

During this call, I was equipped with a Body-Worn camera (BWC). I advised the parties involved of my activated BWC. Prior to completing this report, I have reviewed portions of my BWC video. The following is a summary of this incident. This summary is paraphrased and may or may not represent the actual words used. The order of the items discussed may vary from that of the actual conversations occurring during this incident.

Upon arrival, I blocked Westbound Raab Road at Community College Drive. I walked down Raab and observed two power line poles laying across Raab Road. There was a blue sedan underneath the lines with a person still inside. The Normal Fire Department had already arrived and were taking the passenger, later identified as [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): [REDACTED] 5 ILCS, away from the suspect vehicle. The suspect vehicle was lying on its side near the second powerline pole. As I approached the scene, I was stopped by [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): Third party [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and 5 ILCS 7(1)(d)(iv): Statements provided by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and 5 [REDACTED]. I was then stopped by Officer Krueger who was off duty at the time and witnessed the crash. He advised me he was heading Eastbound on Raab Road near Raab and Trumbull Ave. He observed the suspect vehicle traveling Westbound past him at approximately 75MPH, he later advised me he would not be surprised if it was traveling faster than this. He passed the car and observed in his mirror the car crash. He stopped and checked on the occupants before speaking with me.

I approached the area where the Normal Fire Department took [REDACTED] 5 ILCS. I was advised by a Normal Firefighter that the power lines were most likely still active and to watch out for them. After advising on-lookers of the danger, I went back to where [REDACTED] 5 ILCS was telling Officer Hunter what happened. See Officer Hunter's report for [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): statement. After [REDACTED] 5 ILCS gave his statement, I asked what [REDACTED] 5 ILCS thought if I had told him that Sgt. Krueger and other witnesses had seen their vehicle traveling around 70MPH done Raab and driving recklessly. [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and 5 ILCS 7(1)(d)(iv): Statements

I later went to speak with the driver, AWJELIQUE CALLAHAN, but she was soon being transported to Carle BroMenn. I overheard a paramedic say that Awjelique admitted having drank alcohol before driving. Hearing this I advised Officer Young of it, and he later went to Carle BroMenn to speak with Awjelique. See Officer Young's report for more information on this.

I later went to Heartland Community College as I was told they had footage of the crash. The video showed the following:

The camera angle showed the intersection of Raab Road and Trumbull Ave. Other cars could be seen driving on the road. They all appeared to be driving the speed limit as they were not moving very fast on the camera. The video then showed the suspect vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed. It appeared it was traveling twice as fast if not more than other cars on the road. The suspect vehicle then hit the right-hand curb where the road starts to curve and appeared to turn sideways as it continued Westbound on the grass. There was a big explosion when the vehicle struck the power line pole, but the vehicle is out of frame by this time due to a tree being in the way.

I took a video of the footage with my patrol phone and uploaded it to Evidence.com. I was advised they could get the

actual footage to the police tomorrow.

After reviewing the CCTV footage, I called [REDACTED] 5 ILCS back to get her statement. She stated the following in summary:

I later reviewed the dash camera footage. It showed the suspect vehicle heading South on School Street and turning Westbound on Raab Rd. The suspect vehicle appeared to be traveling at a high rate of speed through the turn. The suspect vehicle also made an improper right-hand turn as it did not turn into the right hand most lane. The suspect vehicle then continued Westbound on Raab Road at a high rate of speed. Georgia caught up with the vehicle at Raab Rd and Main Street. Both vehicles were in the left-hand straight lane. Once the light turns green the suspect vehicle again takes off at a high rate of speed. The suspect vehicle then merged to the right-hand lane without using its turn signal. The suspect vehicle can then be seen weaving between traffic still heading at a high rate of speed. It should be noted [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and 5 ILCS 7(1)(d)(iv): Statements provided by third parties. By the time [REDACTED] 5 ILCS was passing The Corn Crib the suspect vehicle was almost at Millennium Blvd. The video then loses sight of the suspect vehicle. The video then showed [REDACTED] 5 ILCS driving up to the crash.

After a short while of directing traffic, the Normal Street Department closed the road with signs.

My BWC and in-car video were uploaded to Evidence.com.

This concludes my involvement in the case.

On 08/05/2026 around 15:29 hours, I, Officer Castillo, attached myself to an assist other agency report at the intersection of Raab Rd. and Parkside Rd. [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and 5 ILCS 7(1)(d)(iv): Statements provided by third parties [REDACTED]. The power lines were reported to be down across the roadway and arcing. With this information, I elected to drive to the scene with my lights and sirens activated.

It should be noted that I was equipped with a Body Worn Camera (BWC) which I have not reviewed. For clarity and brevity, I have paraphrased and summarized the following incident. The items discussed may or may not be written in the order they appear on my BWC. The words I have chosen for this report may not be the exact words used by the involved parties.

Upon arrival, I placed my patrol vehicle #87 at the intersection of Raab Rd. and Parkside Rd. for traffic control purposes. There were several vehicles stationary on Raab Rd. attempting to drive east. Of the three vehicles I made contact with, only one witnessed the accident. The others were redirected west to the intersection of Raab Rd. and Parkside Rd. I spoke with the first witness, [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): (DOB: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c):). It was later determined the vehicle that struck two utility poles were occupied by the driver, Awjelique C. Callahan (DOB: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c):), and the passenger, [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): Third party (DOB: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c):). Officers Armstrong, Officer Hunter and Officer Hines made contact with Awjelique and [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED]. Awjelique and [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] occupied a black 2024 Subaru Crosstrek bearing an Illinois license plate: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and 5 ILCS 7(1)(d)(iv): Statements provided by third parties [REDACTED]

At the time, officers could not solely determine if Awjelique or [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] was the driver during the accident. This is why I inquired about driver or occupant information from [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED]

After obtaining [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] statement and contact information, I directed him back west to the intersection of Raab Rd. and Parkside Rd. I approached the accident on foot and observed two utility poles broken from their base and laying across Raab Rd. with their wires still attached. There was a blue Kia Forte bearing an Illinois license plate: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] with a female driver inside. The vehicle appeared to be struck by one of the utility poles and had active wires across the vehicle. The driver appeared to be conscious and breathing from a distance. The driver and registered owner was later determined to be [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c): Third (DOB: [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c):). From the south side curb of Raab Rd., I was able to gain the attention of [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] and confirm she had no injuries. I instructed [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] to remain in her vehicle due to the live wires that were in direct contact with her vehicle. [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] understood.

I surveyed the area for other witnesses, but none could be located. I then obtained a telephone number for [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] and made contact with her again. I gathered a brief statement about the accident so that I could relay it to officers if needed until [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] was safely allowed to exit her vehicle. After a period of time, linemen with Cornbelt Energy arrived on scene and did their proper protocols and procedures to make the accident scene safe. [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] was safely escorted from her vehicle and refused any medical assistance. Later, [REDACTED] 5 ILCS [REDACTED] explained [REDACTED] 5 ILCS 7(1)(c) and 5 ILCS 7(1)(d)(iv): [REDACTED]
